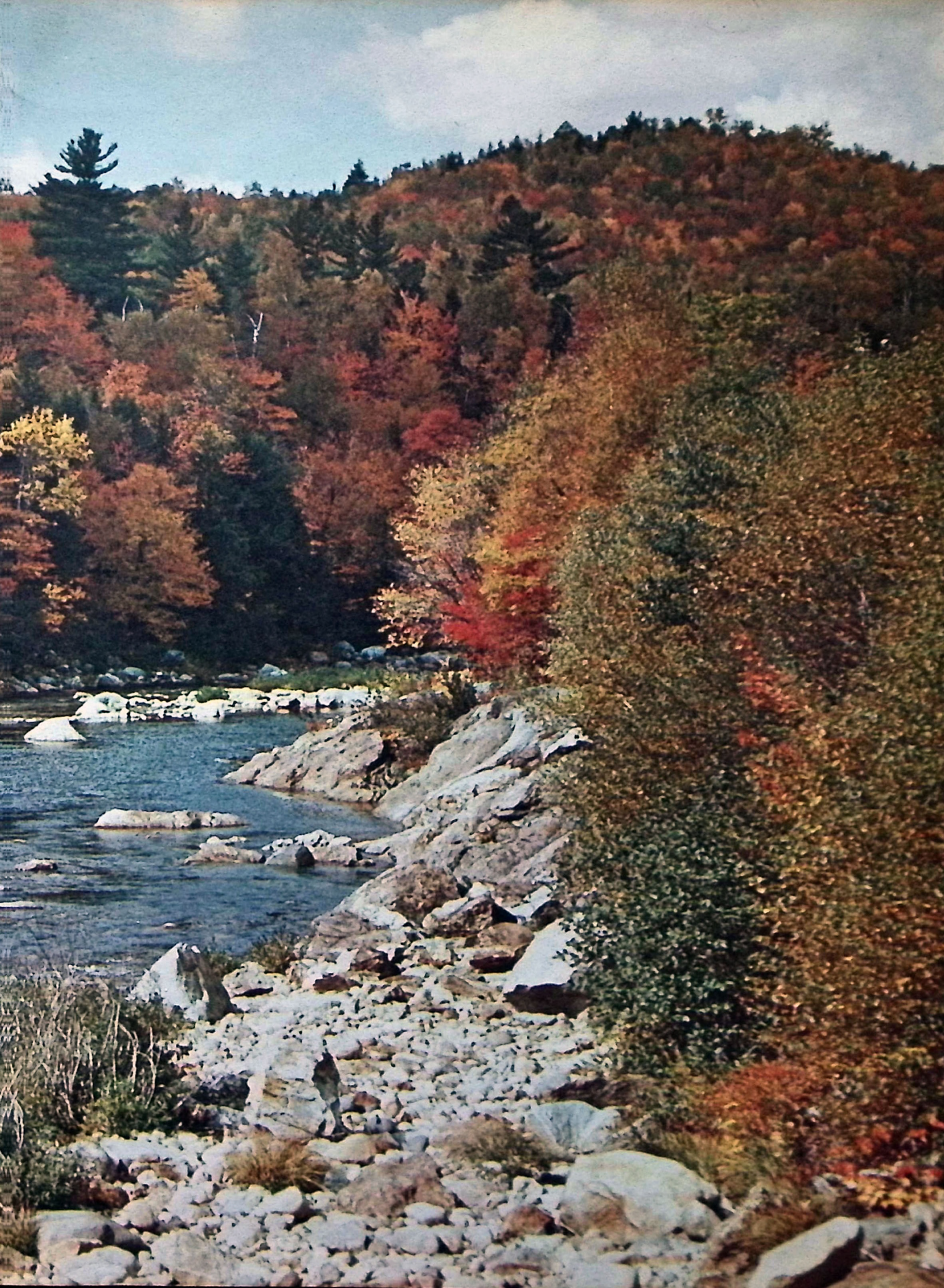

Gathered within these pages are treasured memories of classmates, teachers, activities, and all that has been a part of our school life at Berne Union High School.

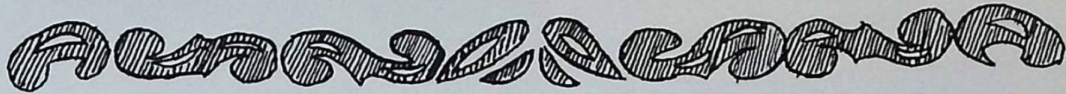

SUGAR GROVE

In the foothills of the Allegheny mountains, 35 miles from Columbus, there is a quiet but important little community upon which thousands of persons unknowingly depend for one of the daily necessities of life.

