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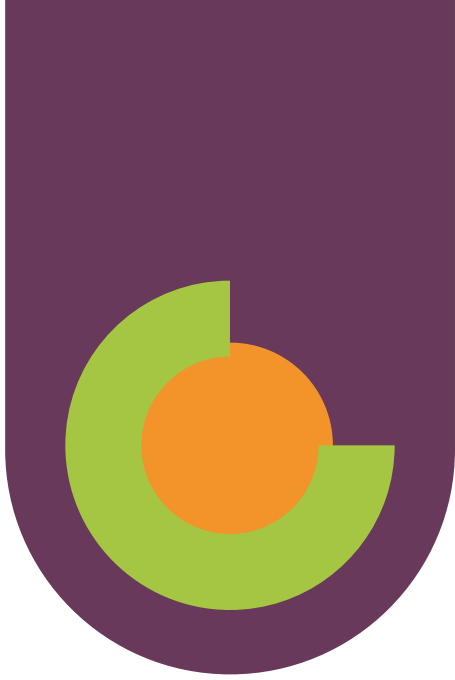


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Ector County Independent School District

The TAPR is used to evaluate and improve educational strategies and outcomes across the state.

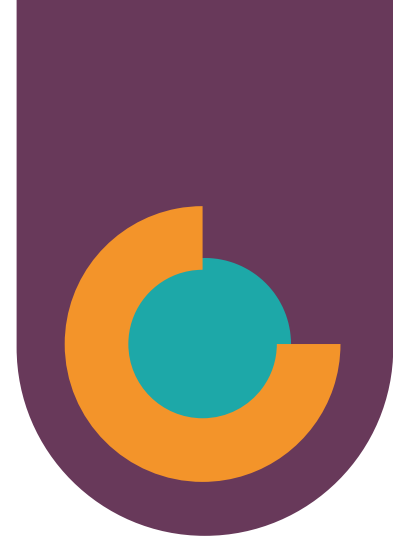

(RDA) indicators and federally required elements (FREs). The four levels are: Meets Requirements (DL 1), Needs Assistance (DL 2), Needs Intervention (DL 3), and Needs Substantial Intervention (DL 4), which trigger varying levels of monitoring and support.

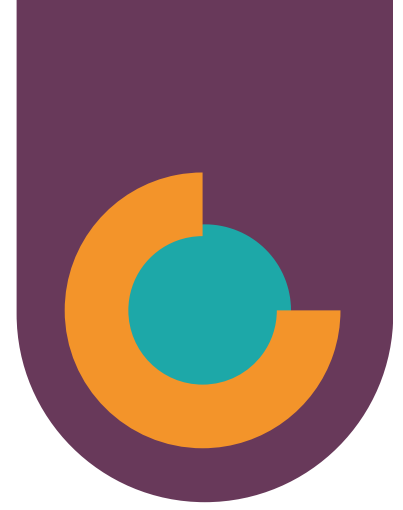
