Career Pathways in Education

Classroom & Instructional Roles

- **Preschool Teacher:** Educates children under age 5.
- **Elementary/Middle/High School Teacher:** Core classroom instruction.
- **Special Education Teacher:** Supports students with disabilities.
- **Subject-Specific Teacher:** Focuses on math, science, or literature.
- **Career and Technical Education (CTE) Teacher:** Teaches vocational skills.
- **English as a Second Language (ESL) Teacher:** Instructs non-native speakers.
- **University Lecturer/Professor:** Instructs in higher education.

Administrative & Leadership Roles

- **Principal/Assistant Principal:** Manages daily school operations.
- **School Superintendent:** Leads a school district.
- **Academic Dean/Provost:** Manages academic departments at colleges.
- **Registrar:** Manages student records.
- **School Business Manager:** Oversees school finances.

Support, Counseling & Specialized Roles

- **School Counselor/Advisor:** Provides academic and social support.
- **Teaching Assistant/Paraprofessional:** Supports classroom teachers.
- **Educational Consultant:** Advises on curriculum and improvements.
- **Curriculum Developer/Instructional Designer:** Designs learning materials.
- **Librarian/Media Specialist:** Manages school library resources.
- **School Psychologist/Social Worker:** Addresses mental health and behavioral needs.

Introduction to Educational Professions

Grade 10 - Introduction to Educational professions and foundational concepts.



Honors Development of the Learner

Grade 11 - Develop a practical understanding of psychological principles, theories, and models that explain how children grow, learn, and change from early childhood through adolescence.



Honors Historical Trends in American Education:

Grade 11 - Explore how schools have evolved and how educators shape the learning experience. Students will trace the major historical trends that have influenced American education, from early colonial schools and the common school movement to modern-day classrooms.



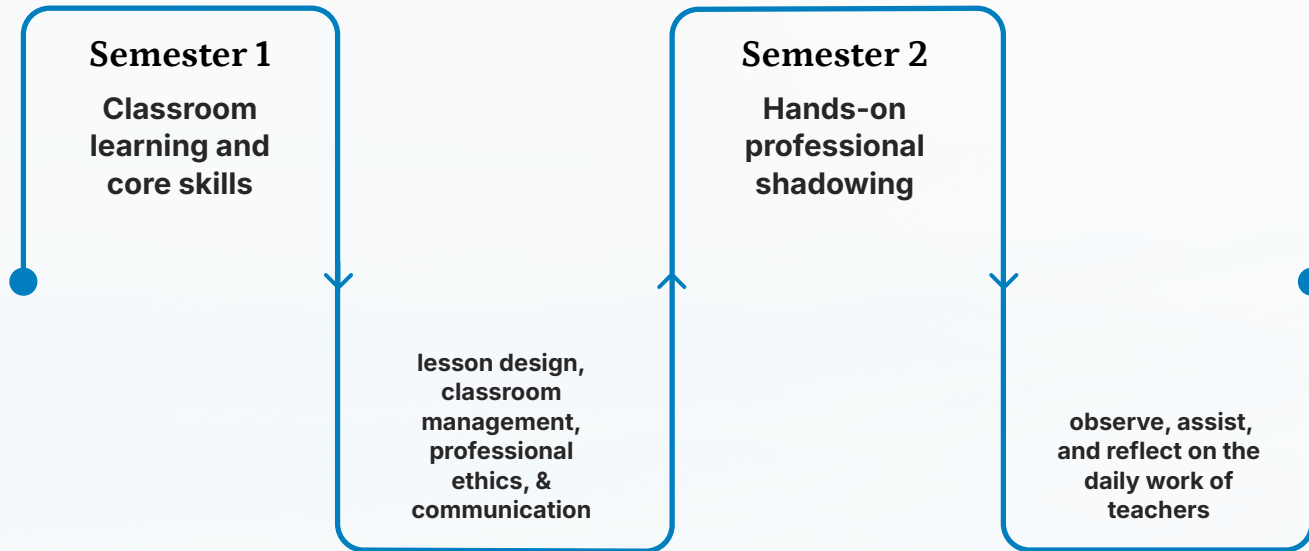
Honors Tomorrow's Teacher

Grade 12 - Semester 1: Lesson design, classroom management, professional ethics, and communication skills.

Semester 2: Shadowing educators in local schools and within their own district.

During this mini student teaching experience, students will observe, assist, and reflect on the daily work of teachers, gaining insight into the challenges and rewards of the profession.

