One of my favorite hobbies is to try to make people laugh, and I'm still working on that... Lol!



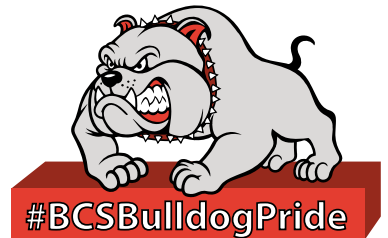
Jason Arnold

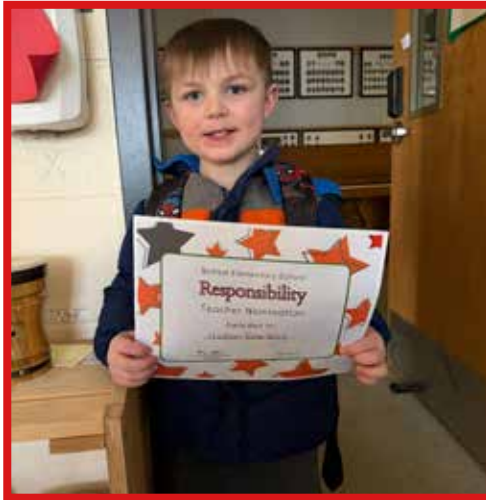


Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

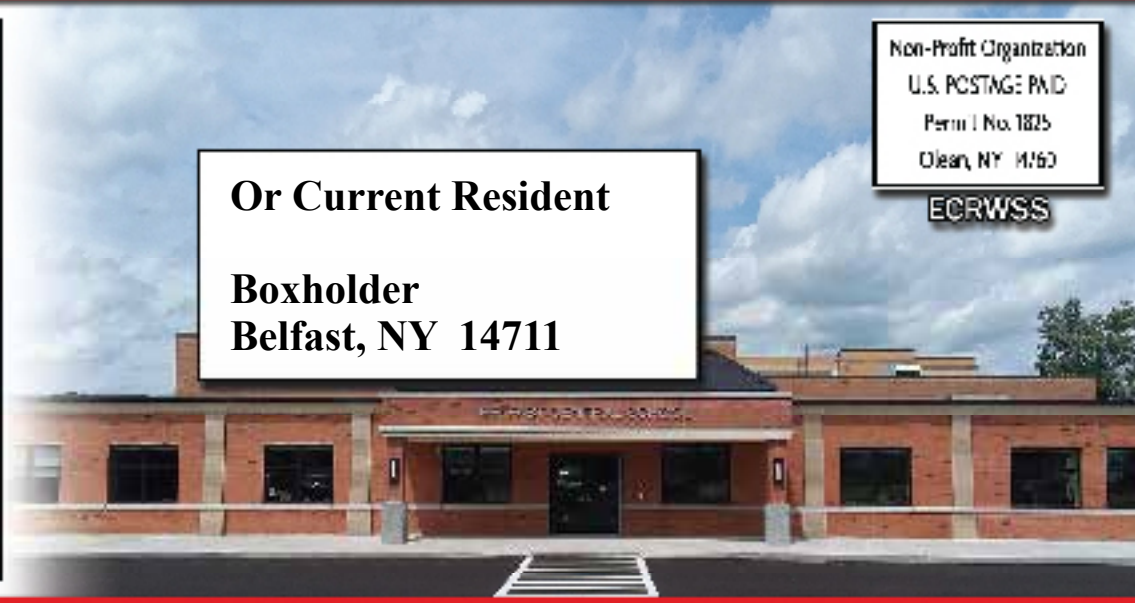
