

Honor Society Requirements

Science National Honor Society (SNHS)

Freshman Candidates

- **Eligibility Criteria:** Freshman students will be considered "Candidates" if they meet the following academic standards by the end of Marking Period 2:
 - Achieve at least an 80% in an AP science course.
 - Achieve at least an 85% in an honors science course.
- **Recognition:** Candidates will receive a letter of recognition from the SNHS acknowledging their academic achievements.
- **Application Invitation:** Candidates maintaining their academic excellence through the end of the Freshman academic year will be invited to apply for SNHS membership at the start of their Sophomore year.

Sophomore Members

- Exceptional Sophomore applicants will be considered for membership at the discretion of the advisor.
- **Membership Entitlements:** Sophomores who meet the criteria and are accepted into the SNHS are entitled to full member privileges.
- **Participation:** Sophomore members can participate in all SNHS events and are eligible to hold committee positions.

Junior Induction

- **Application Criteria:** Juniors can apply for induction at the end of their Junior year if they:
 - Complete at least two honors or AP science classes during their previous three years.
 - Maintain academic excellence, achieving at least an 80% in AP science courses or 85% in honors science courses.
- **Additional Requirements:**
 - **Volunteer Hours or Events:** Participate in volunteer activities or events organized by SNHS.
 - **Leadership:** Demonstrate leadership by joining and actively participating in event committees.
 - **Meeting Attendance:** Fulfill meeting attendance requirements set by SNHS.
 - **Character:** Exhibit strong character and integrity in line with SNHS values.

Inducted Seniors

- **Additional Privileges:** Inducted Seniors are entitled to additional membership privileges, including:
 - Access to special inducted member events.
 - The ability to hold executive positions within the SNHS.

Requirements for the Société Honoraire de Français

Invitation to membership shall be restricted to those students actively engaged in the study of French in a secondary school when appropriate courses are available or when outside courses become part of the student's secondary transcript, credits, and grade point.

- Candidates must be enrolled in the fourth semester of French or higher, i.e., the second semester of Level II or the equivalent
- Candidates must be in the 10th, 11th, or 12th grade of high school. Exception is made for 9th grade students who meet requirement "1" above because of work at the middle school or junior high level
- Transfer students must have spent at least one full semester in the high school before becoming eligible for invitation to membership.

Scholastic Eligibility Requirements to be met by all students:

- Candidates must have maintained an A- (90) average or higher in French throughout their secondary school study of French, including the semester of selection and all previous work awarded secondary school credit.
- Candidates must have maintained a B- (80) average or higher in all other secondary school subjects prior to the semester of selection.

National Art Honor Society

Students must have taken an Art related course and achieve a 90 or higher. (Studio, Ceramics & Sculpture, Graphic Design, Photography, Digital Photography)

- All students must maintain a 3.0 average Grade Point Average (GPA).
- Students must have a letter of recommendation filled out by a teacher.
- After being accepted, NAHS members must accumulate 25 hours annually to be eligible for induction. Seniors will also receive a graduation cord.
- Students must present a small portfolio of 3-5 original works of art. Any art mediums, including digital art are acceptable, and should show variation of mediums used.

Tri-M Music Honor Society - Monroe Township High School

General Standards for Admission

All students who would like to be considered for admission into Tri-M must possess all attributes listed below:

Participation:

- Students must be in 10th, 11th, or 12th grade in for the following school year (applying in April)
- Will be enrolled in a performance-based honors weighted music class for following school year
- Enrolled in a performance-based music class during the current school year

Scholarship:

- Students must maintain Honor Roll status
- Students must have an A average in all music classes

Leadership:

- Students demonstrate musical leadership within the school or community.
- Examples include, but are not limited to: section leader of a school/community ensemble, teaching private lessons, etc.

Solo Musical Proficiency:

- Students demonstrate the ability to successfully perform a solo or excerpt from a curricular ensemble's repertoire during their Tri-M audition.
- Students will perform a cappella. Students should showcase proficiency regarding potential performance at an upcoming Tri-M induction.

MTHS Chapter of the Rho Kappa National Social Studies Honor Society

This honor society is for SENIORS ONLY. Students will apply in the spring of their junior year and be inducted in the spring of their senior year. Students who have a 90% or better in Honors History, or an 85% or better in Advanced Placement History (unweighted) and a minimum of TWO Years of Honors or AP History in required history courses will receive an invitation to apply to the honor society in the spring of their junior year.

Additional requirements include:

1. Must be enrolled in or have previously taken a Social Studies elective course and have an average of 85% or better (unweighted)
 - Qualifying Electives:
 - AP Psychology
 - Psychology
 - Sociology
 - American Image on Film/Civic Action
 - AP Human Geography
 - Holocaust and Genocide
 - Intro to Law/Con Law
 - African American Experience
 - AP European History
 - AP Government
2. Student applicants will be reviewed by the Social Studies staff. Violations of the school Academic Integrity Agreement, including but not limited to plagiarism and cheating, disqualifies your eligibility.
3. Student applicants will be reviewed for conduct violations by their vice principal.
4. Ten hours of community service in the past year.
 - The following constitutes some ideas for community service: volunteering at the library, Falcon PALS, coaching a youth sport, UNICEF, Meals-on-Wheels, animal shelters, etc.
 - The following are some ideas of what does NOT constitute community service: helping at your parents' workplace, babysitting, going food shopping with your grandparents, mowing the lawn at home/grandparent's house, or anything of a similar nature.
5. A typed, MLA formatted essay of no more than 2 pages in response to this prompt: Why is it important to learn history?

