Superintendent Report Amy Fast

New accountability bill:

Recent Oregon legislation requires ODE and the State Board of Education to establish statewide student outcome performance targets, including early literacy, math proficiency, on-track rates, graduation rates, attendance, and one locally selected indicator. Districts must collaborate with ODE to set aligned growth goals and monitor progress using interim assessments, particularly in K-8 math and language arts.

The law establishes a tiered system of state support and intervention for districts that miss targets over multiple years, ranging from mandatory coaching to increased oversight and, after four years, potential state direction of up to 25% of certain district funds. The legislation also aims to reduce administrative burden, especially for small and rural districts, while coinciding with increased statewide K-12 funding and changes to State School Fund distribution.

For Dayton School District 8, implementation will require enhanced data collection, subgroup reporting, and ongoing progress monitoring, supporting the creation of the Data Specialist position. Interim assessment practices are under review to ensure alignment with state requirements. District leadership and the Board will be involved in goal-setting, monitoring progress, and aligning resources. Equity and reduction of outcome disparities are central, with required annual public reporting of progress.

Next steps include assessing data system readiness, reviewing interim assessments, developing an internal implementation timeline, and providing ongoing Board updates. A Board work session is recommended next month to review the requirements alongside the district's strategic plan.
