Arrival & Dismissal Safety Concerns:

Vermont Families: We have had an increased number of reports about unsafe driving at arrival and dismissal. Please take a moment to review these very important reminders and consider if your family's routine at arrival/dismissal needs to be amended:

1. Students are to be dropped off on a sidewalk. Do not stop in the crosswalk to drop off and do not drop off students in the middle of the road. This is an important safety concern, in addition to disrupting the flow of traffic for everyone.
2. Pulling into the driveways of neighboring houses at arrival/dismissal is prohibited. Not only does backing out of a driveway create a significant safety concern, it does not demonstrate respect to our neighbors.
3. The speed limit in the school zone is 20 mph. Vehicles exceeding this speed are subject to heavy fines and significant penalties. We all want to avoid this.
4. U-turns in the drop off area are never permitted.
5. The only vehicles permitted in the bus line are buses and daycare/school vans. Cars should not be waiting in or parked in this area.

Hilltop Families:

Please do not drive halfway up Fleming, turn around in a driveway and enter the car line. Backing out of the driveways of neighboring houses not only creates a significant safety concern, it does not demonstrate respect to our neighbors. We should never be using private driveways as part of our arrival/dismissal procedures. Following these guidelines helps everyone drop off and pick up their student(s) in an efficient and safe manner and we appreciate your cooperation.

End of the Trimester: On February 19th report cards will go home in Thursday folders along with detailed MAP reports. Please empty the contents of the envelope you receive, keep the documents for your records and sign/return the envelope so these can be used again. Feel free to reach out to your child's classroom teacher if you have any questions or would like additional insight regarding your child's progress.

In compliance with [Erin's Law](#), students in grades K-6 will be participating in a child abuse safety workshop during the week of February 23rd that will be facilitated by trained staff from the Council on Child Abuse of Southern Ohio (COCA). Younger students (grades K-2) will learn the difference between safe and unsafe touches. Older students (grades 3-6) will learn to recognize the types of child abuse (Physical, Verbal, Sexual, Emotional and Neglect). All students will learn the importance of telling a trusted adult if child abuse is suspected. From the Nurse's Office: We are seeing a surge in community-wide illnesses such as influenza, covid, stomach viruses, and common cold viruses. Many of these illnesses share similar symptoms, and it can be difficult to know which one your child may have. If your child is not feeling well, we ask that you:

1. Check their temperature before sending your child to school. If they have a temperature of 100.0 °F or higher, please keep them home. Students should be fever-free for 24 hours with no fever-reducing medication (such as acetaminophen or ibuprofen) before returning to school.
2. If NO fever is present, please give medications for stomachache, headache, coughing, or other symptoms before sending them to school.
3. Students MAY NOT bring medication to school and nurses cannot give ANY medications to a student without a signed medication form.
4. If your child is fever-free, but has a stuffy/runny nose or cough, please encourage them to take precautions to limit the spread of germs until they feel better. This includes frequent hand washing or using hand sanitizer, covering their coughs, etc.
5. Students experiencing stomach virus symptoms (with or without fever) should stay home for at least 24 hours following their last episode of vomiting.
