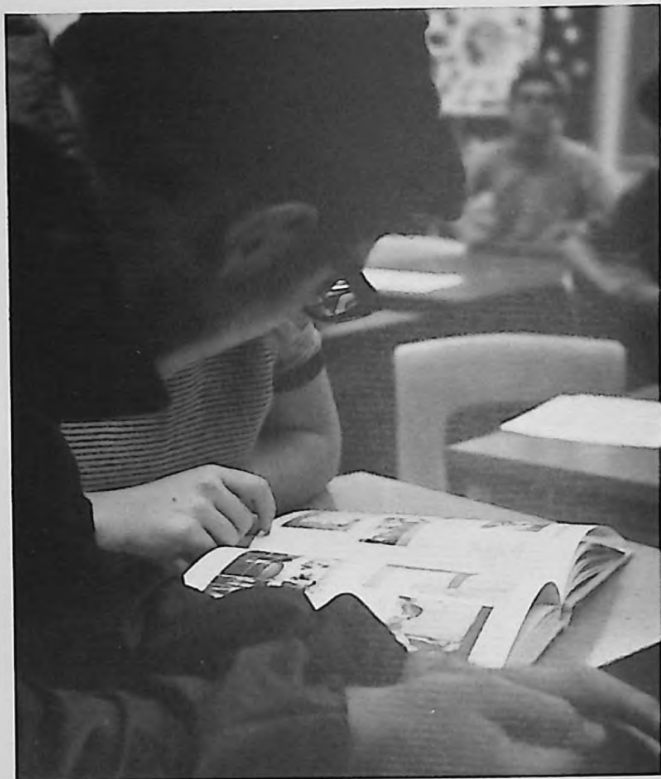

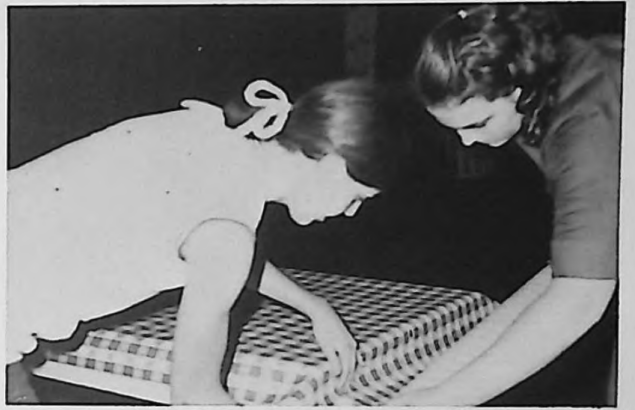

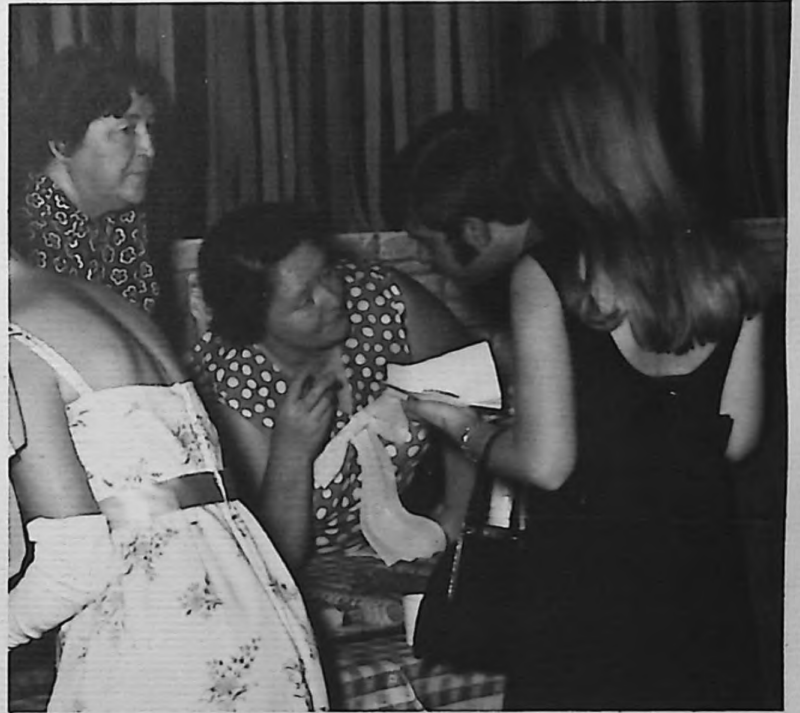

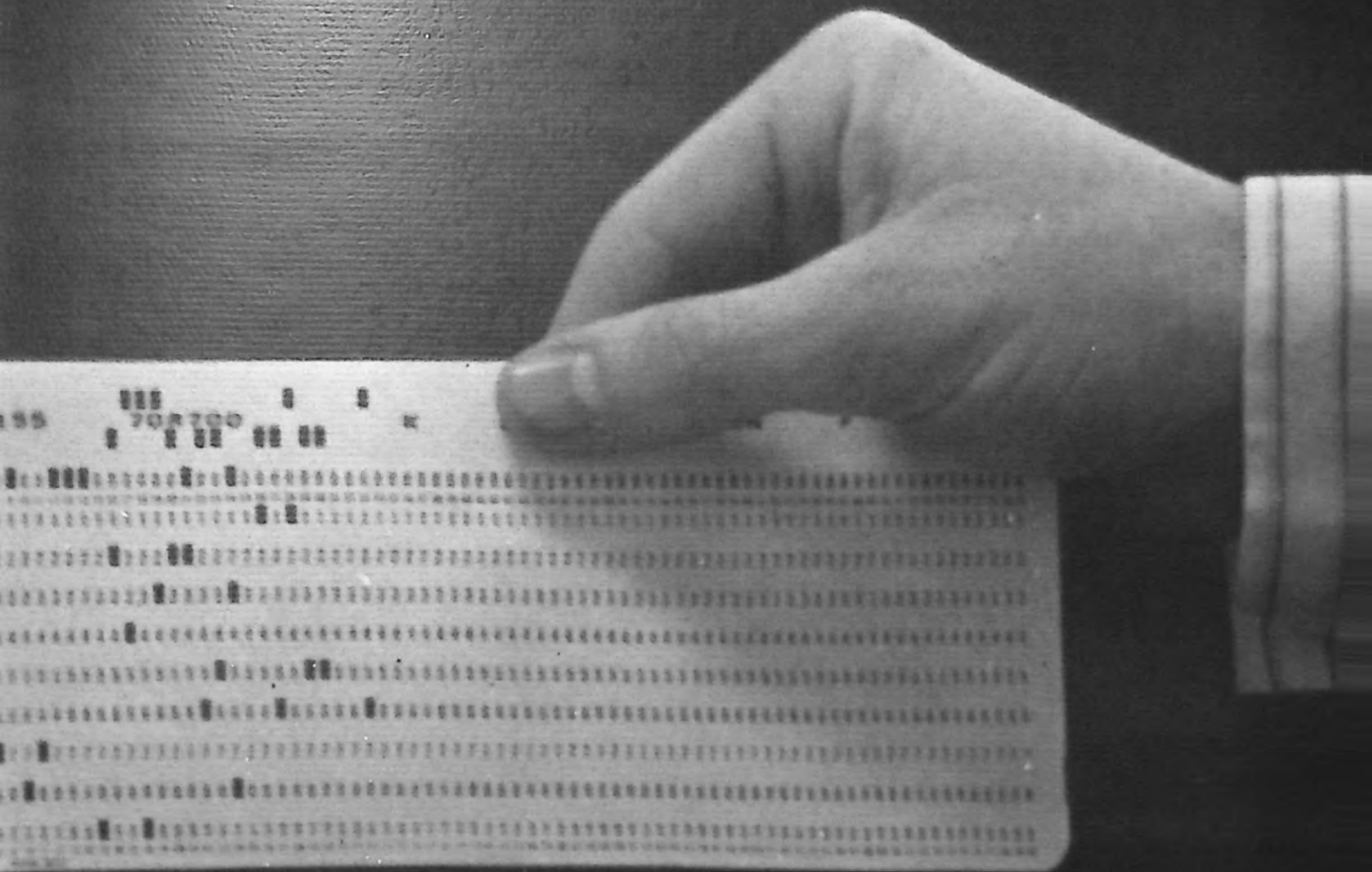
Science Fair

English Department

The junior high English program is shared by Mrs. Sharp, who teaches the English courses, and Mrs. Keating, who teaches reading. The English classes main course of study was spelling and grammar. They also kept a daily journal and had extensive library study. The purpose of the seventh and eighth grade reading classes was to improve the student's reading rate and comprehension, which was done by the use of SAT reading laboratory, the textbook, and the room library.

