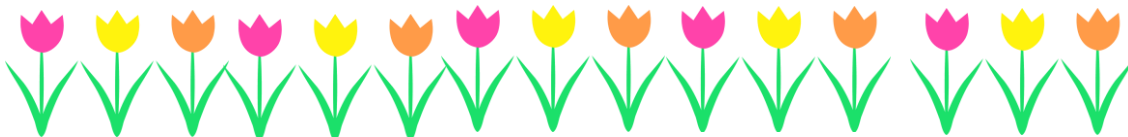

The sunny days and warmer temperatures can mean one thing...Spring is on its way!

March temperatures can fluctuate from warm to cold day by day. Just like last year, students will need to adhere to the following guidelines: if the wind chill is in the 30's, jackets must be worn outside; if the wind chill is in the 40's, a jacket must be taken outside but worn only if the child feels s/he needs it. 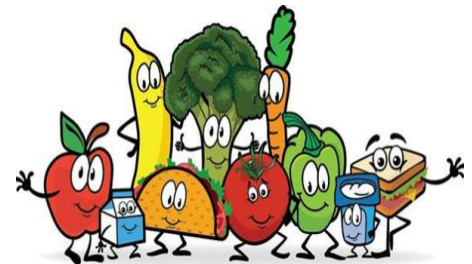

STUDENT ABSENCES & FAMILY TRAVEL REMINDERS

Based on Wisconsin State Statute 118.15 (3) [c], parent(s)/guardian(s) are authorized to excuse their student from school attendance for any or no reason, up to a maximum of ten (10) school days in a school year, provided they notify the school in writing prior to the absence. (A school day is defined as all or any part of a school day.)

Examples of absences that would fall under this category include: medical appointments, family vacation, court appearances, funeral services, state tournament games, hunting, and family emergencies.

Notification Procedure: The parent or guardian of the student **must notify the office in writing one day prior to the time of absence.**

Pre-Excused Make-Up Form on Future Absence(s): Students are to pick-up, complete, and return to the office a pre-excused absence form prior to the days of absence which indicates to the student what lessons and assignments will be missed. The form also allows the teachers to be aware of the student's upcoming absence. (The pre-excused absence form is required for students missing three (3) or more consecutive days.)

Please keep in mind that it is very time consuming for teachers to put together student work for an upcoming absence. It is difficult to pull things together last minute when proper notification is not given.

 - Closes Friday, April 24th at 6:00 p.m.
 - Registration again this year will be done electronically.

Registration for Next School Year -

If you have not already done so, please take care of the following asap:

- Verify your information in Skyward Family Access, Request Changes. Log into Family Access as the Student Info tab allows you to update and submit changes for district approval at any time. See request changes registration letter for directions. Students are automatically enrolled from year to year.
- If you will not return to the School District of Marshfield in September, notify us of the city, state, and school where you will be moving through the Family Access Contact Us tab in the upper right corner or through your school office as soon as you know.
- If you have moved during the school year or will be moving before the start of the new school year and want your child to remain at the school they are currently attending OR if you are requesting your student attend a school other than their neighborhood school for the upcoming school year, complete the Intradistrict Student Transfer Request found on Family Access under Online Forms, due by March 1.
- Students currently in public 4K will be placed at their neighborhood school for kindergarten. Children not attending public 4K may submit online enrollment for kindergarten through our website www.marshfieldschools.org, January 26-February 6.
- Students entering 4K may submit online enrollment through our website www.marshfieldschools.org, January 12-23.
- Current 6th grade students will receive further information from Marshfield Middle School.
- Meet and Greet information and teacher placement will be in Family Access in mid-August.
