**Agenda Item Caption:** Consideration and Possible Approval of Firms for Professional Services to Complete Miscellaneous Future Project Designs and Marketing Services

**Purpose of Agenda Item:**

**Administrative Recommendation:** Move to approve architectural firms for professional services to provide future project design services, as presented.

**Background Information:** Alongside the district’s recommendation for firms to conduct facility assessments and master planning services, PfISD is positioning itself to expand its pool of architectural firms for future projects. The district presently maintains five firms for projects and after a comprehensive RFQ process, staff are recommending expanding the pool to seven firms.

To ensure the most qualified expertise for this initiative, the District conducted a formal Request for Qualifications (RFQ) that yielded 22 submissions from highly qualified vendors. Following a rigorous evaluation and ranking process, the top 12 firms were selected for initial interviews.

Staff evaluated, ranked, and interviewed responding firms regarding their qualifications and ability to provide design services for individual projects that may be included in a future bond package. Of the 22 responding firms, district staff recommends the following seven firms to provide architectural professional services: (1) Corgan, (2) DLR Group, (3) PBK, (4) Perkins & Will, (5) Reliance Architecture, (6) VLK Architects, and (7) WRA Architects. An eighth firm, (8) Caelen Communications will be retained to support Bond marketing efforts.

All recommended firms have an excellent history of providing K-12 design-related services and come highly recommended. Awarding seven firms will help ensure the availability of high-quality services when needed.
