WALL TOWNSHIP COMMUNITY

Wall Township is a well-established suburban community in southern Monmouth County, home to over 26,000 residents. Located just minutes from the Jersey Shore and within commuting distance of New York City, the township offers both coastal charm and urban accessibility. The Wall Township Public Schools serve approximately 3,200 students in a comprehensive PK-12 setting, with Wall High School providing a wide range of academic, athletic, and extracurricular opportunities in a supportive and vibrant learning environment.

WALL HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMIES, ATHLETICS, & HONORS

Wall High School is proud to offer three specialized academies designed to foster academic excellence, leadership, and career exploration: the Wall Business & Finance Academy, the Pre-Engineering Academy, and the Service & Leadership Academy.

Participation in these academies is formally recognized on student transcripts with an official academy seal, indicating successful completion of a comprehensive, multi-year program aligned with college and career readiness.

Wall High School features 32 varsity sports, with 15 students from the Class of 2025 committed to continuing their athletic careers at the collegiate level across a range of sports.

Students also have the opportunity to engage in a variety of honor societies, including the National Honor Society—which currently includes 66 members—as well as the National Art Honor Society, National Music Honor Society, and the International Thespians Society.

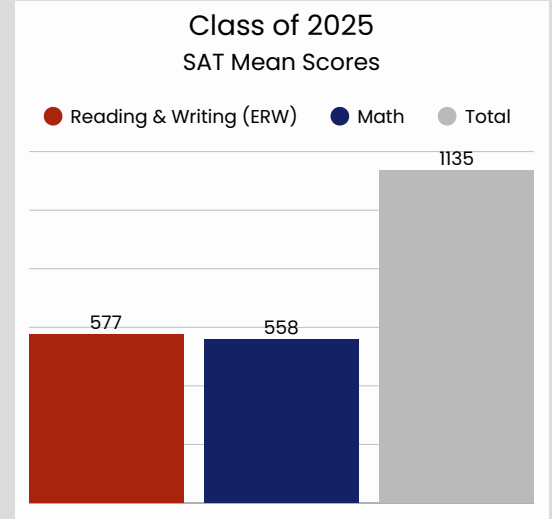
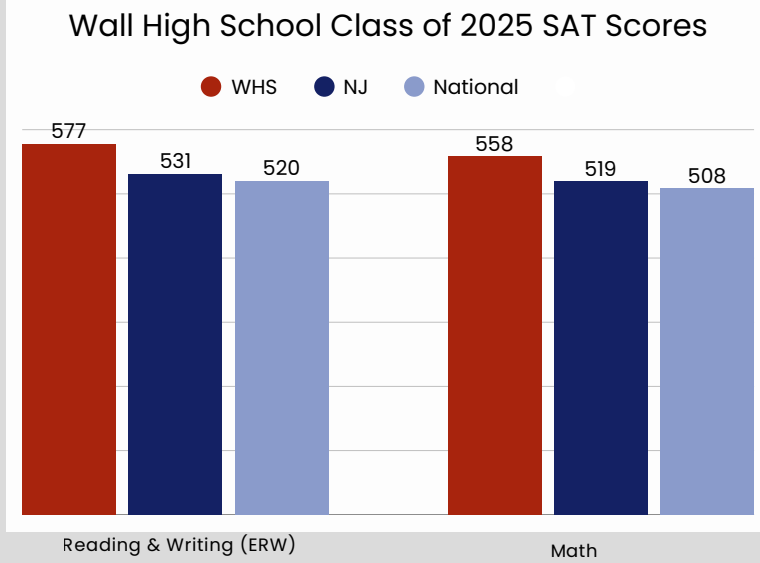
SEAL OF BI-LITERACY

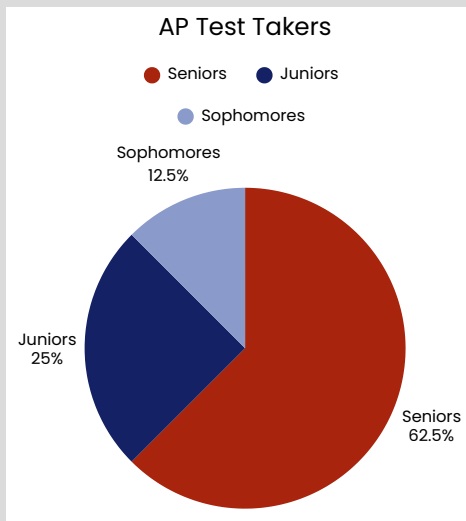

TEST SCORES (THROUGH JUNE 2025)

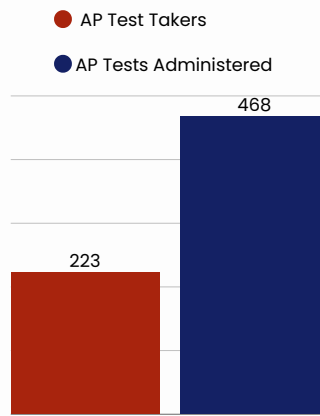
SAT Testing Results



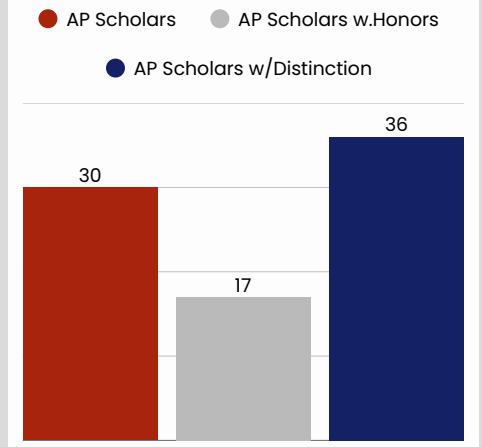
Advanced Placement Testing

Our updated grading scale is designed to provide a clearer and more consistent measure of student performance, align with a commonly used college/university grading scale, and enhance our academic culture. For more rigorous courses, such as Honors, *Advanced Placement™*, and Dual Enrollment courses, we will continue to delineate grade weighting. In addition, if a student transfers into Wall High School after the completion of a school year(s), the student's cumulative GPA will be calculated only on courses taken at Wall High School.

We look forward to a continued collaborative partnership in support of students and wish you a successful school year.
