Helpful Tips:

- If you took MS IT in 7th or 8th grade you do not need to take another IT course unless you want to. (Class of 2027 is the last class to possibly have earned this at the MS).
- If you want band, please schedule that for a full year (Course number 1210).
- By the end of sophomore year, students need to have completed an IT course (.5 credits), Health (.5 credits), 2 PE classes (.25 Credits each), and Careers (.5 credits).
- Please note this form is only to help students select courses, as it does not indicate the exact order in which they will appear on a student's schedule.

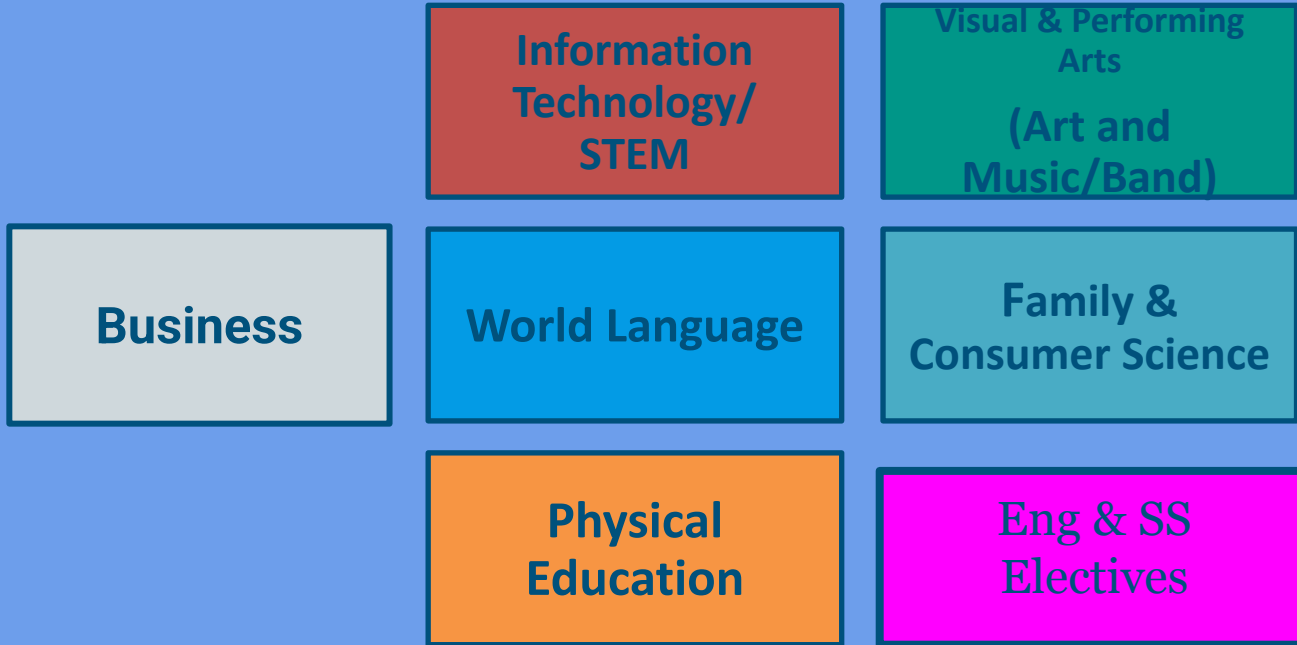

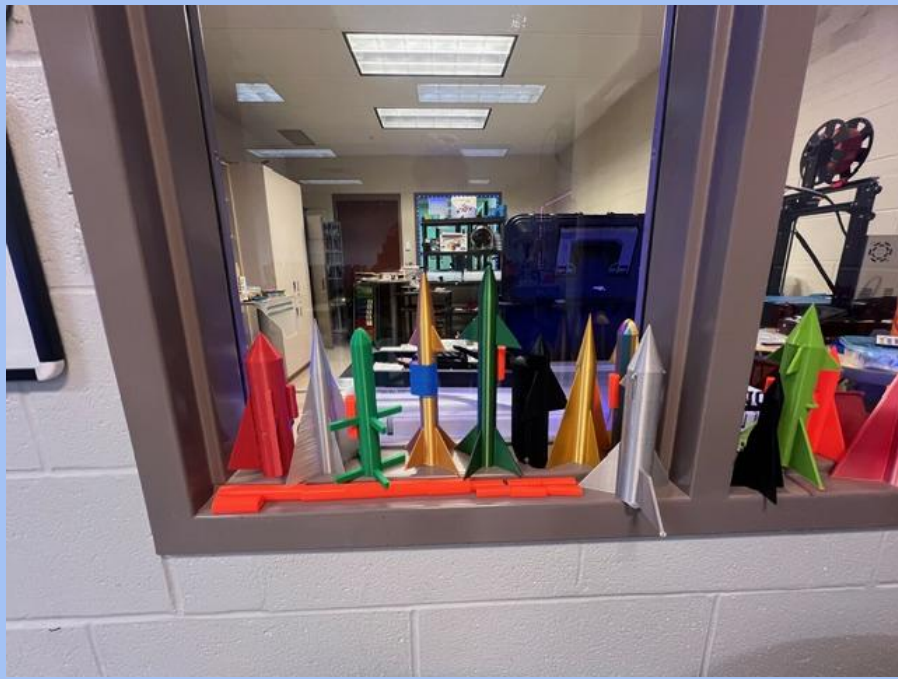

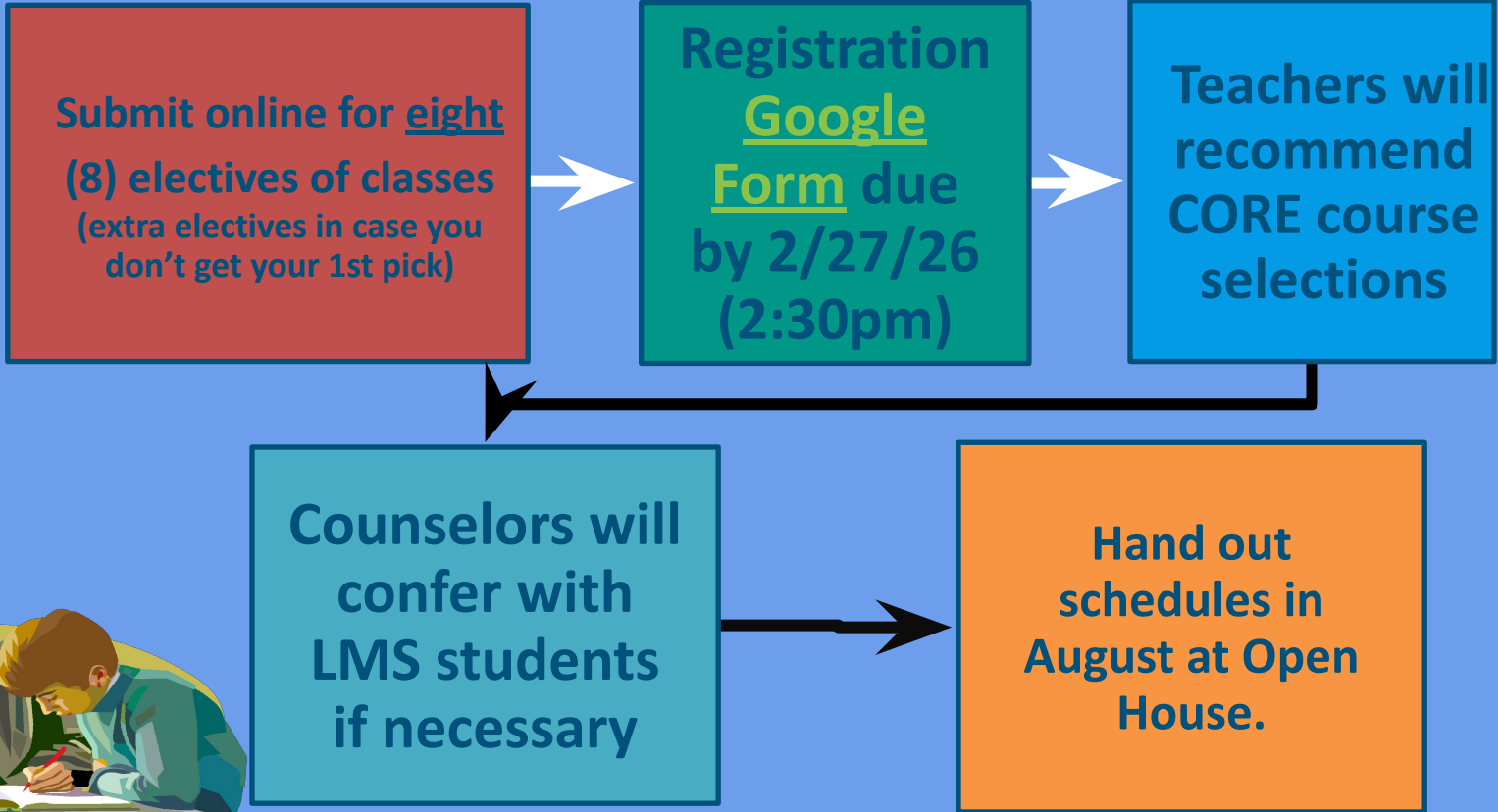
Is your student considering CTEC?

- Programs are a two-year commitment and the junior class is selected from all the county high schools
- LHS hosts CIS/IT (Computer Information Systems/Information Technology)
- To be a good candidate you need to have your 9th and 10th courses COMPLETED w/ a passing grade:
 - 2 English credits
 - 2 Science
 - 0.5 PE (.25 X 2)
 - 0.5 Careers
 - 2 Math **including Algebra I**
 - 2 Social Studies
 - 0.5 Health
 - 0.5 Informational Technology (IT)

How can I be eligible for the PE Exemption?

- If you completed two consecutive years of the same sport, band, or cheerleading you may be excused from taking PE classes
- No partial PE exemptions will be granted
- Two seasons must be done by end of junior year
- You would need to complete ½ credit in another high school elective
- Athletes- be sure you are enrolled in and passing 5.0 credits.