Mr. Pinney, Mrs. Geiger, and Mrs. Sharp make up the high school English teaching staff at Berne Union. Stress was primarily directed to the student's ability to read and interpret American, English, and continental literature. Some classes used periodical literature such as P. E. and Readers Digest to augment the course. Emphasis was also placed on traditional grammar and clarity, and cohesiveness in writing.

The Junior High School Classes were taught by Mr. Blackston. The course of study was general. The seventh grade class journeyed to the Lancaster High School Planetarium and learned many interesting aspects of our Planetary system. Mr. Watts handled the high school biology department which was divided into Biology I and Biology II. The Biology I class studied plant life the first semester and animal life the second, augmenting the program with field trips, ecology trips, dissections, and film strips. The Biology II class was made up of students who had completed Biology I and were seriously interested in the study of plants and animals. Their course of study included weekly reports, films, field trips and dissection, ending with a final project of the student's own choosing. The class traveled to Batelle Institute and the Center of Science and Industry along with the Physics Class, which was taught by Mr. Fick. The Physics Class, made up of college bound students, concentrated on developing a college type atmosphere by writing reports based on college standards and practicing analytical and indepth thinking and writing.

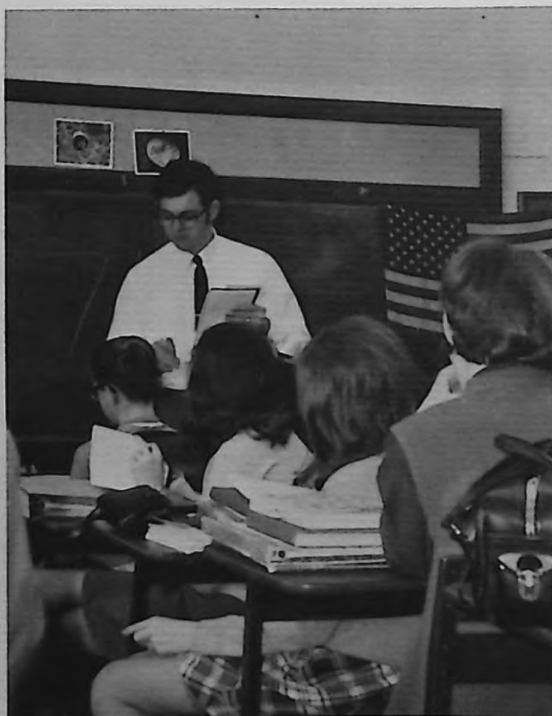

Efficiency in future jobs is stressed in commercial classes. The care and handling of business machines is an important help in preparing job-bound students for the business world ahead.



