Alternative Learning Experience Requirements (ALE WAC 392-121-182)

Minimum Program Requirements:

Minimum hours per week of learning activities: **28 hours**

Maintain “on track” or “ahead” in the majority of classes.

I have read and understand the requirements for the Alternative Learning Experience Plan for Auburn Online contained in this document. I understand my academic responsibilities and expectations to remain in the Auburn Online Program with the Auburn School District. I approve of this plan.

Weekly Contact:

Students are required to maintain weekly direct personal contact with their teacher and that contact shall be for the purpose of instruction, review of assignments, testing, inquiries on progress, or other learning activities. All meetings between certificated teacher and student will be done weekly through Google Meet, email, telephone, face-to-face and/or instant messaging.

Satisfactory Progress and Monthly Progress Evaluation:

Students must maintain “satisfactory” progress as stated on the Monthly Progress Report in order to remain in good standing in the program. Program expectations are outlined in the program handbook. Individual course requirements are outlined in course syllabi found in Edgenuity or upon request.

Student progress is evaluated monthly. If a student fails to make progress towards the stated monthly goals, then monthly progress is unsatisfactory. Students must conference with their program advisor/teacher weekly to help the student meet program requirements.

Interventions for Students Making Unsatisfactory Progress:

If monthly progress is not attained, then the student’s course contract will be amended to address the student’s learning needs (additional contact/instructional time etc.). If a student fails to make progress after two interventions (amended contracts), a program change will be considered after the 3rd unsatisfactory mark. All intervention plans will be developed and implemented within 5 days of initial intervention.

Instructional Materials:

All learning activity resources and folders are contained within the student course of study. Online courses are accessed via login and password emailed directly to the student upon enrollment. The certificated teacher will list textbooks or other core course materials.

Course Descriptions and Syllabus:

All courses are delivered through an online platform. Course descriptions and syllabi are available online in the google drive and will be available upon request.

Graduation Requirements:

All courses meet Auburn School District and Washington State graduation requirements.
