



**Dear Parents and Property Owners of the Fort Stockton Independent School District:**

Subject: Assignment of Accreditation Status to the Fort Stockton Independent School District

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that the 2025-2026 accreditation status of the Fort Stockton Independent School District is **Accredited-Warned**. Under state law, the accreditation statuses that may be assigned to districts include Accredited, Accredited-Warned, Accredited-Probation, and Not Accredited-Revoked. A status of **Accredited-Warned** means that a district exhibits deficiencies in performance that, if not addressed, will lead to probation or revocation of the district's accreditation status.

The Fort Stockton Independent School District has been assigned an **Accredited-Warned** status due to the ratings assigned to the district in the state's Academic Accountability Rating System. Specifically, the Fort Stockton Independent School District was assigned an Academic Accountability Rating of F for 2024 and 2025.

The district is taking the following steps to address the areas of identified deficiency. The district has implemented district and campus improvement plans focused on increasing student academic performance, strengthening instructional practices, and improving accountability outcomes across all campuses. The district is also working with its partnered online campuses that contributed to the two consecutive F accountability ratings to address academic performance concerns. The district is collaborating with the online schools to implement targeted academic supports and accountability measures in the best interest of students enrolled in the online programs across Texas.

Under law, if the current accreditation concerns for the district are not addressed, the district may be assigned an accreditation status of **Accredited-Probation** or **Not Accredited-Revoked**. A Not Accredited-Revoked status means that the TEA no longer recognizes the district as a Texas public school. Districts with an accreditation status below Accredited may also be subject to additional accreditation sanctions as referenced in statute and rule.
