Spring Application / Award Timeline

For the 2026-2027 Academic Year in College

1. Application available January 15, 2026.
2. Application Deadline March 15, 2026.
3. Applications reviewed for eligibility.
4. All applicants notified of their status.
5. Finalists provide supplemental information.
6. All finalists notified of their status.
7. Scholarships awarded by May 1, 2026.

Eligibility Criteria

1. Must attend a high school located in the U.S.
2. Eligible high schools include public, private, charter, magnet, and STEM schools.
3. Students can apply regardless of nationality or citizenship.
4. Must have achieved a 3.50 CGPA on a 4.0 Scale.
5. Must enroll in a four-year college or university the fall semester following graduation.
6. Must maintain a four year or less graduation schedule.
7. Must work 240 hours from January 1, 2026 to September 1, 2026. Work must be regularly scheduled non-family employment performed under supervision for compensation.
8. Parents 2024 Adjusted Gross Household Income must not have exceeded \$125,000.
9. U.S. Citizens must provide the first two pages of their FAFSA Summary showing the SAI.
10. Non U.S. Citizens must provide Proof of non-U.S. Citizenship. Foreign Passport or Green Card.
11. Must apply for Federal and State grants if eligible.

Hagan Scholarship

2026-2027 Academic Year

The Hagan Scholarship is a nationwide need-based merit scholarship for goal driven students in the high school graduating class. The scholarship provides recipients with the opportunity to graduate college debt-free. Parents 2024 Adjusted Gross Household Income must not have exceeded \$125,000.

The scholarship provides up to \$7,500 each semester for up to eight consecutive semesters. Hagan Scholars have attended 769 colleges and universities located in 50 states and the District of Columbia.

Recipients who graduate college while in the Hagan Scholarship Program can apply for a Hagan Graduate Scholarship.

Free Workshops, Free Brokerage Accounts, and Free Study Abroad provide recipients with a practical understanding of important life skills not typically covered in the school curriculum.
