REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENT ENROLLMENT

What are the requirements to enroll a child into school?

Generally, enrollment is facilitated by the individual school data manager and/or the school counselors. Beyond the school level, the processes of enrollment and student assignment are governed by the Associate Superintendent's Office. As a district, we have navigated to online enrollment; Parents can access the online enrollment portal at <https://lenoirncc.scribborder.com/>. Paper enrollment packets are available upon request at each school site.

Documents Required for Enrollment:

- A certified copy of your child's birth certificate or other acceptable proof of birth.
- Proof of guardianship (such as a custody order, pre-adoptive orders, or simply having your name listed on the birth certificate as a parent)
- Proof of address such as:
 - Current water or electric bill in parent's name that is no more than 30 days old,
 - Affidavit of residency notarized by the person with whom you are residing. This person will need to provide proof of address.
- A photo ID of the parent or legal custodian
- Your child's immunization record
- Any custody documents

TEACHER LICENSURE INFORMATION

What are the qualifications of my child's teacher(s)?

Parents may look up your child's teacher's licensure status on the NCDPI Online Licensure System website.

The licensure look up webpage does not include current employment information. Parents may need additional information (i.e., middle name or license number) to identify the teacher accurately. Substitute teachers (either short or long term) may not hold a NC teaching license.

STANDARD COURSE OF STUDY

What is my child learning at school? How can a parent review these materials?

In North Carolina, all schools use the same Standard Course of Study, determined by the State Board of Education. These Standards are the knowledge and skills students should understand by the end of each grade or course.

Each district must also have a Literacy Intervention Plan (LIP). The plan must include reading camps as an extension of what occurs during the school year.

STUDENT ACADEMIC REPORTING

How will a parent learn about their child's progress in a class or school?

Lenoir County Public Schools shares progress of students through a variety of ways, including quarterly report cards, progress reports, and assignment/ test feedback. Feedback on conduct is also included.

Lenoir County Public Schools students receive progress reports and report cards following the district's approved Traditional Calendar and Early College Calendar. Parents are provided a copy of the district calendar at the beginning of each school year. Additionally, the district's approved Traditional Calendar and Early College Calendar is available on the [LCPS district website](#).

Each LCPS school informs parents of all student testing and accountability information via ConnectEd voice messages, social media posts, and drafted letters sent home with students. This information can also be found on our [LCPS District website](#).

State Assessments:

Individual student reports for end-of-grade/course tests and other state assessments (English language proficiency assessment) are accessible in the parent portal of the NC-SIS (PowerSchool). Every school provides each parent with directions on how to set up access to their students' PowerSchool portal to check grades at all times. At any time, a parent or legal guardian may contact the school for assistance with PowerSchool access for their student(s). **The State is migrating to Infinite Campus as the new Student Information System (SIS) in the next year. Information regarding this transition will be communicated with all stakeholders.**

In North Carolina, all students take end-of-grade assessments for reading and math in grades 3-8. Students take end-of-grade science assessments in grades 5 and 8. In high school, students take end-of-course assessments in English II, Biology, NC Math 1, and NC Math 3.

Students in Lenoir County Public Schools have several options for pursuing their interests and skills at their academic level. Career and Technical Education (CTE):

NC has made a significant investment in developing students and programs to meet the needs of the future workforce. Through Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs, Public Schools offer opportunities for students to develop career awareness in 5th grade, explore careers in grades 6-8, and experience leadership, career development, and career-aligned content in grades 9-12.

In Lenoir County Public Schools students in middle and high school are able to explore many career pathways. Students grades 6-8 are able to explore career pathways using the Major Clarity Online Career Exploration Tool activities, and offer courses in Agricultural Education and STEM Education career pathways. RIGOROUS ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

CIHS/Early College:

Lenoir County Public Schools also partners with Lenoir Community College to offer the Lenoir County Early College High School. Lenoir County Early College High School is a choice school for students and families. It is an opportunity for the students to earn both a high school diploma and an associate's degree and/or CTE credentials at the same time. Students can stay for an additional fifth year to complete their credentials before graduating from high school.

