

WILL I BE ELIGIBLE FOR A PE EXEMPTION?

- ▶ If you completed two full seasons of a sport, band, or cheerleading you may be excused from taking PE classes
 - ▶ Two seasons cannot be in the same year
 - ▶ Two full seasons means two years of the same activity
 - ▶ No partial PE exemptions will be granted
 - ▶ Two seasons must be done by end of junior year
 - ▶ You would need to complete $\frac{1}{2}$ credit in something else for your elective requirement
 - ▶ Check your transcript - is it on there? Email your counselor
 - ▶ More info is on P. **28** of the curriculum guide


ARE YOU CONSIDERING CTEC? CLASSES OF 2029-2030

- ▶ Programs are a two-year commitment and the junior class is selected from all the county high schools
 - ▶ To be a good candidate you need to have your 9th and 10th courses DONE:
 - ▶ 2 English credits
 - ▶ 2 Math- including Algebra I
 - ▶ 2 Science
 - ▶ 2 Social Studies
 - ▶ 0.5 PE (2x .25)
 - ▶ 0.5 Health (9th)
 - ▶ 0.5 Careers (10th)
 - ▶ 0.5 Computers (IT)
 - ▶ Add in note about financial literacy

HOW DO I KNOW WHAT MATH, SCIENCE, ENGLISH OR SOCIAL STUDIES CLASS TO TAKE?

- ▶ Current 8th grade through 11th students should have a conversation with your current subject area teacher for recommended classes and the teacher will select your level for next year.
- ▶ After next year starts in the fall, you will not be permitted to change a course level because:
 - ▶ You did not complete summer work
 - ▶ You lost your nerve
- ▶ Starting in the fall, Schedule Change Policy will change
- ▶ **SCHEDULE CHANGE POLICY**
- ▶ Schedule changes will only be permitted for broken schedules, students who have failed a pre-requisite for a scheduled class, for those students who attend summer school, or for changes deemed necessary by the counselors and/or administration due to academic misplacement. All students requesting a schedule change must complete the Schedule Change Form with all required signatures, which includes parent/guardian, and must be turned in to your counselor before the end of the schedule change period. No schedule changes will be made after the 3-day schedule change period ends

WHAT IF I DO NOT AGREE WITH A TEACHER RECOMMENDATION?

- ▶ The recommendation is based on your current grade, work ethic and predicted success in the next course
 - ▶ Have a conversation with your present teacher
 - ▶ If you and your parent/guardian feel the teacher recommendation is not the right one, you and your parent/ guardian can contact your school counselor




