### TEACHER'S CORNER



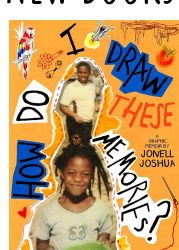

### EPSILON BETA NEWS

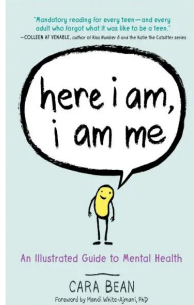

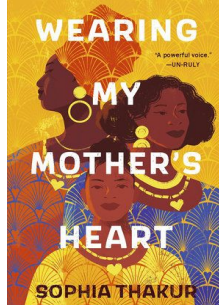
### NEW BOOKS



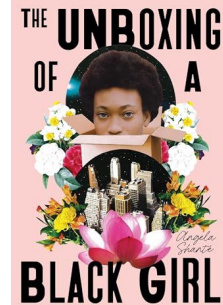
This graphic novel memoir tells the story of the author's mental health struggles and the need for family connection
