

Special Dietary Needs

Per USDA regulations, School Food Authorities (SFAs) must ensure children with disabilities have an equal opportunity to participate in and benefit from the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program. SFAs must make reasonable substitutions or modifications to accommodate children with disabilities when supported by a written medical statement from a state-licensed healthcare professional (licensed physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or registered dietician). The medical statement must include a description of the child's physical or mental impairment, an explanation of what must be done to accommodate the child's disability, and the food(s) to be omitted and recommend alternatives (if applicable).

If your child requires meal substitutions or modifications, please submit a completed medical statement to the SNP Central Office at schoolnutritioninfo@walton.k12.ga.us. We will get in contact with you to find out how we can best serve your family.
