



Dear Wildcat Families,

The Sulphur Springs ISD Board of Trustees approved the new elementary attendance boundary zones for the 2026-2027 school year. With the new elementary schools opening in the fall of 2026, along with the Kindergarten–Fifth grade reconfiguration, rezoning of elementary attendance boundaries was necessary.

Considerations

In designating the new attendance boundaries, SSISD worked with district demographers to utilize a long-term planning strategy which accounts for balanced campuses and future growth. Considerations were given to the location of the campuses, ensuring that attendance zones are contiguous, efficient routing of bus transportation services, major roads, and railroad tracks. Additionally, we prioritized balancing the number of students at each campus.

Dual Language

The Dual Language program currently housed at Travis Primary will relocate to the new Sulphur Springs Elementary School. Under the new K-5 configuration, instead of being split between two campuses, the entire Dual Language program will be located on a single campus. There are currently approximately 350 students in the Dual Language Program. There will be traditional classrooms for each grade level on the campus, as well.

You will notice on the boundary map that the attendance boundary zone for Sulphur Springs Elementary School is a smaller area than the other two zones. There are several reasons for this. First, this area of town is much more densely populated than other areas. Second, students in the Dual Language program come from all over the district. Therefore, leaving less space for traditional classrooms on this campus.

Please know that much time, thought, and research has gone into designing new attendance boundary zones that best serve our students and families. Attached are images of the new boundaries, including a close-up view where the boundaries intersect. As always, please feel free to reach out if you have any questions.

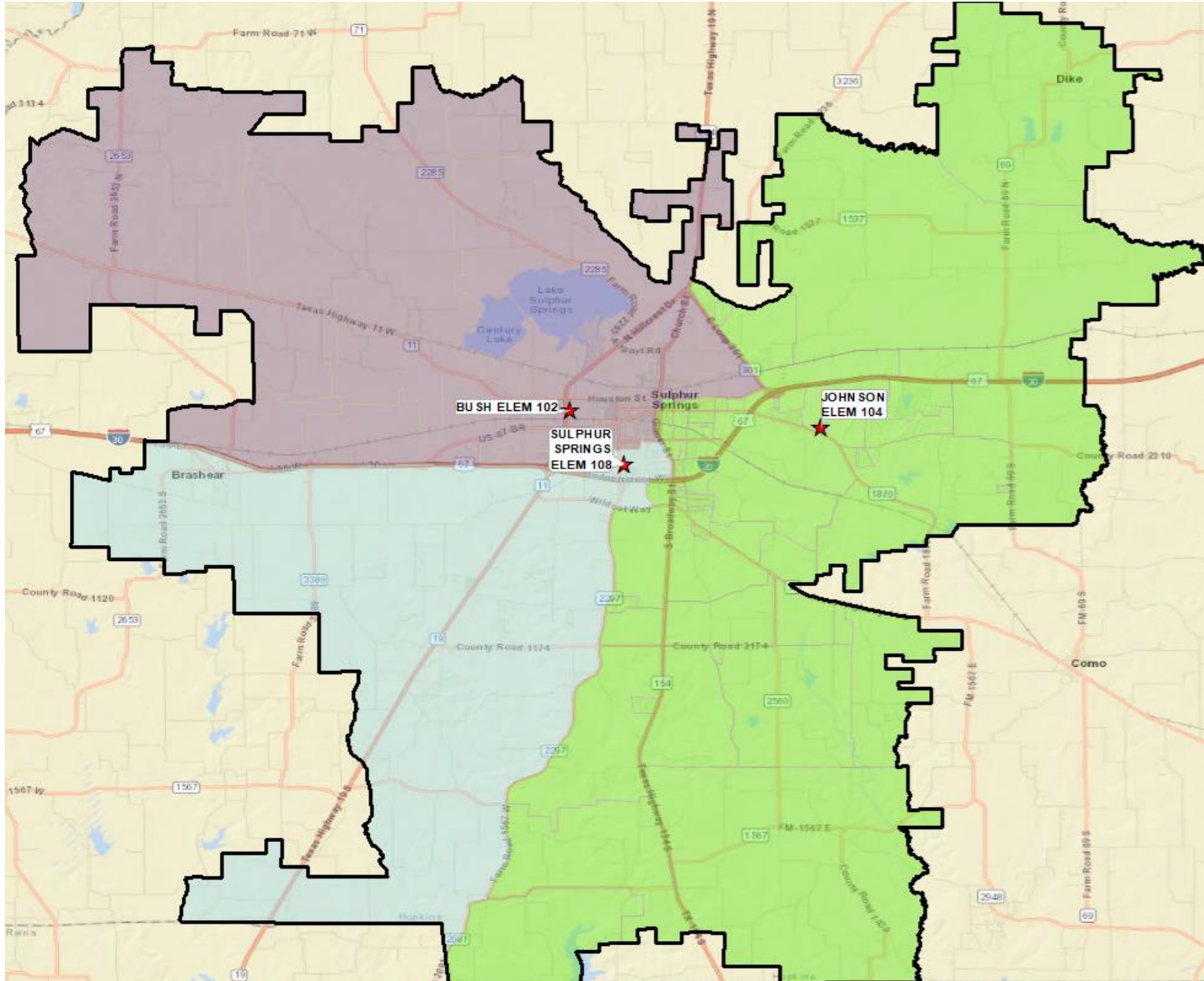
