If the Board determines that noise or obstruction of view disrupts proceedings, the activities shall be discontinued as determined by the Board.

Any meeting participant who engages in disorderly conduct which disturbs the peace and good order of the meeting, or refuses to comply with the lawful orders of the Board may be ordered removed from the meeting, and may be guilty of a misdemeanor (Cal. Penal Code Sec. 403).

However, in exceptional circumstances when necessary to ensure full public input, the Board president may, with Board consent, adjust the time allowed for public input and/or the time allotted to each speaker. Any such adjustment shall be done equitably so as to allow a diversity of viewpoints. The president may also ask members of the public with the same viewpoint to select a few individuals to address the Board on behalf of that viewpoint.

In order to ensure that non-English speakers receive the same opportunity to directly address the Board, any member of the public who utilizes a translator shall be provided at least twice the allotted time to address the Board, unless simultaneous translation equipment is used to allow the Board/Public to hear the translated public testimony simultaneously. (Government Code 54954.3)

Guadalupe Gonzalez, Community Member: 1) Shared her long-standing involvement in education and community leadership and expressed strong support for the accomplishments and stability of the school district under Dr. Gina Potter's leadership. She highlighted district achievements, including recognition for academic programs, governance, and community collaboration. 2) Drawing from personal experience, she emphasized the seriousness of child safety issues and voiced support for a thorough, professional investigation to ensure facts were fully reviewed before reaching conclusions, encouraging a thoughtful and fair process.

Jasmin Lopez, Classified Employee: 1) Thanked the district for the opportunity to attend training in Sacramento and shared that she had successfully completed the program to become a school bus driver instructor. 2) Discussed the transportation department.

Ms. Strange, Taxpayers Oversight for Parents & Students: 1) Challenged district leadership, alleging serious failures related to student safety, facilities, transparency, and overall accountability. 2) Raised concerns regarding school safety. 3) Questioned academic outcomes and expressed dissatisfaction.

Rosie Higuera, North County Advocate: 1) Raised concerns regarding school safety. 2) Urged leadership to prioritize child protection, review legal representation and policies, and consider changes. 3) Encouraged greater parent involvement in governance and advocated for additional safety measures such as cameras. 4) Concluded by calling for continued community engagement and support for affected families.

Mary Davis, Public Education Oversight Project: 1) Raised concerns regarding school safety. 2) Urged the district to increase transparency and accountability to ensure compliance with state and federal requirements and to maintain public trust.

Miguel Aguirre, Business Owner: 1) Expressed support for a community advocate and emphasized the need for transparency, respectful dialogue, and unity between the Board and the community to address concerns and move the district forward.

Angelica Martinez, Parent Advocate: 1) Expressed concerns about limits on public comment, district transparency, and accountability related to the handling and communication of a safety incident.

12. ITEMS FROM THE BOARD & SUPERINTENDENT

Board Member Peraza: 1) Advocated for video-only school cameras. 2) Expressed concerns about district transparency and accountability related to the handling and communication of a safety incident. 3) Discussed her expectations regarding parent notification protocols. 4) Discussed her proposed parent choice diaper assistance policy.

Board Member Arias: 1) Congratulated Assistant Superintendent Dr. Iniguez and Chief Business Official Marilyn Adrianzen for the team's hard work in the School Bond Transparency Report Card. 2) Thanked district staff, labor partners, and community organizations for their ongoing work and acknowledged efforts related to district projects and services. 3) Expressed support for advancing the RFP process to secure an independent external legal investigation, viewing it as an initial step toward rebuilding community trust. He also noted that certain questions cannot be addressed by the board due to an ongoing criminal investigation, explaining that those matters fall under the jurisdiction of law enforcement and the district attorney's office.

Board Clerk Lopez: 1) Thanked school administrators, district leadership, and staff for hosting the event and acknowledged the district's recognition for transparency and bond oversight, noting the effort behind that achievement. 2) Highlighted that board members must operate within legal constraints, encouraged respectful dialogue and community engagement, and stressed the importance of collaboration, mutual respect, and continued focus on supporting students, staff, and families.

Board Vice President Martinez: 1) Welcomed attendees to the board meeting and thanked school leadership, visiting trustees, community members, and staff for their presence and support. 2) Acknowledged a prior special board meeting to advance an external investigation, noting the board's unanimous approval and commitment to transparency and accountability in the process. 3) Expressed appreciation to district staff, labor partners, and law enforcement in attendance, and concluded by extending holiday well wishes to the community.

Board President Rosario: 1) Expressed gratitude for the opportunity to hold board meetings at different school sites and highlighted the importance of recognizing each school's unique contributions and community identity. 2) Acknowledged community support through school bond measures, credited staff and educators for their dedication, and noted the long-term positive outcomes seen in former students. 3) Emphasized the value of collaboration, civility, and mutual respect among students, families, staff, and community members, stressing that constructive dialogue and professionalism are essential to maintaining a supportive and stable educational environment focused on student success. 4) Acknowledged Jasmin Lopez, who previously requested support to pursue advanced training and has since earned certification as a trainer of trainers. Thanked her for her commitment and effort and expressed support for applying her skills in a leadership role.

Acting Superintendent Bojorquez: 1) Informed the board and community that the district received a statewide Partners in Education award for a collaborative science initiative, recognizing the work of Sci Phy teachers and staff. 2) Noted the district's participation in a recent university-led study focused on instructional improvement, which involved administrators and teachers. 3) Congratulated staff for their efforts and emphasized continued focus on supporting student learning.
