SOC 1: Intro to Sociology - Basic concepts, theoretical approaches, and methods of sociology: Analysis and explanation of social structure, group dynamics, socialization and the self, social stratification, culture and diversity, social change and global dynamics. COMM C1000: Public Speaking -Principles of public speaking: online communication/public speaking (content creation, social media, podcasting), Social Movements, Community organizing, comedy and improv skills. UC/CSU Transferable	COMM 10: Gender and Communication- Exploration of the relationship between gender and communication: Interpersonal, mediated, social, organizational, and cultural contexts; gender in public and private settings, media images, and personal identities. CIS 6: Intro to Computer Programming - Introduction to computer programming: Algorithm design, flow charting, and debugging; elements of good programming style. Course may be instructed in any programming language. UC/CSU Transferable	CIS 232: Robotics - Intro to robotics: Want to make robots run around? Make them sing songs or dance? We will be using python to program our robots to do just that. Come join our robotics course this Spring. - NOT Transferable	Z3213
GRART 34: Adobe Illustrator - Skill based approach to vector based drawing software: Emphasis on graphic design, print and web graphics and fine arts applications; exploration through hands-on projects. CSU Transferable	GRART 36: Adobe Photoshop - Introduction to imaging software utilized in the graphic arts for photo and tonal manipulations: Selecting, painting and filling, layers, editing images, color correction, typography, tools, masks and channels, converting and manipulating images, and filters ; exploration through hands-on projects. PSYCH C1000: Intro to Psychology- Scientific principles of psychology: Application of scientific research in understanding learning, human development, biological processes, personality, behavior disorders, social psychology, and adjustment of the human organism. UC/CSU Transferable	Psych 24: Abnormal Psychology - Survey of major psychological disorders: Historical perspectives of various theoretical models (biological, psychodynamic, behavioral, cognitive, humanistic, existential, socio-cultural); review of research for understanding of origins and most promising treatments. COUN 24: College Success - Identification and development of resources that facilitate college success: High-performance learning utilizing information organization and management, critical thinking and problem-solving skills, effective time management, learning styles and strategies and memory theory, goal setting and educational planning, and campus/community resources. UC/CSU Transferable	COUN 57: Career and Life Planning - In-depth career and life planning: Self-exploration, identifying values, interests, needs and goals; development of skills for assuming careers and lifestyles over the lifespan, influence of career choice on the quality of life, and the development of a career action plan. BUS 10: Intro to Business - Introduction to business: Survey of various phases of business, organization, finance, personnel, production, marketing, managerial controls, and government-business relations. UC/CSU Transferable	BUS 6: Principles of Financial Investments - Principles of finance and investments: Introduction to financial planning, analysis, and decision-making as an individual, manager, or executive with an emphasis on applying economic principles; budgeting, investment, taxes, credit, money management, insurance, and retirement. HUMAN 21: Film and Communication - Analysis of history and aesthetics of film from its inception in the late nineteenth century to the present: Language of film, factual films vs. fictional films, effect of films on contemporary society. UC/CSU Transferable	HUMAN 15: Pop Culture - Meaning and impact of American popular culture in the twentieth century: The cultural evolution of consumerism, amusement, leisure, media, and entertainment industries. UC/CSU Transferable	Z3215
RLEST 2A: Principles of Real Estate - Basic laws and principles of California real estate: Provides understanding, background, and terminology necessary for advanced study in specialized courses; designed to assist those preparing for the real estate salesperson's licensing examination. CSU Transferable	RLEST 5: Real Estate Practice - Comprehensive presentation of daily activities of brokers and salespersons: Selling, listing, advertising, taking and presenting offers, qualifying buyers; appraisal, finance, and escrow procedures; taxation, investment property, and exchanges. CSU Transferable	Z3207
ARCH 10: Intro to Architecture - Introduction to the history, practice and administration of architecture and related design professions: Operations, coordination and management of an architectural office. UC/CSU Transferable	ARCH 35: Perspectives, Shades, and Shadows - Development of skills in preparing three-dimensional linear illustrations: Principles of isometrics and perspective drawing, casting of shades and shadows on architectural/structural elements, freehand sketching. - UC/CSU Transferable	Z3225
BIO 31: Human Nutrition Principles of human nutrition: Nutrients, their function and food sources; problems of excess and deficiency; dietary goals for health promotion and disease prevention. UC/CSU Transferable	BIO 25: Human Biology Principles of life science through the study of biological structures and functions of the human organism: Human genetics, evolution, ecology, sexual differences and comparisons, development and growth, and survey of body systems. UC/CSU Transferable	Z3203
M/LAT 2A: Latin American Folklore - Study of Mexican/American folklore, including Spanish-speaking folk groups in the United States: Indigenous myths, legends, contemporary oral narrative, folk art, cooking, and folk music with emphasis on ballads, folk humor, and festivals. UC/CSU Transferable	M/LAT 30A: Survey of Latin American Films - Critical examination of historical and contemporary film images of Latinos/Americanos as a result of cultural encounters within the United States: traditional and emerging objectives of film makers and producers. UC/CSU Transferable	Z3209
ADJUS 21: Intro to Administration of Justice - History and philosophy of administration of justice in America: Identification of various subsystems emphasizing US courts, corrections, and law enforcement, role expectations and their interrelationships. UC/CSU Transferable	ADJUS 22: Concepts of Criminal Law - Historical development and philosophy of law and constitutional provisions: Classification of crime, legal research, study of case law, and concepts of law as a social force. UC/CSU Transferable	Z3219
CULIN 201A: Culinary Bootcamp - Introduction to the culinary arts technical education: History of food, history of culinary arts discipline, kitchen vocabulary, kitchen etiquette, basic cooking theory and hands on commercial kitchen technical skills. NOT Transferable	CULIN 201B: Culinary Bootcamp - Introduction to the culinary arts technical education: History of local culinary food arts discipline, basic baking theory and technique, food sensory awareness, food pathways and basic nutritional concepts, and obtaining a food handlers certificate. NOT Transferable	Z3229
CIS 71: Intro to Information Systems Security - Fundamental principles of Information Technology, Security and Risk Management: Hardware, software, processes, communications, applications, and policies and procedures of organizational cyber security and risk management. CSU Transferable	CIS 72: Systems and Network Administration - Design, development and support of server hardware and software technologies: Disaster recovery and security administration. CSU Transferable	Z3231
