



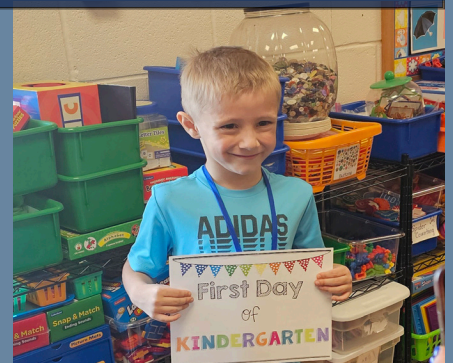

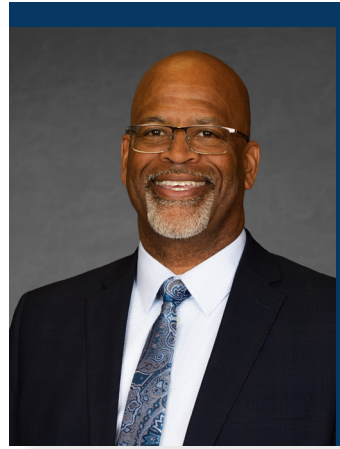
On behalf of the members of the VVSD Board of Education, I want to thank our community for all the support they provide in delivering the resources that provide the foundation for student success in our classrooms.

Both Valley View School District 365U high schools, Bolingbrook HS and Romeoville HS, are among the high schools across the United States identified in the 2025 U.S. News & World Report Annual Rankings of America's Best High Schools.

Bolingbrook HS ranks 92nd in the state of Illinois and Romeoville HS ranks 127th. Those rankings place both schools among the top 18% of the 679 public high schools in Illinois ranked by US News. Both schools are ranked in the Top 20% among Illinois High Schools for the fifth year in a row.



The Seal of Biliteracy is a national movement to recognize students for proficiency in English and in another language. To earn the Illinois Seal of Biliteracy, a student must demonstrate proficiency in English by scoring the state benchmark of a minimum of 480 on the evidence-based reading and writing portion of the SAT or equivalent for English language learners.

In addition, students must also demonstrate proficiency in another language in the areas reading, writing, speaking and listening. 232 VVSD students earned the Seal of Biliteracy in 2025.



For the first time in district history, three schools Jane Addams Middle School, Kenneth L. Hermansen Elementary School, and Bernard J. Ward Elementary School, each earned an Exemplary summative designation, a measure of progress in academic performance and student success.

This is the highest designation a school can receive on the Illinois School Report Card.
