

Summer Learning

2025-2026 School Year

High School Summer Learning allows students to accelerate or recover credits between school years. The summer session is a condensed version of content provided during the school year, and students must have their course requests validated by their counselor before being enrolled.

Fulton County Schools offers three summer learning opportunities for high school students who need to retake a previously failed course:

1. Face-to-Face Summer School
2. Fulton Virtual Summer Program
3. Fulton County Credit Recovery

Students may also accelerate their learning during the summer by taking a course for the first time through Fulton Virtual. Tuition is required to take a course for the first time during the summer.

As you consider your options, please remember that one course is the equivalent of a semester-long class for a 0.5 credit. Students are limited to taking:

- 2 courses in a Face-to-Face setting
- 3 courses in Fulton Virtual
- 1 High School Summer Credit Recovery course at a time. Once a 0.5 credit is earned, a student may take another 0.5 credit recovery course through High School Summer Credit Recovery. ****Initial Registration and recommendations for HS Credit Recovery are only through the school counselor****

- Biology
(Biology B/semester 2 is an EOC course)
- Algebra: Concept & Connections
(Algebra B/semester 2 is an EOC course)
- Geometry: Concepts & Connections
- Literature & Composition I
- Literature & Composition II

Transportation

Fulton County Schools provides bus transportation for all Face-to-Face summer learning program students. Revised routes will pick up and drop off students based on "community" stops, high-density stops, and school-to-school stops to provide this service. This includes buses that take students from their home school to the summer school site. Please check the Transportation website after May 17 for information on your student's bus stop and time. During summer learning, we will continue using the "Here Comes the Bus" app to ensure parents have the most up-to-date bus information. Students attending the Summer Learning Adaptive program can receive transportation based on their IEP. Please register with the student's home school no later than April 24 to ensure the student's route is in place for the first day of summer school. Transportation is not provided for the Fulton County Credit Recovery program.

Fulton Virtual (May 28TH-July 1ST)



Fulton Virtual provides online learning options for middle and high school students throughout the district, enabling greater flexibility for students aiming to recover Credit or accelerate classes. Fulton Virtual courses are teacher-led; instructors work with students, parents/guardians, and other interested parties (e.g., counselors) to deliver course learning objectives and support each student's academic needs.

Fulton Virtual's offerings provide varied and dynamic content, user-friendly customization and personalization options, and opportunities for students of earlier ages to engage in learning virtually. Students can expect to spend 3.5 hours per day on each semester course in the summer term.

Tuition for Acceleration Courses with Fulton Virtual

1/2 Credit = \$225 (\$180 with free/reduced meal status) per course

Fulton County Credit Recovery (June 1ST -June 26TH)

The Fulton County Credit Recovery (FCCR) program is a specialized academic program designed to help high school students who have previously received a numerical failing grade on their transcript in one or more courses. The program aims to allow these students to retake the courses and earn the required credits for graduation.

Eligibility

To be eligible for an FCCR course, students must have a posted failing numeric grade on their transcript. FCCR courses are **NOT** NCAA accredited.
