## WHAT IS IT?

SASD students have instant access to free streaming services, audiobooks, e-books, online learning and other digital resources offered through Mead Public Library. These resources never incur fees and don't require students to have a regular library card.

## HOW DOES IT WORK?

Visit [www.meadpl.org/virtual-card](http://www.meadpl.org/virtual-card) to begin accessing digital resources available through Mead. If a site requires you to create an account, please use your school email address. Otherwise, log in using your student ID # and date of birth as follows:

Your **CARD NUMBER** is the number **0035**, followed by your **six-digit student ID**. *If your student ID was 123456, your card number would be 0035123456.*

Your **PIN** is your **8-digit date of birth**, with no spaces or other characters between the numbers. *If your birthday was 04/03/2015, your PIN would be 04032015.*

## CAN I GET A PHYSICAL CARD, TOO?

Yes, students are still eligible to sign up for a library card, which brings full access to the more than 2 million books, movies, video games and other items available through the Monarch Library System.

Download or stream movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, comics and TV shows to your computer, tablet, phone and TV, with no wait times.

Borrow eBooks, audiobooks and magazines directly to your mobile device. Includes selections just for kids and teens.



Offers foreign language learning in 70 languages including Spanish, French, German, Mandarin Chinese and English/ESL. Includes separate access for kids.



Featuring historical articles from Wisconsin newspapers on a range of statewide and local issues, along with historical events and topics.



Access ebooks, games and other resources aimed at building and improving reading and numerical literacy from a young age.



Children and preteens can find book recommendations tailored to their interests, with read-alikes, discussion guides, reading lists and more.



Offers hundreds of online classes in accounting, finance, business, design, health care, language, law, teaching, technology, publishing and more.



Features ebooks for grades PreK–3 that pair animated storybooks with nonfiction texts to inspire a love of reading & learning.
