Every year, each public school and school district in Massachusetts receives a report card. Just as your child's report card shows how they are doing in different subjects, the school's report card is designed to show families how our school is doing in different areas. The report card includes multiple measures of a school's performance – more than just MCAS scores. It represents a new way of looking at school performance, by providing information on student achievement, teacher qualifications, student learning opportunities, and more.

Report cards are designed to be useful tools for everyone connected to our school. Families can use the information to have meaningful conversations with us about what the school is doing well and where there is room for improvement. Community and education leaders can use the information to better understand how to support students and our school.

Our report card highlights that, despite being a small district, we offer a diverse curriculum, giving our students greater access to arts and computer science courses compared to the state average. To further enhance student performance, we are continuously refining our multi-tiered systems of support to ensure universal access to rigorous learning opportunities.

We encourage you to become involved in helping us improve our school. We see parents as critical partners in the success of our students and school, and we are grateful for your continued support.

Finally, because the HV Elementary and Middle Schools receive federal Title I funds, you also have the right to request the following information about the qualifications of your child's classroom teachers:

- Whether your child's teacher is licensed in the grade levels and subject areas they teach,
- Whether your child's teacher is teaching under an emergency license or waiver,
- The college degree and major of your child's teacher, and
- Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

## To Print a Report Card in English:

1. Search for a report card at [reportcards.doe.mass.edu](http://reportcards.doe.mass.edu).
2. Click the Quick Print button at the top of the report card.
3. Adjust your print settings (optional). Through your computer's print driver, you can change the orientation (portrait or landscape) and add or remove headers and footers.
4. Select your print destination. Send the report to a printer or print to PDF.
5. Print.

## To Print a Translated Report Card:

1. Search for the report card you wish to translate. Copy the URL.
2. Go to <https://translate.google.com>, then click on Websites.
3. Paste the URL for the report into the box shown, and select the desired language at the top. Click enter.
4. Click the Quick Print button at the top of the report card.
5. Adjust your print settings (optional). Through your computer's print driver, you can change the orientation (portrait or landscape) and add or remove headers and footers.
6. Select your print destination. Send the report to a printer or print to PDF.
7. Print.
