<p>Optional – Foreign Language (Note that foreign language courses are not part of the UGETC The receiving university will determine whether the courses will count as general education, pre-major, or elective credit.)</p>

Pathways vs. Associate Degrees

They are not the same thing

Transfer Pathway	Associate Transfer Degree
Includes a selection of classes from the associate degree of ~ 11 classes totally 32-34 credit hours	Full Associate degree consists of 20+ classes totally at least 60 credit hours
May be completed within 2 years if students average about 2 classes each semester, including summer	May be completed within 2 years if student averages about 5 classes each semester, not including summer
Attainable goal for motivated high school student	Attainable goal only if student has completed most of their high school graduation requirements

Once student complete a pathway, they can move into the full degree



College Transfer Pathway ELIGIBILITY

Student attend a NC high school or be a NC resident

AND

Student must have an unweighted GPA of 2.8 or higher

OR

Student must demonstrate college readiness on approved assessment in English, Reading and Math (PSAT, SAT, Pre-ACT, ACT, RISE)

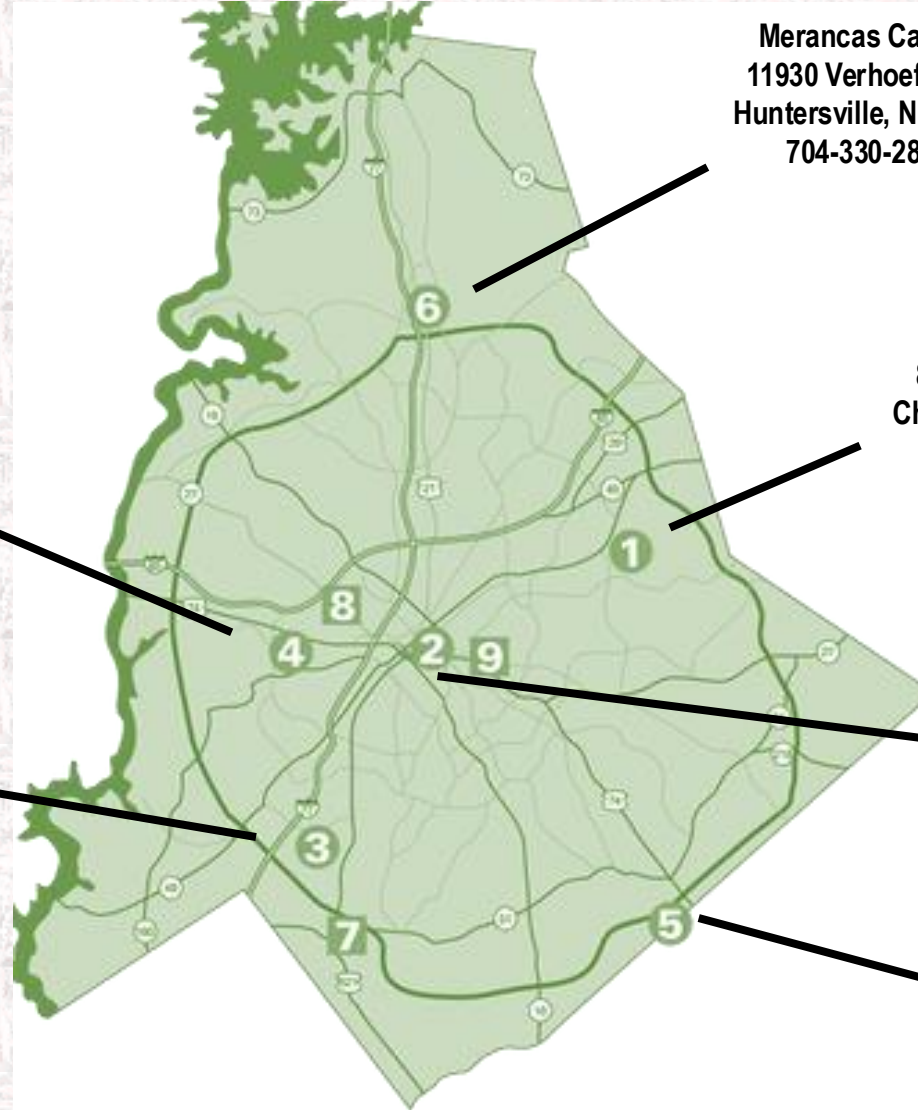

* Your social security number is requested on the CCP application. This is not mandatory but is needed if you want to receive a 1098 T tax form.



The State requires students provide a **new transcript EACH semester** they wish to participate in Dual Enrollment.

Students will receive an email form us through MyConnect when it is time to upload a new transcript. There will be a link included in this email.

Remember your transcript must:

- Be a new transcript with a current date even if your classes haven't changed since the last transcript you uploaded
- Show your unweighted GPA
- List the classes you are currently taking by grade and academic year
- Be from your current high school

Deadlines for 2026 - 2027 Academic Year

Student Application and high school approval acceptance dates	Semester and Course Start Date
February 2 nd to July 20 th	Fall semester courses that start August 17 th
February 2 nd to September 21 st	Fall semester courses that start October 19 th
February 2 nd to November 30 th	Spring semester courses that start January 11 th
February 2, 2026 to February 15, 2027	Spring semester courses that start March 15 th
February 2, 2026 to April 20, 2027	Summer 2027 semester courses

Students will be processed to register within 4 weeks of application processing
This is also the schedule for pathway change requests

Fall 2026 and Spring 2027 semester registration Opens March 30, 2026
Summer 2027 semester registration opens in October, 2026

Your high school may have internal deadlines. Please talk to your high school Liaison about your schools unique requirements for approval to participate



Academic Accommodations

Students must self-identify their need to our Disability and Access Services Department. This process can be started by completing an intake from on [their website](#).

As it is the students' responsibility to request accommodations, we recommend starting this process at least 6 weeks before the semester starts to ensure approval and seamless implementation with your instructors.

Once approved, a student is assigned to a Coordinator in the Disability and Access Services Department who notifies your instructors of the accommodations each semester.

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Maintaining Eligibility



To Maintain Eligibility Students Must:

- Continue to make progress toward high school graduation
- Provide a new high school transcript each semester



Transcripts

Your first class at Central Piedmont starts your college transcript. It is the student's responsibility to keep up with their coursework as well as with drop and withdrawal dates.

- **Drops** must be done by the 10% date for the class and do not appear on your college transcript. This date is listed as the Census date on the course syllabus.
- **Withdrawals** may be done between the 10% and 35% date of the class and appears as a "W" on transcript. This is listed as the withdrawal date on the course syllabus
- Both **Drops** and **Withdrawals** are done in MyCollege by the student
- An Instructor must withdraw students who do not attend their class or complete the EVA within during the first 10% (census date) of the class. This will be **recorded as a WN on the college transcript.**

NOTE: Some high schools have a policy that a W will be recorded as a W/F and a WN as an F on your high school transcript. Please talk to your high school counselor about how dual enrollment classes are reported on your high school transcript.