It is picturesquely--named Sugar Grove in Fairfield County, and is literally the "heart" of much of Ohio and Indiana's gas industry.

From this village of 600 persons extends an arterial network of high pressure lines which pump gas into the Sugar Grove station from Louisiana, Tennessee, Texas, and West Virginia. This gas is needed to supply the great demand for natural gas in Ohio and Indiana.

More than 300 men are employed by the gas industry in and around Sugar Grove.

Sugar Grove, named from a heavy growth of sugar timber, which originally occupied its site, is located on a ridge running parallel with Rush creek and Hocking river. Sugar Grove is 776 feet above sea level and about 40 feet above the natural water level of the streams. It is situated in the southeastern part of Fairfield county and near the southern boundary of Berne township.

The traveler gets his first view of the foothills of the Allegheny mountains as he enters Sugar Grove from the north. These beautiful dome shaped hills, some covered with pine and spruce trees, others with great rock formed cliffs, were formed by a glacial spur which plowed its way through the valley leaving the rocky cliffs standing bare to a perpendicular height of many feet.

At one time the Huron, Wyandot and Delaware Indian tribes roamed over the land where Sugar Grove now stands. An encampment and possibly an Indian village were located on the site.

In 1823 a grist mill was built on the ridge between the two streams--Rush Creek and the Hocking River. This mill is in Sugar Grove and is in use today. Modern machinery has been installed, but for years a waterwheel was its power.

The first house in Sugar Grove was built by Samuel White in 1835 and was located across the street from the present schoolhouse.

By 1836 several towns had sprung up south of Sugar Grove and coal mining had become quite a local industry south of Logan. The inhabitants north of Sugar Grove realized the value of coal and in 1837 succeeded in getting the state to start to build a canal from Lancaster south to Athens. In 1837 the canal was built through to Athens, a distance of 45 miles. This canal was known as the Hocking canal.

The Columbus & Hocking railroad was completed, Columbus to Athens, in 1868. This railroad touched Sugar Grove. Both the railroad and the canal flourished until 1896. In this year the state abandoned the canal in favor of the faster steam line. The canal has since been drained, but the high banks are still visible.

In 1840, the southern part of the town was laid out by Solomon Stukeey. The northern part of the town was laid out by Mrs. Elizabeth Rudolph. The town was incorporated in 1851 with Mr. William Fisher as the first mayor.

The first gas well drilled near Sugar Grove was on the George Pannabecker farm, near the edge of town, in 1896, and for several years supplied Sugar Grove with all the gas used.

There are now three churches in Sugar Grove. The Methodist Episcopal church was organized in 1851, the Lutheran in 1853, the Catholic church was originally located three miles northeast of town. It was moved to Sugar Grove and consolidated with another church west of town. The priest is also chaplain at the Fairfield School for Boys, located three miles west.

Sugar Grove has a fine high school, which is known as Berne Union school. The north section of the beautiful edifice was built in 1915. In 1934 a large addition was added to the south end of the old structure. In 1958, the new Library and 10 classrooms were added. In 1962, construction started on the new building. At this time the gymnasium was enlarged to seat 732 people. Eight new classrooms were added, along with an up-to-date Home Economics department, a new science laboratory, a commercial department, a large study hall, and boy's and girl's locker and shower rooms. The modern auditorium seats 500 people. Eleven school busses are used to handle the transportation of students. Approximately 1000 children are enrolled in the school. The Board of Education employs (Professional) 41 teachers,

(Non-professional) 3 secretaries, 3 custodians, 11 bus drivers.