Advanced Placement (AP) Courses:

Advanced Placement (AP) is a program developed by the College Board to offer college-level curricula and examinations to high school students.

In NC, 40 Advanced Placement courses are offered in public high schools. Lenoir County Public Schools offers 19 Advanced Placement courses in the following schools:

- Kinston High School
- North Lenoir High School
- South Lenoir High School

Several AP courses satisfy graduation requirements for NC students as outlined in State Board policy.

AP exams are free for NC public high school students enrolled in these courses. If a student registers for an exam late, the student will be assessed a \$20 fee, payable by the student.

Colleges and universities may likely offer college credit for these courses if your child scores a 3 or above on the exam. All of the colleges in the UNC System offer credit.

RIGOROUS ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

In our district, there are the following programs available that are more rigorous and challenging than the standard content for students:

Academically and/or Intellectually Gifted (AIG):

In NC, school districts must identify and serve academically or intellectually gifted (AIG) K-12 students. These are students who are performing, or have the potential of performing, at high levels of accomplishment in intellectual and/or specific academic areas, such as reading and/or math when compared with other students of their age, or in their grade level, experience, or environment.

The [Lenoir County Public Schools Local AIG Plan](#) outlines specific opportunities for differentiated, rigorous instruction and accelerated programs. Our district has developed an [AIG Introductory Video](#) and [Timeline](#) to help parents better understand the AIG program. This describes how students will be identified and served across grades K-12.

In Lenoir County Public Schools, students are often provided the following services:

- Differentiated curriculum and instruction with flexible student groups
- Accelerated opportunities (subject and/or grade acceleration, credit by demonstrated mastery (CDM), AP courses, dual enrollment courses)
- Enrichment experiences, which may be during the school day or beyond, and may be within the regular calendar year or may include summer opportunities
- Other opportunities for extension of content standards

Services for AIG students may be provided by AIG personnel or within the regular classroom by teachers trained to meet the needs of gifted students.

Honors Level Courses:

In Lenoir County Public Schools, students have access to a variety of honors level courses in high school. These courses are available in the course catalog located on the [LCPS District website](#).

Honors level courses typically have a faster pace than standard level courses and offer additional rigor, complexity and creativity than standard level courses.

Career and College Promise (CCP):

Lenoir County Public Schools partners with Lenoir Community College to offer dual enrollment opportunities through the CCP program. If your high school student qualifies, students may earn high school credits by completing community college coursework.

Accelerated Access

NCVPS:

[North Carolina Virtual Public School \(NCVPS\)](#) is NC's state supplemental program and leader in online education, providing inclusive learning opportunities for students across the state. Founded in 2007, with a strong commitment to ensuring quality education for all students, regardless of location, NCVPS has over 16 years of experience serving diverse learners.

Students may enroll in NCVPS courses for a variety of reasons. Work with your school counselor if you are interested in taking NCVPS courses.

Lenoir County Public Schools offers the following courses through NCVPS:

1. Earth Science for High School Credit for Middle School Students
2. World History for High School Credit for Middle School Students
3. AP European History
4. AP Human Geography
5. Chemistry Honors for Early College students in the summer

Credit by Demonstrated Mastery (CDM):

Lenoir County Public Schools offers opportunities for students to earn credit for a high school course without enrolling in the course. All high school courses, with a few exceptions as noted by the state, are available for students to try to CDM. There are two phases of assessments that a student must go through to earn credit for the course.

Governor's School:

Each summer, NC Governor's School offers a unique opportunity for high-achieving rising juniors and seniors to learn with their peers from across the state in an 4-week residential program at two college campus sites.

SCHOOL ENROLLMENT OPTIONS FOR STUDENTS

What school enrollment options exist for students?

Students enrolled in Lenoir County Public Schools are assigned to certain schools based on a local assignment plan and geographic boundaries. There are a number of enrollment options that exist outside of the standard student assignment plan. Many of the options below have application deadlines and other specific eligibility requirements.

Out-of-County: Students who live outside of Lenoir County may request to attend a LCPS school by submitting a Student Release request from the school district in the county in which they reside for approval. Once a student has received an approved Student Release, parents should complete the online LCPS In-District Transfer form. Families will be notified via letter by mail of the status of the request.

