Transfer & Credit for Prior Learning Resources

 <p>College Credit Transfer Courses</p>	<p>The Kansas Board of Regents has approved 100+ System Wide Transfer (SWT) courses. A student who successfully completes any of these courses at a Kansas public university, community college, or technical college will be able to transfer the course to any Kansas public postsecondary institution offering an equivalent course.</p> <p>Learn more about transferring credits across Kansas public institutions.</p>
 <p>College Credit for Prior Learning</p>	<p>Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) refers to a process used by post-secondary institutions to award academic credit for a student's knowledge and expertise acquired through life and professional experience, as long as the student's knowledge and skills are determined to be equivalent to college-level learning.</p> <p>Advanced Placement, College-Level Exam Program, International Baccalaureate, military experience are common types of CPL for which college credit is awarded at institutions.</p> <p>View specific CPL information and policies for Kansas public institutions.</p>
