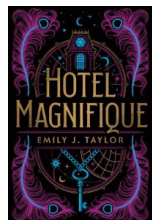

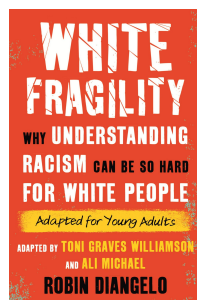


EPSILON BETA NEWS

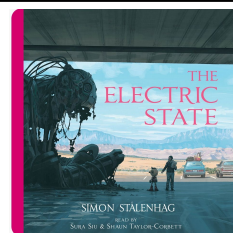
NEW BOOKS