National Honor Society

National Honor Society (NHS) at MTHS is a nationally recognized chapter. Junior students that meet the eligibility requirements will receive an invitation to apply. There are two times when a student may become eligible. The requirements of each are listed below.

Junior Year Eligibility and Application Requirements:

- Junior students with a cumulative, weighted GPA of 90.000 or higher (not rounded) will be invited to apply via email and added to the NHS Eligibility Schoology course at the END OF MP2 of their junior year.
- Junior Year Application Requirements:
 - Complete the NHS Applicant Information Google Form
 - Must have completed and documented 30 Community Service Hours*
 - Must have completed and documented 10 Leadership Hours*
 - Read the MTHS NHS By-Laws, Review and Sign the NHS Membership Contract
 - Applicants must meet all deadlines

**Community Service and Leadership Hours must have been completed beginning September of their freshman year through the application deadline, to be accepted.*

1st MP Senior Year Eligibility and Application Requirements:

- A second opportunity is available to 1st MP seniors who were ineligible due to insufficient GPA or insufficient service/leadership hours; eligible but did not apply during their junior year; eligible but did not meet requirements at that time; applied and denied during their junior year but encouraged to re-apply their senior year.
- Interested students would then complete the required form that would be posted in the morning announcements and in the senior class Schoology course. Students must meet the GPA requirement by the end of the 1st MP with a cumulative, weighted, GPA requirement of 90.00. Students deemed eligible will be notified and receive an application via email to apply.
- 1st MP Senior Application Requirements:
 - Complete the NHS Applicant Information Google Form
 - Must have completed and documented 40 Community Service Hours*
 - Must have completed and documented 15 Leadership Hours*
 - Read the MTHS NHS By-Laws, Review and Sign the NHS Membership Contract
 - Applicants must meet all deadlines

**Community Service and Leadership Hours must have been completed beginning September of their freshman year through the application deadline, to be accepted.*

National English Honor Society

The MTHS Chapter of the National English Honor Society serves as the high school division of the international collegiate organization, Sigma Tau Delta. Juniors at MTHS who have successfully completed at least one year of Honors or Advanced Placement (AP) English in their sophomore year, and who maintain a minimum unweighted GPA of 90.0 in Honors English or 85.0 in AP English Language during their current year, will be invited to apply for membership after the first semester of their junior year.

Application Requirements:

Eligible candidates must submit the following materials as part of their NEHS application:

- Five (5) hours of verified literacy-based community service
- Three (3) letters of recommendation: Current English teacher, core subject teacher, and vice principal
- A video submission showcasing their personal interests and academic goals
- A 250-word well-written essay reflecting on the value of studying literature
- Demonstrated qualities of leadership, service, and character

Membership Maintenance:

To maintain active membership in NEHS, inducted members are required to:

- Sustain an unweighted academic average of 90.0 in Honors English and 85.0 in AP English
- Twenty (20) hours per year of verified literacy-based community service
- Actively participate at all NEHS meetings, events, and fundraisers
- Uphold a clean conduct record, demonstrating consistent leadership, service, and character

Spanish Honor Society Requirements:

Students must fulfill ALL these requirements to be inducted

- Be a current student in a Spanish class (at least Spanish III).
- Demonstrate continued completion of grade criteria: at least a 95% average each MP and for the year in Spanish II, a 90% average each MP and for the year in Spanish 2H, 3, 4, or Contemporary Issues or an 85% average each MP and for the year in Spanish 3H, 4H, or AP.
- Have a clean discipline record (no more than 1 detention).
- Attend all Honor Society meetings (we average one per month; have no more than 2 absences throughout the year).
- Fully participate in all our fundraising and community service activities.
- Earn the required number of membership points as determined by the student board for participating in SHS cultural activities.
- Have no record of cheating, plagiarism, or any other form of academic dishonesty, as per your Spanish teacher.

Italian Honor Society Requirements:

Criteria:

- Students must be in your second year of Italian.
- Students must have a good discipline record. (No more than one detention)
- Students must have maintained at least a 87% average each semester last year in Italian 2, 2 honors or 3 or at least an 85% average each semester last year in Italian 3 or 3 honors, or 4 honors

Math Honor Society Requirements (Mu Alpha Theta)

To maintain eligibility or be induced into the Math Honor Society in June, the student must meet the following criteria:

- **Math GPA**
 - Must be currently enrolled in a course of Precalculus, Calculus, AP Statistics or a higher-level course through senior option (such as Multivariable Calculus, Differential Equations or Linear Algebra)
 - All math courses (both past and current) must meet the following (current course(s) Math GPA will be calculated after MP 3):
 - Regular level: 95 or higher
 - Honors level: 90 or higher
 - AP level: 85 or higher

- **Meeting Attendance**
 - Minimum of 80% attendance (excluding executive board meetings)

- **Competition Participation**
 - Minimum of 3 during the year

- **Math Volunteer Hours**
 - Minimum of 10 hours
 - Minimum of 5 hours of tutoring (3 of which can be virtual via online videos approved by the advisor)
 - Other suggested activities:
 - Haunted High School
 - Elementary School Math nights
 - Winter Wonderland
