# Career Pathway: Government and Social Sciences

## Authentic Real-life Experiences

Mahwah High School offers a variety of co-curricular opportunities to students to expand their knowledge and understanding outside of the academic classroom. Government and Social Sciences Pathway students will have the opportunity to participate in unique project-based learning opportunities that develop problem solving, technical, and teamwork skills.

### Co-curricular Opportunities

#### Academic Decathlon

The Academic Decathlon® is a team competition wherein students match their intellects with those of students from other schools. Students are tested in ten categories: Art, Economics, Essay, Interview, Language and Literature, Mathematics, Music, Science, Social Science, and Speech.

#### Asian American Awareness Club

If you are interested in advocating for your Asian American peers, learning about and experiencing Asian Culture, or getting involved in fundraising for active change, this club might be perfect for you. This club's goal is to spend meetings planning/hosting fundraisers, learning about different cultures, making posters, talking about current events, and eating snacks.

#### Club of Cultural Appreciation

This club's goal is to create a safe environment where students from different ethnicities and backgrounds can share their experiences, cultures, and traditions with one another.

#### Current Events Club

The Current Events Club provides an open and welcoming environment in which students can share and discuss events that are of interest to them. Topics raised can range from the political and international to celebrity news or science.

#### Girls Learn International

During chapter meetings, students use an extensive curriculum developed by GLI to learn about issues dealing with human rights and girls' education. The GLI curriculum is specifically designed to guide participants in developing critical thinking, problem solving, and advocacy skills essential to effective leadership.

#### Habitat for Humanity

Habitat for Humanity is a global nonprofit housing organization working in local communities across all 50 states in the U.S. and in approximately 70 countries. Habitat's vision is of a world where everyone has a decent place to live. The Habitat for Humanity Club at MHS is a service club that reaches out to the Mahwah community. They raise awareness for the Habitat for Humanity organization by doing service projects. Service projects that we have participated in include shoveling snow for senior citizens, tutoring elementary students, volunteering for the Betsy Ross walkathon and implementing a training program for the Miles for Marcus Run.

#### INTERACT Rotary Club

Interact clubs bring together young people to develop leadership skills while discovering the power of *Service Above Self*. Interact members connect with leaders in the community to take action to make a difference in their school and community, discover new cultures and promote international understanding, and become leaders in their school and community

#### LEO Club

Leo club encourages youths to develop leadership qualities by participating in social service activities. We participate in all sorts of community service projects from soup kitchens to homeless shelters, Special Olympics, and Habitat for Humanity, etc.

#### Model UN
