We are going to tell you the history of the 15 Rock-bridge students who started out together in September of the year 1951. Mrs. Charlotte Geiger was our first and second grade teacher. No one joined us in the first grade, but Josephine Kline and Kay Mansberger joined us in the second grade. Kay was only with us three weeks.

Our third grade teacher was Mrs. Lucille Wright. This year went by without any additions to the class. In our fourth year we were joined by Karen Wilkes and in the fifth by Delores Britton. Mrs. Rowena Richards was our fourth and fifth grade teacher. In our sixth grade we welcomed Linda Delong and Bob Speck. Our teacher for this year was Mrs. Clara Martin.

Our seventh year brought us Judie French and Judy Cable. In the first half of this year our teacher was Mrs. Elizabeth Gabel. Due to her illness, Mr. Emory Brickey, was our teacher for the rest of the year. Sharon Carter joined us in the eighth grade. This year, Mrs. Marie Huls was our teacher and class advisor. Our eighth grade graduation party was held at the home of Delores Britton.

Those who left us during our eight years were: Josephine Kline, Karen Wilkes, Kay Mansberger, Carolyn Carr, Deborah MacInturf, Ladene Lawson, Bob James, Linda Delong, and Bob Speck. Janice Beougher, Sharon Carter and Delores Britton left us in the fall of 1959 to start their high school years at Logan, while Judy Cable, Bob Smith, Gene Mathias, Judie French, Kaye Flowers, Harley Goss and Charlotte Yantes traveled to Berne Union to finish their remaining years.

The history of the class of 1963 began in 1951, with 46 pupils entering the first grade. Of the 46 starting, 17 remain to graduate from Berne Union. Mrs. Clark and Mrs. Andrews bravely led us on a tour of Deeds Dairy and to the top of Mount Pleasant that first year.

Our second grade teachers Miss Schein and Mrs. Richmond taught us to write. Our class trip that year was to the Columbus Zoo.

The highlight of our third year was our appearance on Spook Beckman's television program. Miss Van Horn and Mrs. Bradbury also took us on a tour of the Ohio State Museum.

In the fourth grade, Mrs. Blum's room divided into two groups to learn their multiplication tables, the losers giving the winners a party. Mrs. Davis taught a split grade until Mrs. Clausen arrived to teach the other fourth grade. Almost everyone tooted song flutes that year.

While in our fifth year at Berne Union, we honored Adena, Logan Elm and Mound City with our presence. Mrs. Powell and Mrs. Trocchia were our teachers that year.

Mrs. Rice and Mrs. Starner were our sixth grade teachers. Some of us, in Mrs. Rice's room joined the Mickey Mouse Club. Meanwhile the students in Mrs. Starner's room developed another facet of the arts by drawing and painting. We had our first class party that year.

In the seventh grade we changed classes for the first time. Our homeroom teachers were Mrs. Weimer and Mr. Benhase,

Mrs. Woodyard and Mr. Fishbaugh were our eighth grade homeroom teachers. We were anxiously awaiting next year when we would be freshmen.

In our freshman year seven students from Rock-bridge joined our class. They were: Judy Cable, Kay Flowers, Judie French, Charlotte Yantes, Gene Mathias, Bob Smith and Harley Goss. Mrs. Woodyard and Mr. Nimon were our homeroom teachers. Class officers that year were: President, Dave Powell; Vice-President, Judy Crozier; Secretary, Connie Collins and Treasurer, Bonnie Beougher. Freshman cheerleaders were: Relva Deeds and Linda Tigner. Our Homecoming attendant was Kaye Flowers.

Miss Buerkel and Mr. Nimon were our sophomore homeroom teachers. Ruth Carmichael, Bob Miller, Connie Collins and Judy Crozier, were our class officers. Sophomore cheerleaders were: Linda Tigner, Relva Deeds and Tania Blaney. Ruth Carmichael was our Homecoming attendant. Mr. Catchpole took our Biology class on a field trip to Black Lick Forest.

The Junior class officers, President, Ruth Jackson; Vice-President, Mary Krile; Secretary, Connie Collins; Treasurer, Relva Deeds; and Student Council, Laura Hintz and Ruth Carmichael were almost indisputable when it came to planning for the Prom. Mrs. Huber and Mr. Shiltz were our homeroom teachers. Sharon Wentz was the only Junior cheerleader. We were represented at Homecoming by Sandy McCrady. "Stairway to the Stars" was the theme for our Prom. Our biggest project was making the stairway reaching from the gym floor to the ceiling. The class colors, powder blue and white; motto, "Destiny is in our hands"; and flower, white rose bud; were chosen.

