We are celebrating National School Counseling Week, and it is all about how we "Amplify Student Success." We want to "turn up the volume" on all the amazing things our students are achieving!

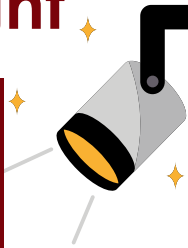
My role is to listen to your child's needs and turn up the volume on their potential through social, emotional, and academic support.