Honors Tomorrow's Teacher: Senior Year Experience



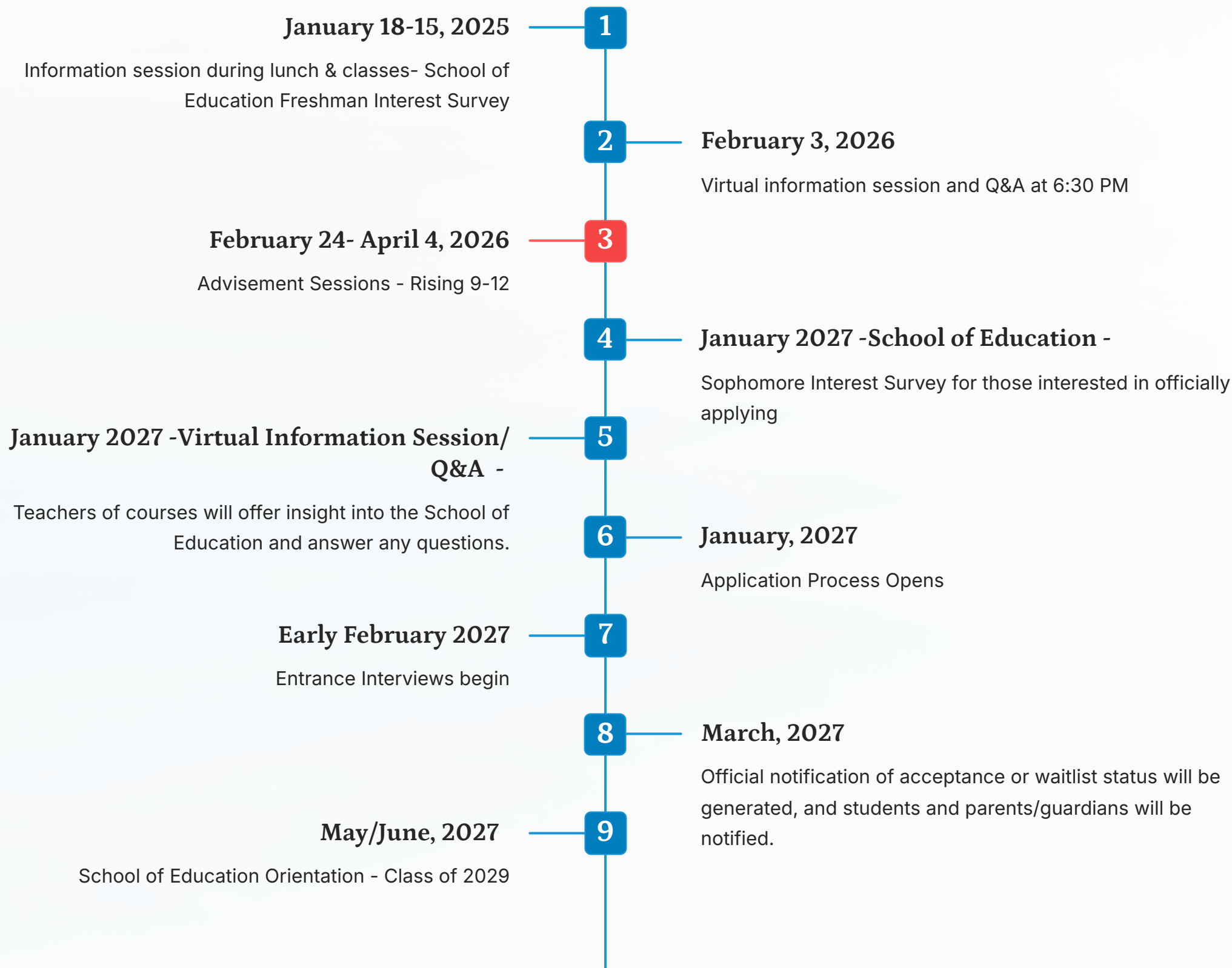
The senior year experience combines classroom learning with real-world application through professional shadowing.

What Students Gain

- **Local Shadowing:** minimum 50 hours
- **College Credits:** Dual enrollment opportunities - Earn College Credits!
- **Professional Skills:** Professionalism, adaptability, and reflection, helping students envision their own future in education
- **A love for the profession!**

Note: Students must provide their own transportation to shadowing sites when applicable and maintain good academic standing, including behavior and attendance.
