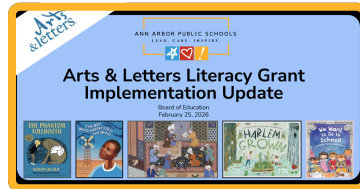

Superintendent Update

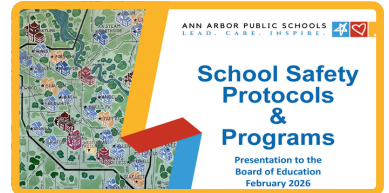

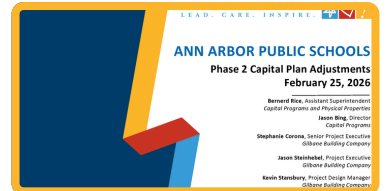


Capital Program Update / Phase 2 Adjustments



What is a Sinking Fund and why is it important to the Capital Bond Program?

The State of Michigan is one of only 12 states that do not provide any dedicated funding for school capital improvements, leaving the responsibility to the local community. A Sinking Fund is a voter-approved millage levied in Michigan dedicated to support school building repairs and construction in order to protect the General Fund.



Capital Program work was designed to utilize revenue from the **Bond and Sinking Fund** to pay for these projects.
