## **Notice of Availability**

This report is prepared in compliance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (20 U.S.C. §1092(f)) and implementing regulations at 34 CFR 668.46 and 668.49.

This report contains crime statistics for calendar years 2022, 2023, and 2024; fire statistics for on-campus student housing facilities; and required campus security and fire safety policy statements.

The official statistical tables referenced in this report are available on the Albright College website and reflect data submitted to the U.S. Department of Education.

This report is distributed annually to all current students and employees and is available to prospective students and employees upon request.

## **I. Campus Security Authority and Law Enforcement Jurisdiction**

Albright College contracts with Omega Protective Services to provide campus public safety services. Omega personnel serve as the College's Department of Public Safety.

The Department of Public Safety office is located on the first floor of the Center for the Arts on the main campus.

Public Safety officers are security personnel and are not sworn municipal police officers. Criminal matters are referred to the Reading Police Department and Muhlenberg Township Police Department, both of which have jurisdiction over the campus and surrounding areas.

The College maintains working relationships with local law enforcement agencies. All major criminal incidents are reported to appropriate local authorities.

## **II. Reporting Criminal Offenses**

Crimes may be reported to the Department of Public Safety at 610-921-7670. In an emergency, individuals should call 911.

Reports may also be made to Campus Security Authorities (CSAs), including officials with significant responsibility for student and campus activities.

Professional counselors and pastoral counselors acting within the scope of their licensure are exempt from CSA reporting requirements but may encourage voluntary reporting.

Anonymous reporting options are available through the Albright College webpage.

### **III. Timely Warnings**

In accordance with 34 CFR 668.46(e), the College issues Timely Warnings for Clery Act crimes that occur within Clery geography, are reported to Campus Security Authorities or local police, and represent a serious or continuing threat to students or employees.

Timely Warnings are distributed through campus-wide email and the Omnilert (e2Campus) emergency notification system.

### **IV. Emergency Response and Evacuation Procedures**

The College will immediately notify the campus community upon confirmation of a significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to health or safety.

Emergency notifications are distributed via Everbridge 360

The College tests emergency response and evacuation procedures at least annually and documents each test, including date, time, and description of the exercise.

### **V. Crime Statistics**

Clery crime statistics are compiled from Department of Public Safety reports, local law enforcement agencies, and Campus Security Authorities.

Statistics are reported for On Campus, On Campus Student Housing Facilities, Non-Campus Property, and Public Property.

Offense categories include criminal homicide; sex offenses; robbery; aggravated assault; burglary; motor vehicle theft; arson; domestic violence; dating violence; stalking; hate crimes; and arrests and referrals for liquor, drug, and weapons law violations.

The official statistical tables for calendar years 2022, 2023, and 2024 are available on the Albright College Department of Public Safety website and reflect data submitted to the U.S. Department of Education.

### **VI. Daily Crime and Fire Log**

The Department of Public Safety maintains a Daily Crime Log and a Daily Fire Log. Logs are updated within two business days of report and are available for inspection during normal business hours.

## **VII. Security of and Access to Campus Facilities**

Residence halls are secured 24 hours per day and require identification card access.

Public Safety conducts routine patrols of campus buildings and grounds.

## **VIII. Alcohol and Drug Policies**

The College enforces federal law, Pennsylvania law, and institutional policy prohibiting unlawful possession, use, or distribution of alcohol and controlled substances.

Violations may result in institutional disciplinary action and referral to law enforcement.

## **IX. Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking**

Albright College prohibits sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.

The College provides written notification to victims regarding reporting options, supportive measures, counseling and medical services, options for academic or housing changes, and institutional disciplinary procedures.

The College complies with Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and implementing federal regulations (34 CFR Part 106).

The grievance process is prompt, fair, and impartial; uses the preponderance of the evidence standard; presumes the respondent is not responsible; provides equal opportunity for advisors of choice; and provides simultaneous written notification of outcomes and appeal rights.

Supportive measures are available regardless of whether a formal complaint is filed. The Title IX Coordinator's contact information is available on the College website.

## **X. Missing Student Notification Policy**

Each student residing in on-campus housing may register a confidential contact person.

If a student is determined to be missing for 24 hours, the designated confidential contact and appropriate law enforcement agencies will be notified. For students under 18 and not emancipated, a custodial parent or guardian will be notified.

## **XI. Fire Safety Report**

Fire statistics for on-campus student housing facilities for calendar years 2022, 2023, and 2024 are available on the Department of Public Safety website.

Residence halls are equipped with fire alarm systems and evacuation procedures. Fire drills are conducted in accordance with applicable state and local fire codes.

The College provides fire safety education to students residing in campus housing.
