Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for Springview Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, failed to exit the CSI status in 2024-25, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

At Springview Elementary we continue to focus on addressing the needs of our students and implementing intervention plans to close the gap between our highest achieving students and our bottom 30%, as well as our subgroups. We have identified goals and strategies to address the academic needs of our students. While we are proud of our accomplishments, at Springview Elementary we have a focus on continuous improvement.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Students who live within the designated school boundaries are able to attend Springview Elementary. Parents may complete forms for In-District Schools of Choice if they reside within the Flushing Community Schools boundaries, but outside Springview boundaries. Additionally, families who are not residents of the Flushing School District may apply for *Out of District Schools*

2. Our school is following the district MICIP plan. We have goals written to provide a well-rounded education to prepare students for College/Career readiness as measured by showing at least 10% improvement on state assessments and a five-point gain in every building's Tiered Fidelity Index (TFI) score to support MTSS. Our students are making good progress towards meeting or exceeding this goal. To view a copy of the MICIP plan, please submit a request to our main office. In addition, our school/district is reporting benchmark progress twice a year. This plan is available on our website under Transparency Reporting.
3. Springview Elementary is a first through sixth grade Title 1 school with 455 students. The school contains the emotionally impaired program for the district as well as the STEM program for third through sixth grade students.
4. Curriculum is developed and implemented based on the Michigan State Standards with careful input from our teaching staff. For a copy of the core curriculum, please contact Mrs. Stacey Mesarosh, Principal, for assistance.
5. Based on Spring 2025 MSTEP scores, the majority of Springview students were partially proficient or above in all subject areas. Social Studies and Science are only assessed in grade 5 and these scores also showed that the majority of students were partially proficient or above in these areas as well.
6. Springview Elementary takes great pride in communicating with parents and guardians. Parent-Teacher Conferences are conducted in the fall and spring of each school year. For the 2023-2024 school year, based on an enrollment of 454 students, 90% of parents/guardians attended conferences in the fall. For the 2024-2025 school year, based on an enrollment of 471 students, 87% of parents/guardians attended conferences in the fall.

In closing, thank you for your continued support in your child's education and for working together with our Springview staff to provide an outstanding learning experience. In working together, we are making a positive difference in the lives of our students. We will continue striving for excellence and working hard to provide an outstanding learning environment.