September of 1962 brought us back to Berne Union for our Senior year, with Mrs. Marshall as our class advisor. Senior class officers were: President, Judy Crozier; Vice-President, Mary Kay Krile; Secretary, Connie Collins; Treasurer, Ruth Carmichael; and Student Council Representative, Dave Powell. Sharon Wentz reigned as Homecoming Queen with Ruth Jackson as Senior attendant. We were well represented in the sports world with Sharon Wentz as head cheerleader; Roger Aubery, Bob Miller, Mike Matheny and Jim Dicken were on the football squad; and Bob Miller, Jim Krile and Jim Dicken were on the basketball team. Senior band members were: Ruth Carmichael, Connie Collins, Ruth Jackson, Judy Crozier, Dave Powell, Gene Mathias, Bob Miller, and Jim Krile. Senior chorus members were: Tania Blaney, Sharon Wentz, Virginia Whitfield, Connie Collins, Ruth Carmichael, Pam Shull, Sandy McCrady and Becky Ride-nour. Rocky Lockard and Mary Kay Krile reigned as king and queen at the Senior Ball, which had the theme, "Wonderland by Night." Members of the court were: Linda Williams and Jim Krile; Relva Deeds and Gene Mathias; Janet Emrick and Dave Powell and Ruth Carmichael and Mike Matheny. Also among our royalty was Bonnie Fleming, who was a member of the Carnival Queen's court. The 1963 Prom theme was "Moonlight and Roses." The Juniors used about 600 roses to decorate.

CLASS HISTORY CONTINUED

The class history comes to a close with Baccalaureate, May 26, and Commencement, May 31. Though the history comes to a close, the lives of the members of the class of 1963 will continue. As the days go by,

we will not be able to help but remember Berne Union, or the good times, the bad times, the fun, the heartaches, the joys, or the tears, we have known in the twelve years we spent here.

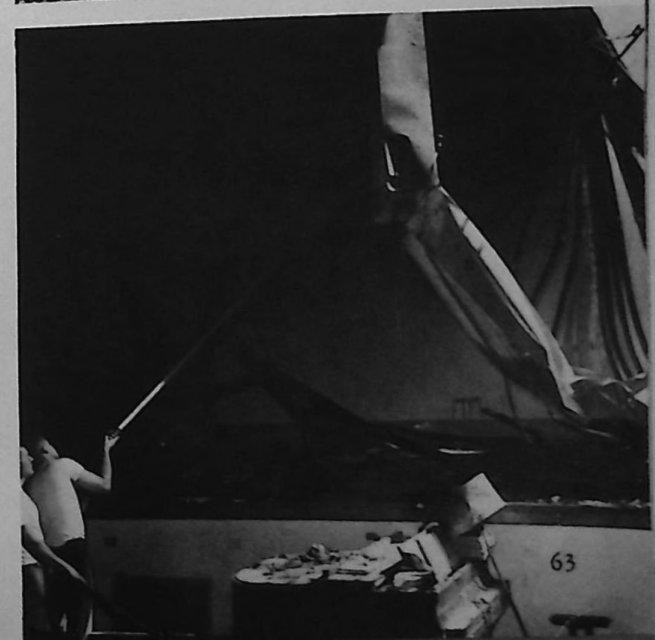
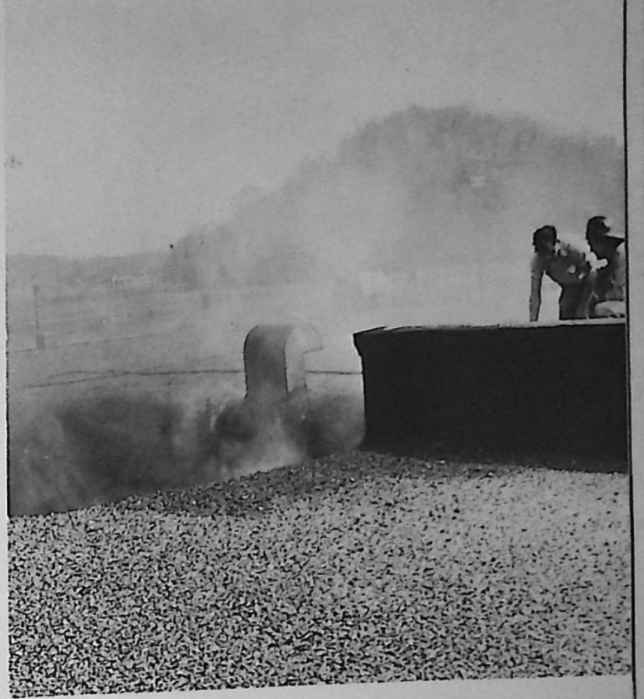
Berne Union students, thinking they were experiencing a practice fire drill, were surprised to find that there was an actual fire in the auditorium, Friday, March 29, 1963.
