SUBJECT: OCTOBER BENCHMARK ENROLLMENT REPORT SY2025-26 (FY2026)

ENROLLMENT SUMMARY

The October benchmark student count was conducted on Friday, October 10, 2025. Total pre-kindergarten through 12th grade enrollment for traditional District operated schools was 162,149 students, a decrease of 6,147 students from last year's October benchmark enrollment count. Total kindergarten through 12th grade enrollment was 158,627 students, a decrease of 6,008 students as compared to last school year. The elementary school level experienced the largest annual decrease in enrollment, with 2,902 less students as compared to last school year. Sixth through eighth grade enrollment at the seven K-8 schools increased by about three percent over last year, bringing their total middle school enrollment to 1,417 students. For all District schools, total pre-kindergarten through 12th grade enrollment was 184,979 students, a decrease of 6,591 students from the October 2024 benchmark enrollment count. Total kindergarten through 12th grade enrollment was 181,120 students. The School District of Palm Beach County believes the decline in enrollment is part of a regional trend affecting all large urban school districts in Florida. We attribute this trend to factors such as wider demographic shifts in our region, the expansion of Family Empowerment Scholarships, and the rising cost of living in Palm Beach County. Historical Enrollment Trends for Traditional District-Operated Schools

For traditional District-operated schools, K-12 enrollment decreased by 6,008 students for FY2026 as compared to FY2025. Enrollment is down 11,364 students compared to the largest enrollment level which occurred in FY2020, the year prior to the pandemic-era decline experienced in FY2021. Table 2 displays the change in K-12 enrollment for traditional District-operated for the last 20 school years.

Charter Schools

K-12 charter school enrollment comprises approximately 12% of total District enrollment. Charter school enrollment decreased by 386 K-12 students since last school year, or a 1.8% decrease as compared to FY2025. This marks the third consecutive year in which charter school enrollment experienced a decline. From FY2025 to FY2026, charter school enrollment decreased at all levels. For this school year, two new charter schools opened, one temporarily closed charter school reopened, and two charter schools closed permanently. Table 3 tabulates total charter school enrollment by level – elementary, middle and high.

Actual Versus Projected Enrollment

In traditional District-operated schools, actual K-12 enrollment was 5,575 students or 3.4% lower than projected. For all schools, enrollment was 6,110 students or about 3.3% lower than projected. K-12 enrollment in charter schools was 507 students or about 2.3% lower than projected. Actual virtual school enrollment was 223 students, which was 13 students lower than projected.

Due to the timeline of charter schools finding a location and building, the District does not know specifically, in some instances, which District schools will lose students to new charters until just prior to the opening of school. Charter schools are not required to provide District staff with a location as late as a month before opening. In addition, some charter schools that are scheduled to open may fail to do so. Table 4 summarizes actual versus projected enrollment, by category.
