According to 2023-2024 DIBELS data, third grade ended with a high number of 55.5% above the state average that was 52.7% Above/Benchmark

According to 2023-2024 LEAP data, 3rd - 6th grade students have a strength in vocabulary at 51% which is up from the previous year at 44%.

According to 2024 Leap data, 3rd-6th grade students have a strength in modeling and application. 38% of students are proficient.

According to 2023-2024 DIBELS data, kindergarten through 2nd scored below the state percentage.

According to 2023-2024 LEAP data, 3rd - 6th Grade students have a weakness in Written Expression at 43% which is a decrease from the previous year at 51%.

According to 2024 Leap data, the lowest performing standards are found in the domain operations and algebraic thinking.

**STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT DATA**

**All Students**

According to our 2024-2025 data, Mayfield K-3 students surpassed the goal of 55% benchmark and above with a total of 59% of students scoring benchmark and above. First grade exceeded the district growth rate percentage from BOY to EOY by 9%.

According to 2024-2025 LEAP data, 3rd - 6th grade students have a strength in Writing Performance at 47% which is the same from the previous year at 47%.

Math- According to 2025 Leap data, 3rd-6th grade students have a strength in Expressing Mathematical Reasoning 33%.

Our 2025 4th grade science assessment index increased from 51.5 to 57.1. Our 6th grade science assessment index increased from 46.1 to 55.3

According to our 2024-2025 data, kindergarten's growth rate percentage was 1% less than the district, 2nd grade's growth rate was 3% less than the district, and 3rd grade's growth rate was 5% less than the district.

According to 2024-2025 LEAP data, 3rd - 6th Grade students have a weakness in Literary Text at 38% which is a decrease from the previous year at 48%.

Math- According to 2024-2025 LEAP data, 3rd - 6th Grade students have a weakness in Major Content at 46%, which is a 10% increase of students scoring weak in this category from the previous year of 36%.

According to our 2024-2025 Science LEAP Data, 3rd-6th grade students have a weakness in evaluating with only 26% strong across the grade levels. Mayfield had 27.3% proficient in Science, while the district had 38.6% proficient.

**At-Risk Student Groups**

Mayfield SWE K-3 students surpassed the Dibels goal of 31% benchmark and above with a total of 31.4% of students scoring benchmark and above.

The economically disadvantaged (out of 279 total students) showed a 3 point increase in science from 2023-2025- **test results were not reported in 2024**

**Mayfield's SWE had a strength in the ELA 2024-2025 scores by 51.4% of the lowest 25% showing growth.**

Mayfield's EL K-3 students did not meet the goal of 55% benchmark and above with a total of 33% of EL students scoring benchmark and above. (1 of 3 students)

The economically disadvantaged (out of 279 total students) showed a decrease of 5.4 points in science from 2024-2025.

Of the 4 EL students, there was an overall decrease in ELA, Science, and Math.

- **Priority Goal #1 (Culture)** - From Fall 2024 to Fall 2027, Mayfield Elementary School will increase the MRA sub-measure of Empowered Learners (Social Support) from 73 to 90 through a focus on engaging students who are equipped to achieve and entrusted to lead their own learning.
- **Priority Goal #2 (Academics)** - From Fall 2024 to Fall 2027, Mayfield School Kindergarten - 3rd will increase the DIBEL percent from 52% to 61% proficient through a focus on foundational literacy skills.  
From Fall 2024 to Fall 2027, Mayfield School grades 3-6 will increase written expression in LEAP ELA percent from 43% to 52% through a focus on Written Expression.
- **Priority Goal #3 (Academics)** -From Fall 2024 to Fall 2027, Mayfield Elementary School will increase the School-wide Math Assessment Index from 62 % to 68% through a focus on students articulating understanding of major content in whole-class, peer-to-peer, and teacher-to-student discourse.

### Priority Area #1 Goal:

From Fall 2024 to Fall 2027, Mayfield Elementary School will increase the MRA sub-measure of Empowered Learners (Social Support) from 73 to 90 through a focus on engaging students who are equipped to achieve and entrusted to lead their own learning.

**2024-25: Fall Festival** - This event targeted prek - 6th grade with activities that focused on math and ELA. Each grade level created a station that was engaging and tied in ELA or math curriculum. This event not only provided an educational experience, it also provided an opportunity for our MFE families to engage with each other. Feedback from this event indicated that families enjoyed the event and felt that activities were age appropriate, fun, and provided information that was beneficial to student learning. Teachers enjoyed putting this event together and stated that having additional things like face painting and hayrides help promote the event. Some suggestions from families were not having the activities spread so far apart. Next year, we will look at the layout and make a few changes.

**Meet N Greet:** This event allows for parents and students to see the classroom and drop off materials before the first day of school. Teachers have our Mayfield welcome packet ready for them to complete. This packet includes all the paperwork provided from the district and the emergency card. Families were given a QR code to pay for chromebook insurance at that moment or later in the week. This year our 4th - 6th grade students were able to collect their chromebooks and chargers to be prepared for the 1st day of school. Feedback from this event showed parents liked coming in before school starts and getting their student settled in the classroom. Some families indicated that the time of the vent did not work well for them. Next year, chromebooks will have been done a little differently since our Destiny system did not correlate with the rosters that we had in JPams.

**Jazz Fest:** This event accurately reflected the proposed goal which was to highlight all of our amazing artistic talent, showcase our students' hard work in choir, band, violin, theater, cheer, dance, and pep. In addition to providing parents with educational summer programs by having representatives come from our community to share information. This event was successful in providing both parents and students as they were able to attend performances, eat with local food trucks, find summer camps and view their own work displayed in the hallways. Parents and students were actively engaged with each other and faculty. Based on feedback from last year, we adapted the times for everyone to be able to attend each performance. This year's feedback indicated that we may

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need to space performances since some children perform in multiple things. Next year, we may extend the time so families are able to see more summer local options and transition for the students who perform.

**Second Grade Parent and Family Night:** This event was for our 2nd grade families and how to help their students at home with reading. The interventionist provided the parents detailed information through powerpoint slides and discussion. Teachers were able to speak with parents on how to work together to support the success of their child's reading. Turnout for the event was only 18 so next year we have to look at ways that would grow our attendance. Also, we would like to have stations that allow students to show their parents how to implement different activities.

### **2025-26:**

**Meet N Greet:** This event is to give parents and students the opportunity to see the classroom and meet the teacher. Students are able to see other students that will be in their class which supports excitement about coming the 1st day of school. In addition, all paperwork needed from the parents are given to them at this time. Parents complete the papers so all information needed for the students is received before school starts. Information about buses, MPP, and lunch are also available during this time. This year chromebooks were given out on the smart days instead of Meet N Greet.