- **Adding and dropping courses have gotten athletes into trouble!!!!**
- ie. football freshman and sophomore years

Registration Process



Scheduling Procedures Tips

1. Must complete full schedule or (8) eight periods- save a period for lunch to make 9
2. Remember, you are picking your own info so the "I never signed up for that class" excuse to change your schedule no longer applies. (Google Form)
3. You are picking how you will spend the next year so research classes and talk to students who have taken courses you are interested in
4. Once you submit your online elective form, you cannot edit it.

Schedule Changes

Schedule changes MUST be initiated by teachers for the 2026-2027 school year. Changes will only be made for inappropriately leveled courses by the teacher. This means, pick your classes wisely.



Other important LHS
information...

CCP @LHS

- College Credit Plus- typically 11th and 12th grade students
- Grades weighted like AP on a 5.0 scale
- Qualified students may take college courses free of charge here or at area campuses
- **You must attend an online informational meeting with a parent eligible for next year. There are meeting options on our page below**
- LHS staff and courses are also under CCP umbrella too. Check out the [CCP page](#) on our website
- Must have qualifying ACT/COMPASS test scores to be college-ready

AP @ LHS

- Advanced Placement courses are the Golden Apple.
- These are really recommended for college-prep Juniors and Seniors.
- AP Computer Science is available for 9th graders
- Keep this in mind for down the road!
