ENROLLMENT AND GROWTH

Mansfield Independent School District is a destination school district located in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex. The district encompasses more than 94 square miles, serving students in the city of Mansfield as well as sections of Arlington, Grand Prairie, Burleson, Fort Worth, Venus, Alvarado, and Kennedale.

Mansfield ISD serves more than 35,000 students and counting. The district has an early learners academy, 24 elementary schools (grades K-4), seven intermediate schools (grades 5-6), seven middle schools (grades 7-8), five traditional high schools, two stand-alone STEM academies, a career and technology academy, two early college high schools, and an alternative education center.

We are proud of our diverse and multicultural population. There are more than 105 languages other than English spoken in the district. Even though MISD is a large school district, it still maintains its hometown feel with different events to bring the community together.

Mansfield ISD launched the Vision 2030 Student Scorecard using research-based metrics to more appropriately and holistically assess whether students are college ready, career ready and life ready. The COLLEGE-readiness indicators enable students to track, measure and visualize their individualized progress in academics, standardized testing and additional college criteria for post-secondary success.

The CAREER-readiness indicators are behavioral and experiential benchmarks designed to help students identify career-specific learning experiences. Progress toward foundational skills, communication skills and preparation skills will ensure that students are prepared to become productive citizens.



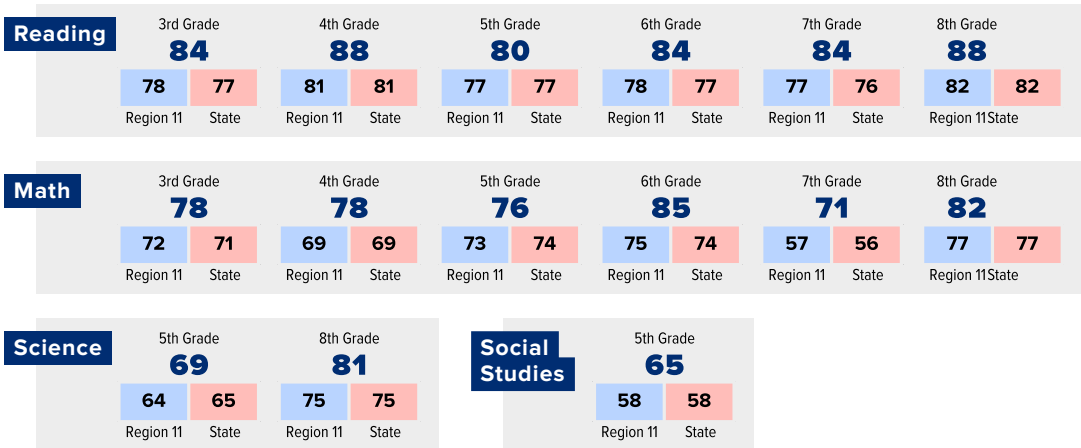
LIFE-READINESS INDICATORS

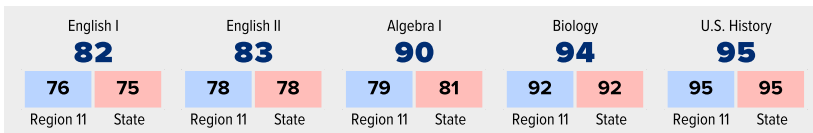
ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

Mansfield ISD's state ratings and scores prove why the district is among the best in Texas. Students have consistently outperformed region and state averages in the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) exam. MISD is also among the top-scoring districts when comparing STAAR results with surrounding and comparison districts.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Mansfield ISD offers 28 college-level advanced placement (AP) courses for high school students. Students who receive a qualifying score on an AP exam can earn college credit hours before graduation.

Students can get a jumpstart in advanced placement courses by taking one of MISD's advanced courses as early as the fifth grade.

DUAL CREDIT & SCHOLARSHIPS

College credit can be earned through our dual credit partnership with the Tarrant County College District. High school students who meet specific criteria may take up to three college courses during a regular school term and two courses per session in the summer. The dual credit program allows students to begin earning college credit as early as 10th grade. Mansfield ISD students enrolled in TCC's dual credit courses do not pay tuition for courses taken within our agreement.

