WHO SHOULD APPLY?

CRITERIA:

- ◆ High school senior
- ◆ Grade point range 78-89.9 only.
- ◆ Strong school effort.
- ◆ Curious and receptive to learn.
- ◆ Resilience
- ◆ Hardworking
- ◆ Conscientious
- ◆ Strong character: honesty, integrity, trustworthy and reliable.
- ◆ Kind to others and shows respect to all people in the school community.
- ◆ Family oriented (personal and/or school).
- ◆ Non-sport student or at least non-school sport student.
- ◆ Demonstrated interest/passion: For example: fashion, arts, automotive, computers, farming.

REQUIREMENTS:

Minimum of 250 to maximum of 400 word response, which is basically two paragraphs. First paragraph answers: Who you are as a person and as a student and what life passions do you have, possibly include how you became interested in this area. Second paragraph should contain post-high school education plans that you will be pursuing. Please include intended major and why. Looking for honest and authentic responses.

SELECTION COMMITTEE:

Please have one guidance counselor, one teacher and one school staff (office, cafeteria, custodial staff) select the winner out of the possible candidates.
