Christina Spark Luis Cruz Solache, and Pam Brown informed Gaylon that they could not attend due to conflict in schedule.

I. Welcome/Introductions Gaylon Johnson

Gaylon welcomes participants and asks for patience regarding starting the meeting a few minutes late to allow additional members to log in. Gaylon begins meeting at 3:35 pm and mentions that all know everyone here so no need for introductions.

II. Meeting Norms/Agenda Review Gaylon Johnson

Gaylon presents the agenda with the committee and goes over meeting norms. He says that today's meeting will focus on the district's TUPE program.

III. Program Updates All

Nutrition Services – Teri Hofstetter informs the committee that Nutirton Servies is providing support at sites for certain dietary requests the district cannot accommodate as regular practice. Same support they provided last year they are providing again.

Prevention Programs – Primarily working on the TUPE or TYPE grant application and will explain more later during the TUPE program review. SUPE facilitated multiple staff curriculum training for HealthSmart and Teen Intervene. Bullying Prevention has supported sites providing all-day classroom presentations regarding what bullying is and how to respond to it. More school site support at Cameron Ranch and Sierra Oaks coming up in February and March.

IV. TYPE (TUPE) Program Review

Gaylon Johnson

Gaylon presents TUPE review presentation to committee. Presentation begins w/history and overview of how TUPE started in California. Next, Gaylon presents how much **funding San Juan** received over the past 3 grant cycles with this year being the fourth, showing the difference in amounts. Funding decreased by 60% due to vaping rates down and lack of funds. Gaylon then presents what the funding was used for from 2017 to present and what funding will support during the next grant cycle from 2026 to 2029 with a 60% decrease. Gaylon explains some of the programs in detail such as Teen Intervene, Marijuana Brief Intervention (MBI), and Friday Night Live. Cessation will no longer be supported through in-person group sessions, but through online referrals to Kick It CA. Health Disparity groups that will be targeted for prevention and intervention are LGBTQ, African American, American Indian/Alaskan Native, and Non-traditional students who attend non-traditional schools such as La Entrada. Partnerships with We Breathe will help support our LGBTQ+ prevention education, SOL Project will support our African American prevention education, and the Sacramento Native American Health Center (SNAHC) will support our Native American prevention education. CHKS data shows why these groups will be targeted in San Juan. LGBTQ and Non-traditional students show the highest use with vaping and Marijuana, and 7th grade African American students showed the high rate of 13% use compared to the average 5% rate among all other demographics.
