BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

February 24, 2026

General Business, Board Reports

- Board Members shared information regarding site visits, committee reports and other community related activities.

Superintendent's Report

- Above & Beyond Recognition
 - The Board and Superintendent Hays recognized Andrea Lopez, and Magnus Carlon for going *Above and Beyond* for the students, staff and families of the Adult Education Program and Chaparral Middle School Band, respectively.
- MUSD Update
 - Dr. Hays reported on the following: congratulated MHS boys & girls soccer and boys & girls basketball teams for advancing to CIF playoffs; recent CIF wrestling championships held at MHS; MHS wrestler Noah Huss win at the CIF heavyweight wrestling class and will now compete in the state championship; MHS student Ethan Reynolds success in field hockey; MHS student River Hicks represented Moorpark as a member of the California All-State High School Symphonic Band and earned third chair on French horn; MHS student Jace Mangers was selected for the All-Southern High School Symphonic Band to play the trumpet; CMS student Hannah Kneff earned a spot in the VC honor band; the District's spring series will take place March 11 & 12; and lastly, MUSD is the recipient of the California Green Ribbon Award for the silver level and the only district in the county and one of 13 in the state.
- 2025-2026 MUSD LCAP Survey Results
 - Dr. Melissa LaBelle and Dr. Rosalinda Silva reviewed the 2025-2026 LCAP survey results that included: the top three ranked priorities for all parents, students and staff; parent engagement; and the climate survey responses from parents, staff and students.

- The Board reviewed the VCOE letter accepting the District's positive certification for the 2025-2026 first period interim report.

- The Board unanimously approved:
 - Classified employment report
 - Certificated employment report
 - Teacher Assignment Authorizations for the 2025-2026 school year
 - Payment of stipends
- A public hearing was held to sunshine the District's initial proposals to reopen negotiations with CSEA for the 25-26 school year, including: Article I: Preamble; Article IX: Leaves; Article XIII: Discipline; Article XV: Salary Schedules; Article XVII: Health, Vision and Dental Benefits; and Article XXI: Term. Following the public hearing, the Board unanimously approved the District's initial proposals for reopeners with the CSEA as noted.

- The Board unanimously approved the following proposed new classified job descriptions for the Summer Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP): Educational Technician II and Educational Technician III.
- The Board unanimously approved the following proposed new certificated job descriptions for the Summer Expanded Learning Opportunities Program: ELOP Teacher; ELOP Program Enrichment Coordinator; ELOP Principal; and ELOP School Counselor.
- The Board unanimously approved the proposed revisions to BP 4026(a), Rates of Pay for Non-Represented Employees.

Instructional Services

- Dr. Melissa LaBelle, Juan Pablo Herrera and Dr. Rosalinda Silva reviewed a PowerPoint presentation for the District's 2025-2026 Mid-Year LCAP Annual Update.
- The 2024-2025 School Accountability Report Cards (SARCs) are completed and were posted on the District's website on February 1, 2026 as mandated by law. Additionally, and in accordance with Education Code, the District notified parents that the SARCs were available for review. This item is for public reporting purposes only, no Board action is required.

 - Aquatic Center Feasibility Study Proposal from Ruhnau Clarke, with a total, not to exceed cost of \$40,000
