# PSA Process for Students

Class of 2028 and Beyond

## PSAS DEFINED

A Minimum of Two (2) from different categories are Required for Graduation

In the chart below, each PSA is defined and how they are recorded.

PSA & Grade Level Available	What counts? Olathe Public Schools will track completion of PSA's and they will be recorded in Synergy, unless noted.
ACT Composite Score 21+ 11   12	Composite score of 21 or higher on any one ACT test taken or a super score of 21 or higher.
SAT Score 1200+ 10   11   12	A score of 1200 or higher on one SAT test taken.
9+ College Credits 11   12	Nine college credits earned at the community college or four-year university.
State Assessment (KAP) Score of 3 or 4 11   12	A score of 3 or 4 on the 10th grade Kansas Assessment Program test. Each 3 or 4 score in ELA, Math and/or Science counts as one PSA.
Advanced Placement Exam (Score of 3+) 10   11   12	Each score of 3 or higher on an AP exam. Students can earn multiple PSAs through AP test scores.
Completing Board of Regents' Kansas Scholars Curriculum 12	Students earning the following credits are eligible. Students must have passed or be enrolled in the following credits by the second semester of their senior year. 4.0 ELA   4.0 Math   3.0 Science 3.0 Social Studies   2.0 World Language
WorkKeys Level Silver+ 11   12	A score at the silver level or higher. (Note: WorkKeys is typically taken instead of the ACT and targeted for students going directly into the work force after high school.)
Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) score requirements of military branch selected 11   12	Scoring the minimum or higher on the ASVAB for the desired branch of service. A score of 31+ will allow you to join at least one branch of the military.
Seal of Biliteracy 12	Student must earn their Seal of Biliteracy by May 1 of their senior year.
Client-Centered Projects 9   10   11   12	Completion of a client-centered project as part of an Olathe high school course.

<b>Work-Based Learning</b> <b>11   12</b>	Internship, clinicals, job showing with cumulative hours of 80+ or an experience that simulates a commitment to the Work-Based Learning. Experience must align with the IPS (Individual Plan of Study).
<b>Industry-Recognized Certifications (IRC)</b> <b>9   10   11   12</b>	Students have the ability earn Industry-Recognized Certifications (IRC) in many different courses. The qualified IRC list can be found on the KSDE website.
<b>CTSO Officer – State Level Only</b> <b>11   12</b>	Students participating in a CTSO and are elected as a state officer earn a PSA. CTSO Include: BPA, DECA, EdRising, FCCLA, FBLA, FFA, HOSA, TSA
<b>CTE Scholar</b> <b>12</b>	Students fulfill the requirements of the current CTE requirement established by the Kansas Department of Education. Requirements may include 9+ college credit hours, be a completer in a CTE pathway, engage in 100+ hours of community service, earn an IRC, maintain a 3.5 GPA in CTE coursework, and complete a Career Vision Reflection.
<b>Two or more high school athletics/activities</b> <b>9   10   11   12</b>	Successful participation in two (2) different athletics or activities in a student’s high school career. Athletics or activities are defined as a KSHSAA or state student activities organization sponsored by and adult with one or more competitions or performances outside the school day. <i>See eligible list below.</i>
<b>95% attendance in high school</b> <b>9   10   11   12</b>	95% attendance for the first seven (7) semesters. Students who transfer in may prorate their attendance and only consider the time spent in Olathe.
<b>40+ hours of Community Service</b> <b>9   10   11   12</b>	Completion of 40 or more hours of unpaid community service as recorded on the Community Service log. Eligible community service must be conducted between the first day of school of a student’s freshman year and April 1st of their senior year. <b>Note:</b> Student will log community service hours in xello. <a href="http://www.xello.website.com">www.xello.website.com</a>
<b>Eagle Scout or Gold Award</b> <b>9   10   11   12</b>	Completion of the requirements to earn the Eagle rank from Scouting America or the Gold Award from Girl Scouts of the USA. <b>Note:</b> Student will log Eagle Scout or Gold Award in xello. <a href="http://www.xello.website.com">www.xello.website.com</a>
<b>4-H Kansas Key Award</b> <b>9   10   11   12</b>	Completion of the requirements to earn the Kansas Key Award from the Kansas 4-H foundation. <b>Note:</b> Student will log 4-H Kansas Key Award in xello. <a href="http://www.xello.website.com">www.xello.website.com</a>
