School, Parent, and Family Engagement Policy

PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Alexandria Senior High School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

PART II. DESCRIPTION OF HOW SCHOOLS WILL IMPLEMENT REQUIRED SCHOOL, PARENT, AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT POLICY

1. Alexandria Senior High School will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school parental involvement plan under section 1118 of the ESEA by:
 - a. Conducting an annual community meeting with opportunities for questions and comments
 - b. Annually distributing surveys
 - c. Sending notification that Alexandria Senior High School is a Title I School, notifying parents that they can be involved and provide input into the creation of our Title I SWP
2. Alexandria Senior High School will take the following actions to involve parents in the process of school review and improvement under section 1116 of the ESEA by:
 - a. Conducting a community meeting with opportunities for questions and comments
 - b. Conducting meetings with the Schoolwide Improvement Plan Committee
 - c. Ensuring all meeting dates are added to the school calendar to encourage participation

3. Alexandria Senior High School will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of additional parental involvement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents as possible are able to attend. The school will invite all parents of children participating in Title I, Part A programs to this meeting, and will encourage them to attend by:
 - a. Posting meeting information on the school's social media and website
 - b. Informing parents via school messenger, Google Calendar invites, each grade level Google Classroom, and handouts
4. Alexandria Senior High School will provide parents of participating children information in a timely manner about Title I, Part A programs that include a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, the forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet by:
 - a. Sending letters home with students containing program information
 - b. Sharing information via the school website, social media, and school messenger
5. Alexandria Senior High School will, at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicable by:
 - a. Holding a parent/community committee meeting to discuss suggestions
 - b. Conducting research to determine the feasibility of the suggestions
6. Alexandria Senior High School will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts, and reading by:
 - a. Sending a copy of the individual assessment score to the student's mailing address
 - b. Allowing access to the parent of their child's assessment report, located in their academic cumulative folder
7. Alexandria Senior High School will take the following actions to provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not certified in the area which they teach by:
 - a. Sending a Right-to-Know letter home to the parent
 - b. Providing parent access to an administrator for further inquiries
8. Alexandria Senior High School will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph –
 - the state's academic content standards,
 - the state's student academic achievement standards,
 - the state and local academic assessments, including alternate assessments,
 - the requirements of Part A,
 - how to monitor their child's progress, and

· how to work with educators:

(List activities, such as workshops, conferences, classes, both in-state and out-of-state, including any equipment or other materials that may be necessary to ensure success.)

- a. Conduct parent/teacher conferences twice a year, in which parents can discuss their child's progress and course content standards
 - b. Conduct a school open house in which parents are presented with information about graduation pathways, state assessments, content standards, and how to use the state website to access this information.
 - c. The school will hold a parent meeting to discuss Title I, what it is, and how it will serve ASH students. Parents will be given information on how to work with educators during this meeting.
 - d. Provide opportunities for parents to schedule appointments with school administrators and staff to receive training on accessing academic content and their child's academic progress.
9. Alexandria Senior High School will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:
- a. Ongoing communication between school-parent-teacher to be able to assist students (School Messenger, Google Classroom, emails, phone conferences, etc.)
 - b. Providing access to online resources
 - c. Providing opportunities for parents to make appointments with school administrators and staff
10. Alexandria Senior High School will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
- a. Conducting professional development with administrators, teachers, and staff in parent relations
 - b. PTC/Title I Meetings
 - c. Written communication, including calendars, memos, and informational handouts.
11. Alexandria Senior High School will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with Head Start, Reading First, Early Reading First, Even Start, Home Instruction Programs for Preschool Youngsters, the Parents as Teachers Program, public preschool, and other programs. The school will also conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children, by:
- a. Creating a Parent Resource Website add-on
 - b. Conducting parent/teacher conferences, open houses, and college, career, and workforce readiness sessions
12. Alexandria Senior High School will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents of


participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand by:
