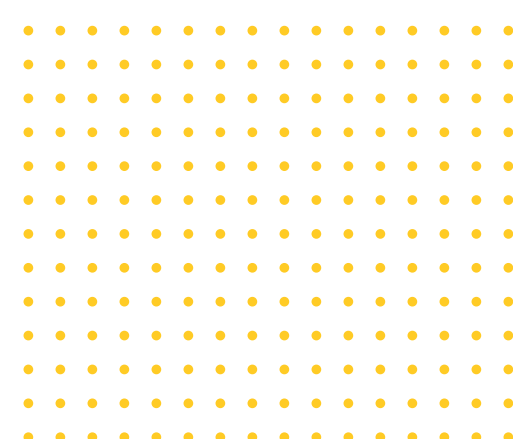

Location: Hanford HS, Richland HS

Length/Credit: Semester / 0.5 credit

Open to: Grades 9-12

Satisfies: 0.5 Fine Arts, 0.5 Occupational, or 0.5 Elective

Broadcast team members receive instruction and experience, gathering, editing, and broadcasting news and sports. Broadcast team members learn and use industry standard video recording and editing equipment. Team members utilize communication skills including ad-libbing, reporting, interviewing, and play-by-play sports announcing. They plan, produce, and submit work for broadcast, sell advertisements, and cover school activities outside the school day. Broadcast team members utilize professional standards and practices when acquiring and preparing news for television broadcasting.

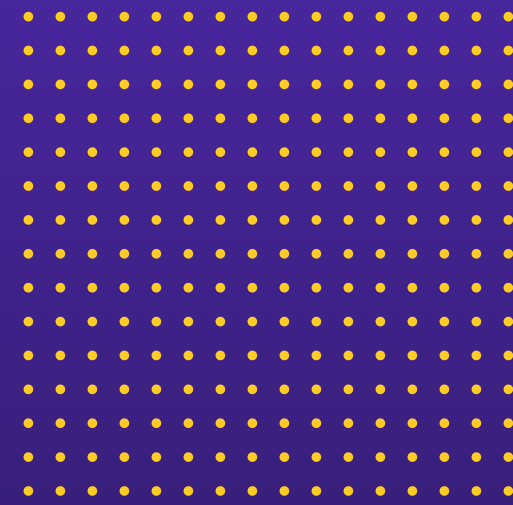

Advanced Placement (AP) Science Classes




Things to Consider

- As a 9th grader, there are no AP Science courses available
- Future AP Science options with prerequisite courses:
 - AP Biology: Need Chemistry, but Biology is STRONGLY recommended
 - AP Chemistry: Need Chemistry
 - AP Physics 1: Need Algebra 1, but more math is HIGHLY recommended
 - AP Computer Science A: Recommend concurrent Algebra 2 (or higher) enrollment
 - AP Computer Science Principles (no prerequisites)

❖ Do I get a locker?

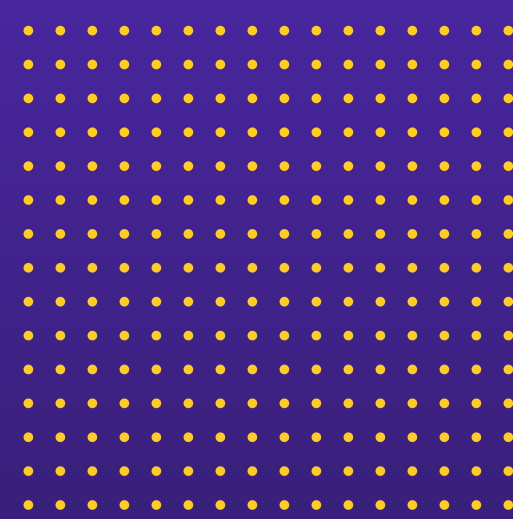
- *By request only (most students don't use lockers at HS--except in PE)*

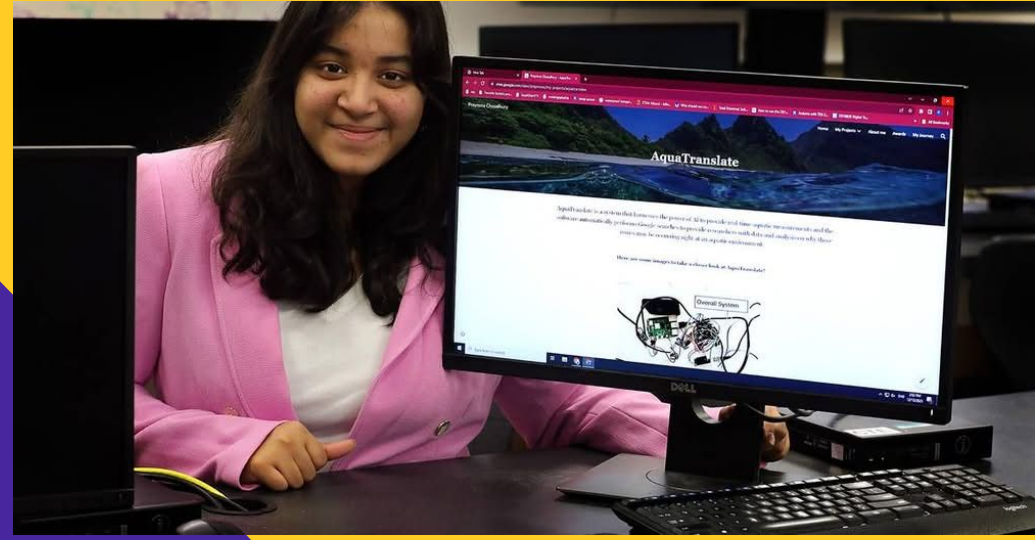