Out-of-District: Students who reside in Lenoir County and would like to attend a LCPS school outside of their assigned school/ attendance zone should complete the online LCPS In-District Transfer form to request to their LCPS school of preference. Families will be notified via letter by mail of the status of the request.

Dual-Enrollment: High school students who wish to take community college courses free of charge can apply through their high school counselor and the LCC liaison assigned to their high school.

Early College: Lenoir County Early College High School is located on the campus of LCC. This option is a specialized high school opportunity students meeting the necessary requirements for application. Students and families interested in the Early College will be invited to attend an informational meeting at the end of the student's 8th grade year. Students and families will learn about application requirements and interview process.

Charter Schools: Charter schools are public schools of choice that are authorized by the State Board of Education and operated by independent non-profit boards of directors. State and local tax dollars are the primary funding sources for charter schools, which have open enrollment and cannot discriminate in admissions, associate with any religion or religious group, or charge-tuition. Charter schools operate with freedom from many of the regulations that govern district schools, but charter schools are held accountable through the State assessment and accountability system. STUDENT HEALTH & SUPPORT SERVICES

What are some resources to support my child's health and wellbeing?

In Lenoir County Public School, student health is extremely important to fostering a productive and safe learning environment. We work with students, parents, healthcare professionals and the community to keep our students healthy and ready to learn. For more information, please visit our [LCPS district website](#).

Health Conditions:

It is the parent's responsibility to inform the child's teacher or principal if there are medical conditions that require special measures such as dietary or activity restrictions at school for the student. School Nurses are available for health consultation, but are not present at the school on a daily basis.

Immunizations:

North Carolina law requires all children in the state to receive certain immunizations. Records are checked when children enter school or child care. For more information about immunizations, visit the [LCPS district website](#).

Health Assessments:

North Carolina State Law requires that every child entering public schools in N.C. for the first time receive a health assessment. The assessment must occur within 12 months prior to entering school. The medical provider, parent or guardian is encouraged to provide a completed health assessment transmittal form to school on or before the child's first day of attendance. For questions or concerns about this information, please contact the school nurse at your school or your school's administration.

School Nurses:

The School Nurse Program is made up of a dedicated group of school nurses who make it possible for students with health conditions to attend school safely. These professionals are Registered Nurses and have multiple school assignments serving all grade levels. Coordination of health care services is provided to promote healthy lifestyles and behaviors, disease and injury prevention education. They assist with evaluation of specific medical concerns affecting student attendance and achievement. Nurses are instrumental in linking students to health care providers and assisting with coordinating care of children with special health care needs and medication management issues. They develop Individual Health Care Plans and Emergency Action Plans for students in schools with chronic health conditions. STUDENT HEALTH & SUPPORT SERVICES

In-School Dental Care through Kinston Community Health Center:

Working with the professional staff at Kinston Community Health Center, LCPS facilitates affordable, in-school dental care for elementary and middle school students who do not have a regular dentist. The program is a continuation of services initiated by Kinston Community Health Center in 2020 with grant support from The Duke Endowment.

An estimated 70 percent of the district's students do not receive regular dental care or know enough about oral hygiene. By bringing its services to the schools, the KCHC Dental Team works with LCPS to overcome issues of access at the heart of dental problems for many students. The in-school dental screenings are designed to assess a student's oral health and identify and fix problems, either during the school visit or a follow-up appointment. Services include a dental exam and diagnosis, dental cleaning, fluoride treatments and oral hygiene instructions, as well as dental X-rays and dental sealants if needed.

These in-school dental services are provided with the full knowledge and permission of the student's parents/caretaker. To agree to allow your student to participate in this in-school dental program, please complete this [online registration form](#).

Allergies:

Allergic reactions have the potential to negatively impact students in the learning environment. Parents of a student with a life-threatening allergy must provide the school with documentation from a licensed healthcare provider. This information should include the specific allergy and medical requirements needed for the student. LCPS takes seriously its responsibility to take reasonable steps to protect the safety of its students. Staff will work in partnership with the students and parents to develop emergency medical plans. The goal is to increase awareness & communication, prevent possible exposure to identified allergens and create an emergency procedure for allergic reactions.