In addition, the district has strong partnerships with the University of Texas at Arlington, Prairie View A&M University, Tarleton State University, the University of North Texas, and the University of North Texas at Dallas. These partnerships provide MISD students with automatic admission and/or scholarship opportunities.

POWER OF CHOICE

Students residing within Mansfield ISD have the opportunity to choose the educational pathway that is the best fit for them, even if it is located outside of their designated school attendance zone.



SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS

The specialized programs within MISD's Power of Choice offerings allow students to take advantage of specific programs that are tailored to their needs and interests. Specialized programs have an application process. Transportation is provided for all qualified students who are accepted into their specialized program of choice.

LEADERSHIP AND STEAM ACADEMIES

The leadership academies within MISD's Power of Choice give elementary and intermediate students (grades K-6) the opportunity to have a leadership curriculum built into the instructional schedule. The STEAM academy incorporates critical thinking and learning through cross-curricular science, technology, engineering, art, and math activities.

POWER OF CHOICE

MANSFIELD ISD'S SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS

▶ STEM ACADEMIES

Mansfield ISD has five STEM academies. These academies are centrally focused on immersing students in hands-on learning emphasized with science, technology, engineering, and mathematics in mind.

▶ FINE ARTS ACADEMIES

Mansfield ISD's fine arts academies place a stronger emphasis on the visual and performing arts than is typically present in a traditional elementary and intermediate school setting, giving students the opportunity to delve deeper into the creative disciplines of theatre, art, music, and dance.

▶ EARLY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL

The Tarrant County College (TCC) Southeast Early College High School at Timberview immerses students in a college-going culture in all courses. The school also gives students an opportunity to earn a high school diploma and associate degree.

▶ TWO-WAY DUAL LANGUAGE

Mansfield ISD's two-way dual language program allows Spanish and English native speakers the opportunity to learn in two languages through cooperative learning and collaboration.

▶ ALPHA ACADEMY

The MISD ALPHA (Advanced Learning Program for High Achievers) Academy is designed to meet the unique needs of advanced and gifted learners by providing personalized learning paths, fostering higher-order thinking skills and encouraging students to pursue passions through research, leadership, and creative expression.

▶ SUMMIT P-TECH ACADEMY

The Summit P-TECH (Pathways in Technology Early College High School) Academy offers students the opportunity to pursue college credit, work-based learning, and industry-recognized certifications in computer programming and software development.

FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY



Mansfield ISD has consistently been awarded the highest recognitions from several organizations for its commitment to fiscal integrity, responsibility, and transparency. The district has received the highest grade in the state's Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST) for 24 years in a row. FIRST ensures that Texas public schools are held accountable for the quality of their financial management practices.

In addition, Mansfield ISD's Standard & Poor's (S&P) Bond Rating is AA+. This improvement is a reflection of the district's consistently positive operations and strong fiscal management.

Finally, the district has received national awards from GFOA and ASBO for budget and finance. Mansfield ISD also received the Excellence in Financial Management Award and the Purchasing Award of Merit from the Texas Association of School Business Officials (TASBO).

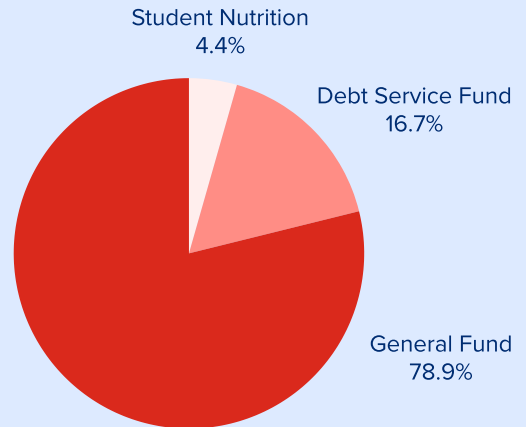
SCHOOL FUNDING

The Mansfield ISD School Board adopted the budget for the 2025-26 school year, keeping the district's priorities in focus.

In addition, board members approved salary increases for all district employees and a starting teacher salary of \$64,700 per year. Further, the District's contribution toward employee health care plan premiums increased from \$350/month to \$375/month while still maintaining a general fund balance above the board's goal of 17%-25%.
