## Career Pathway: Technical Career and Community Authentic Real-life Experiences

Mahwah High School offers a variety of co-curricular opportunities to students to expand their knowledge and understanding outside of the academic classroom. Technical Career and Community Pathway students will have the opportunity to participate in unique project-based learning opportunities that develop problem solving, technical, and teamwork skills.

### Co-curricular Opportunities

#### **Athletes in Action**

The Athletes in Action contributes to communities by supporting sports charities, while remaining inclusive to all who want to join. In addition, the hope is to spread awareness for various causes and raise money for those who do not have those same opportunities.

#### **Asian American Awareness Club**

If you are interested in advocating for your Asian American peers, learning about and experiencing Asian Culture, or getting involved in fundraising for active change, this club might be perfect for you. This club's goal is to spend meetings planning/hosting fundraisers, learning about different cultures, making posters, talking about current events, and eating snacks.

#### **Automobile Club**

Provides students the opportunity to learn about several topics surrounding cars through interactive activities. In this club, students can gain knowledge about the technology behind them, additional enhancements and safety features of vehicles, and racing as a sport.

#### **Booth - Audio Visual Team**

The Booth is responsible for all sound and lighting needs that take place in the HS auditorium for high school awards and meetings: the Fall Play and Spring Musical and various out-of-district companies. Students gain a hands-on professional knowledge of audio-visual equipment as well as a knowledge of how to assist in running a show.

#### **Chess Club**

Our mission is to empower people through chess one move at a time. Our vision is to enrich the lives of all persons and communities through increasing the play, study, and appreciation of the game of chess.

#### **Club of Cultural Appreciation**

This club's goal is to create a safe environment where students from different ethnicities and backgrounds can share their experiences, cultures, and traditions with one another.

#### **Fellowship Christian Athletes**

FCA focuses on serving local communities around the globe by engaging, equipping, and empowering coaches and athletes to unite, inspire, and change the world through the gospel.

#### **Genders and Sexualities Alliance**

Formerly known as the Gay-Straight Alliance, the GSA is a safe space for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and gender non-conforming teens and their allies. The goals of the GSA are to build community, learn more about LGBTQ+ issues, educate the school community, celebrate diversity, and erase intolerance.

#### **Girls Learn International**

During Chapter meetings, students use an extensive curriculum developed by GLI to learn about issues dealing with human rights and girls' education. The GLI curriculum is specifically designed to guide participants in developing critical thinking, problem solving, and advocacy skills essential to effective leadership.

#### **Habitat for Humanity**

Habitat for Humanity is a global nonprofit housing organization working in local communities across all 50 states in the U.S. and in approximately 70 countries. Habitat's vision is of a world where everyone has a decent

place to live. The Habitat for Humanity Club at MHS is a service club that reaches out to the Mahwah community. They raise awareness for the Habitat for Humanity organization by doing service projects, which include shoveling snow for senior citizens, tutoring elementary students, volunteering for the Betsy Ross walkathon, and implementing a training program for the Miles for Marcus Run.

### **Helping Our Peers Everyday (HOPE)**

HOPE plans activities to promote awareness; holds assembly programs; creates bulletin boards; visits elementary schools; has field trips; and hosts guest speakers to promote awareness to prevent drunk driving, teen pregnancy, and AIDS. We support healthy lifestyles and drug free interests. HOPE supports the violence and tobacco efforts of other clubs.

### **INTERACT Rotary Club**

Interact clubs bring together young people to develop leadership skills while discovering the power of *Service Above Self*. Interact members connect with leaders in the community to take action to make a difference in their school and community, discover new cultures and promote international understanding, and become leaders in their school and community

### **LEO Club**

Leo club encourages youths to develop leadership qualities by participating in social service activities. We participate in all sorts of community service projects from soup kitchens to homeless shelters, Special Olympics, and Habitat for Humanity, etc.

### **Reaching Everyone by Exposing Lies (REBEL)**

The REBEL Club (Reaching Everyone by Exposing Lies) is an anti-tobacco, peer educational club whose purpose is to teach teenagers about the lies and deception the big tobacco companies and vaping industry want them to believe.
