Post-Secondary Opportunities Information

- West-MEC pays the college tuition (in-state tuition only; out-of-state students are responsible for the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition) for students accepted to the Paralegal Program.
 - \$15 registration fee per semester **(PAID BY WEST-MEC)**
 - \$97 per credit hour due soon after classes begin **(PAID BY WEST-MEC)**
 - Cost based upon meeting Maricopa residency and U.S. citizen/legal residency criteria. Must complete the "Maricopa Community Colleges Student Declaration of Citizenship or Status" form. Visit www.maricopa.edu/residency
- Additional cost for textbooks and uniforms will apply. **(PAID BY STUDENT)**
- Courses taken under concurrent enrollment may impact federal financial aid eligibility. To obtain additional information, students are encouraged to inquire with the college or university where they intend to enroll.

- Students who withdraw from the West-MEC program may receive college credit based on the number of completed courses.