Medications:

Students may receive or self-administer medication at school when medication is medically necessary for health or learning and must be taken during the school day. Medication must be prescribed by a licensed physician. Alternative medications, such as herbal or homeopathic medications that are not tested by the US Food and Drug Administration for safety or effectiveness, lack safety information and therefore cannot be administered or taken at school.

STUDENT HEALTH & SUPPORT SERVICES

Self-administration of Emergency Medications

At all school levels, students may self-medicate with emergency prescription medication if they have permission to do so documented on their Parent and Physician Order for Medication form.

State law allows students who have met certain conditions to carry and self-administer emergency medication during the school day and at all school-sponsored after-school events, including transportation to and from events, for asthma and severe, life-threatening allergies (anaphylaxis). This does include asthma inhalers and injectable epinephrine.

The parent or guardian must provide the school with a completed Parent and Physician Order for Medication form. The Medication Permission form is [here](#).

The student must be observed and certified by the School Nurse to be able to self-administer medications.

Controlled Substances

Controlled substances may be administered in the school setting with a completed medication form. Controlled substances may be self-administered and self-carried only in Middle School or High School. Medication should be in a container dispensed by a pharmacy that includes the student's name, name of medication, date prescription was filled and directions clearly marked. Students that self-carry should carry no more than a daily dose at any time.

Screenings:

The following screenings are provided to students at certain grade levels or schools. Students, in any grade, with evidence of problems related to hearing, vision, dental, communicable disease or related academics will be screened, or rescreened, upon request.

Dental

All kindergarten students receive a dental screening by a dental hygienist.

Hearing

All students in Kindergarten receive a hearing screening by trained school staff, regardless of Kindergarten Health Assessment hearing screening results. Requested hearing screenings are also completed by trained school staff. School audiologists oversee and provide follow-up for all failed hearing screenings.

STUDENT HEALTH & SUPPORT SERVICES

Vision

Vision is screened by trained school staff or trained volunteers on all students in grades 1, 3 and 5. Vision screening is provided for Kindergartners if it is not documented on the Kindergarten Health Assessment. Screening is provided for students in other grade levels upon request by school staff. The school nurse is contacted if screening or follow-up assistance is needed.

Communicable Diseases

School personnel who observe symptoms of a possible communicable disease should contact the student's parent or guardian. School staff may consult with the school nurse regarding a suspected communicable condition. Follow-up is provided as needed.

Head Lice:

Head lice are tiny, wingless insects spending their entire life on the human scalp and feeding exclusively on human blood. Once on the scalp, they reproduce quickly, laying eggs (nits) and causing severe itching. Policy and research from the Harvard School of Epidemiology, the American Academy of Pediatrics and the National Association of School Nurses all state there is no value to excluding children from school for nits only. Children will only be sent home if live lice are observed.

Prevention

Please check your child's scalp often for nits and live lice. Instruct family members not to share combs, brushes, hats and other personal items. Children may come back to school after being treated for lice. Only nits that are within 1/4" from the scalp must be removed.

Suicide Prevention:

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death for youth 15-24 years of age and the 3rd leading cause for 10-14 year olds in the United States. Suicide is tragic and it has a lingering effect on a community. All of us have a role in trying to protect our students.

Trained school staff work daily to prevent suicide by identifying and assisting students who show warning signs or risk factors, which can include depression, mental health concerns, or thoughts of suicide. LCPS professionals screen students, notify parents/guardians and connect them with community services when appropriate to address their needs. Suicide is never the solution to a student's problems.

STUDENT HEALTH & SUPPORT SERVICES

National mental health experts have created the following list of

Youth Suicide Warning Signs:

- Talking about or making plans for suicide
- Expressing hopelessness about the future
- Displaying severe/overwhelming emotional pain or distress
- Showing worrisome behavioral cues or marked changes in behavior, particularly in the presence of the warning signs above.
- Withdrawal from or changing in social connections/situations
- Changes in sleep (increased or decreased)
- Anger or hostility that seems out of character or out of context
- Recent increased agitation or irritability

If you notice any of these warning signs in anyone, you can help!

