## GUIDELINES FOR ENTERING FRESHMEN For Course Registration for the 2026-2027 School Year

On Registration Day, Saturday, March 28, 2026, entering freshmen will register for their courses. At this time, counselors and administrators will be available to answer questions. The counselors are eager to assist students in the registration process; however, it is ultimately the students' responsibility to check the most recent [Curriculum and Planning Guide](#) to ensure that all graduation requirements are met when choosing classes (NOTE: Students should continue to reference the Curriculum and Planning Guide throughout their high school years to reference graduation requirements and course prerequisites. In addition, it is the students' responsibility to verify admission standards at the universities to which they choose to apply).

### REGISTRATION GUIDELINES:

- 1) **REGISTRATION FORMS:** Each student should complete a registration form unique to their ENTERING grade level. To ensure priority registration, students should complete and submit the registration form on Registration Day, Saturday, March 28, 2026.
- 2) **ONLINE (OLO) COURSES:**
  - a. Any course number with “OLO” behind it indicates that it is an online course.
  - b. Online advisors are available on Registration Day to answer questions regarding online courses. Following Registration Day, students will need to submit an [OLO Course Registration Form](#) to enroll in an online course.
  - c. Students who wish to be considered a [Blended student](#) must complete a separate [Blended Student Course Registration Form](#) and meet blended student prerequisite requirements. For more information speak with an OLO Advisor on Registration Day.
- 3) **COURSES WITH INTERVIEW/AUDITION/APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:**
  - a. Any course listed with a gray shaded box indicates that it requires an interview, audition, or application before Freshman Registration Day.
- 4) **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS (Refer to Curriculum and Planning Guide, 2026-2027):**
  - a. Complete a **minimum of 27 units** (including 1.0 units of VPA, 1.5 units of P.E. and 0.5 units of Health).
  - b. All freshmen must be enrolled in a **minimum** of seven (7) units.
- 5) **ADDITIONAL COURSES**
  - a. Included in full tuition is up to nine (9) courses per semester. Students wishing to take additional courses are assessed a fee of \$515 per one-half unit.
- 6) **SCHEDULES**
  - a. Schedules will be emailed to students in late June. From that time, students have a two-week window to submit schedule change requests.
  - b. The school works with each family to get the best possible schedule for students. Once the scheduling process has been completed, schedule changes after that time are assessed a \$50 fee per schedule change request (not course) for student-initiated schedule changes, including change requests submitted during the summer two-week window. There is a one-time grace period with regard to the schedule change fee for new incoming students and their families.
  - c. Students who decide to switch from an on-campus class to an online class must make this request prior to the start date of the new online session.
  - d. Students who choose to withdraw from an on-ground class or a 16-week online class during the first three weeks of the semester may do so without penalty. During weeks four through ten in a semester, the withdrawal will be designated as “W” on the student’s transcript; this grade will not affect GPA or eligibility. After week ten, the grade will be an “F” on the student’s transcript and will affect GPA and eligibility. Any class withdrawal incurs a \$50 fee.
  - e. Students who choose to withdraw from an 8-week online class during the first week of the semester may do so without penalty. During weeks two through five in a semester, the withdrawal will be designated as “W” on the student’s transcript; this grade will not affect GPA or eligibility. After week five, the grade will be an “F” on the student’s transcript and will affect GPA and eligibility. Any class withdrawal incurs a \$50 fee.