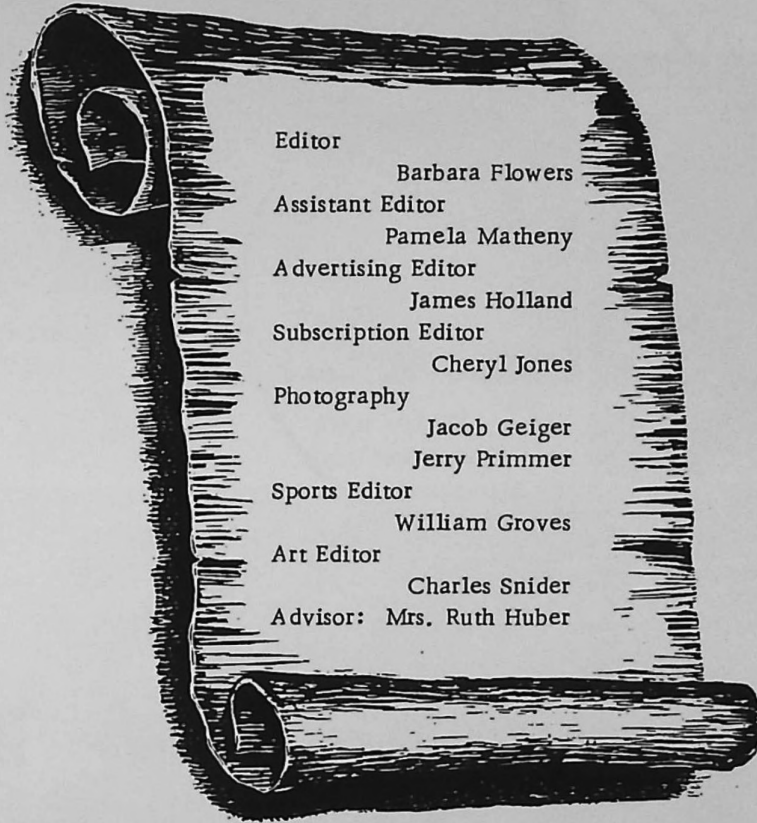

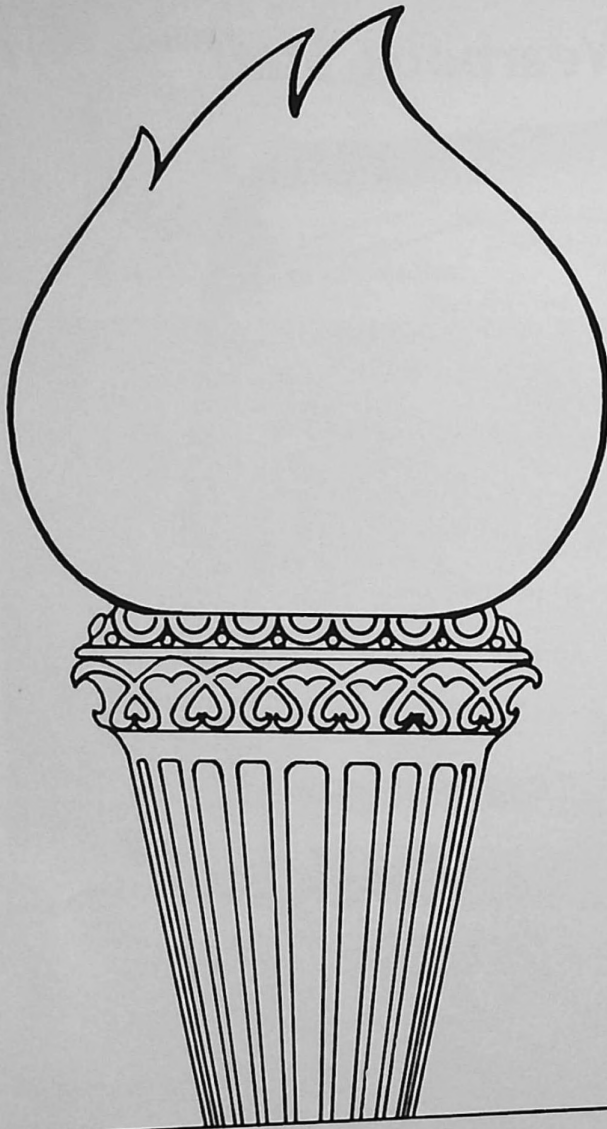
MRS. FLORENCE POWELL

OUR PLEDGE

I Pledge allegiance to the Flag of the
United States of America and to the Republic
For which it stands, one Nation under God,
Indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.

HISTORY OF THE PLEDGE

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States first came into widespread usage and acceptance on Columbus Day, 1892.

In the 77th Congress, its official recognition was granted when Congress codified all rules and customs pertaining to the display and use of our Flag. Then in 1954, the words "under God" were added to the pledge by the Congress.

At this moment in history, when the principles underlying our American way of life are under attack by materialistic Communism, it is well to recall why Congress made that addition.

In the year 1620, the Mayflower Compact, a document which contained the first constitution in America for complete self-government, declared in the opening sentence "In the name of God. Amen."

On July 4, 1776, our Founding Fathers proclaimed our Declaration of Independence which no less than four times refers to the existence of the Creator.

It was during the Presidency of Abraham Lincoln that Congress directed that the inscription "In God we trust" be placed on our coins.

With this in mind, ten years ago several Congressmen and Senators suggested legislation adding the phrase "under God" to our Pledge. Congressman Oliver Bolton, however, was the first to ask that there be no comma separating "one Nation" from "under God" and the Congress adopted his version.

Thus, when the pledge is recited, it should be remembered that nothing stands between our Nation and our God, and no pause should occur at this point in its recitation.