- Ask if they are ok or if they are having thoughts of suicide
- Express your concern about what you are observing in their behavior
- Listen attentively and non-judgmentally
- Reflect what they share and let them know they have been heard
- Tell them they are not alone and don't leave them alone
- Let them know there are treatments available that can help
- If you are or they are concerned, guide them to additional professional help
- Don't think it can't happen to you. Studies show that more than one in 10 high school students have attempted suicide. Don't try to fix the problem on your own. Get expert help through a teacher, a counselor, or a medical or mental health professional. Please contact your school and ask for assistance. If your needs are immediate, call 911.

STUDENT HEALTH & SUPPORT SERVICES

What services are available to support student academic and/or behavior needs?

Every LCPS school has a Multi-Tiered System of Supports Team (MTSS Team) that meets, at least monthly, to identify the specific needs and support opportunities for students who are performing below grade level. Parents are encouraged to participate in these meetings if their child has been identified as not performing at grade level. The three traditional high schools have college advisors who assist students with their college goals. At each school there is at least one school counselor available to students. For more information about academic support for students at each school, please contact the school where your child is enrolled.

Tutoring:

[NCVPS EdVantage Tutoring](#) offers virtual statewide wraparound support to middle and high school students in NC public schools. Tutoring is available in Math, Science and ELA, and is offered via a personalized partnership with district/school leadership to best meet the needs of selected students each semester.

PARENT & FAMILY INVOLVEMENT

What opportunities are available for parents to participate in school?

Each Lenoir County Public School has a Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) or a Parent Teacher Association (PTA). Many LCPS middle and high schools also have an Athletic Booster Club and Band Booster Club for parents and community members to join to assist in fundraising and support for athletic and/or band activities.

Each Lenoir County Public School also has a student Science Olympiad Team that welcomes family and community volunteers and support as the students prepare all year for the local, regional, and state science olympiad competitions.

Each school in the district hosts a quarterly Parent/ Family/Community Engagement Night. This gives families the opportunity to visit their child(s) school(s), meet with faculty and administration, while participating in meaningful conversation and activities with their child(ren). Lenoir County Public Schools has 16 Title I schools that have mandated Parent Nights. Families and Community members are encouraged to regularly check the [LCSP District website](#), as well as the individual school websites and social media pages for updates.

Parents, guardians and community members interested in volunteering at a school are required to complete a background check online on our [LCPS District website](#). For those who would like to volunteer at your child's school, we encourage you to contact the school's administration for opportunities. All volunteers that will be working with students are required to have completed a background check prior to beginning volunteer services.

How can I help my child learn and make progress?

Engaging with your child about school and what they are learning is pivotal to their learning process:

- Ask questions daily about your child's school day.
- Inquire about topics and assignments they are learning.
- Connect with teachers to understand your child's progress.
- Ask the teachers how you can help your child learn.
- Attend different events at your child's school to stay connected and learn how to support them.

Each school in the Lenoir County Public Schools district has created a School Improvement Plan that outlines intentional efforts to increase the school's effectiveness. One of the areas outlined is the school's *Parent Involvement Plan*.

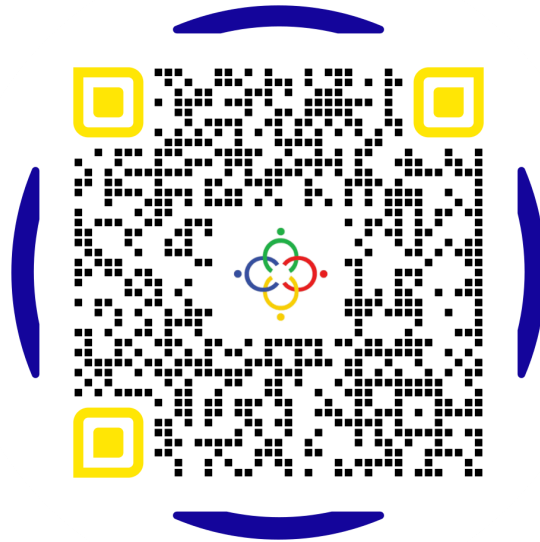