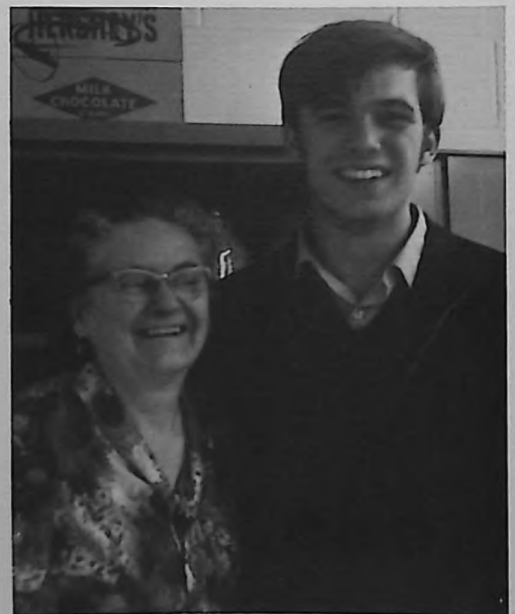

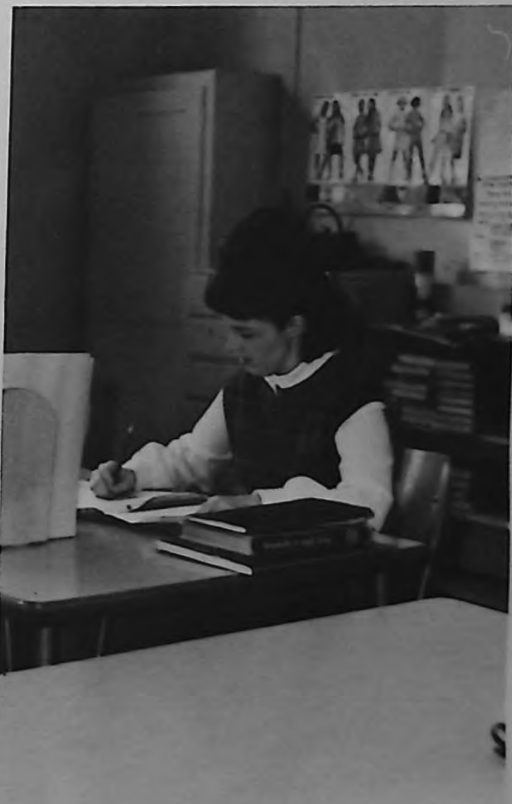

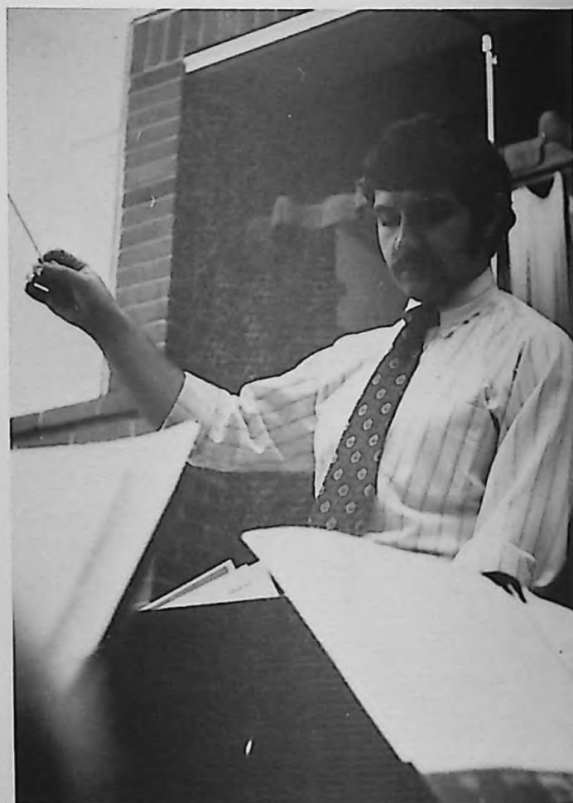

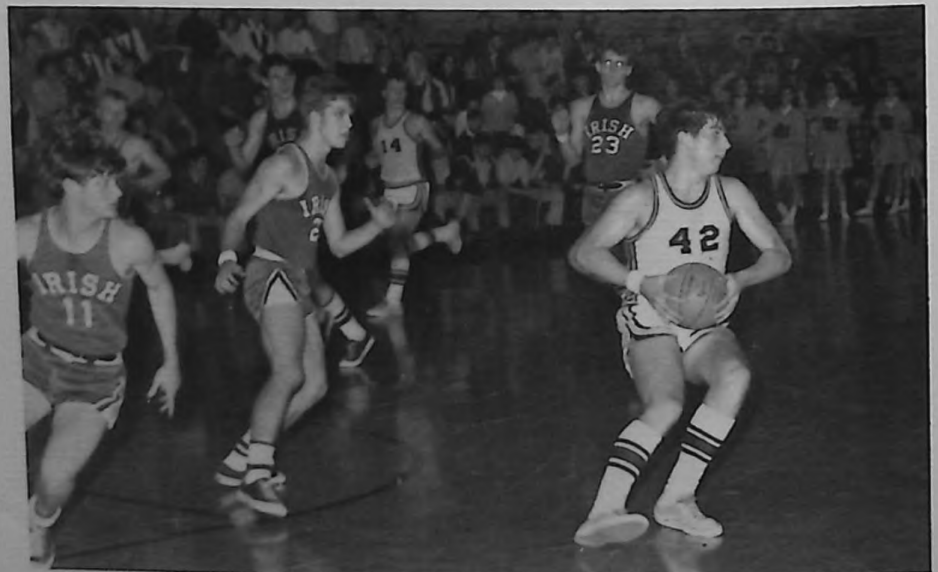

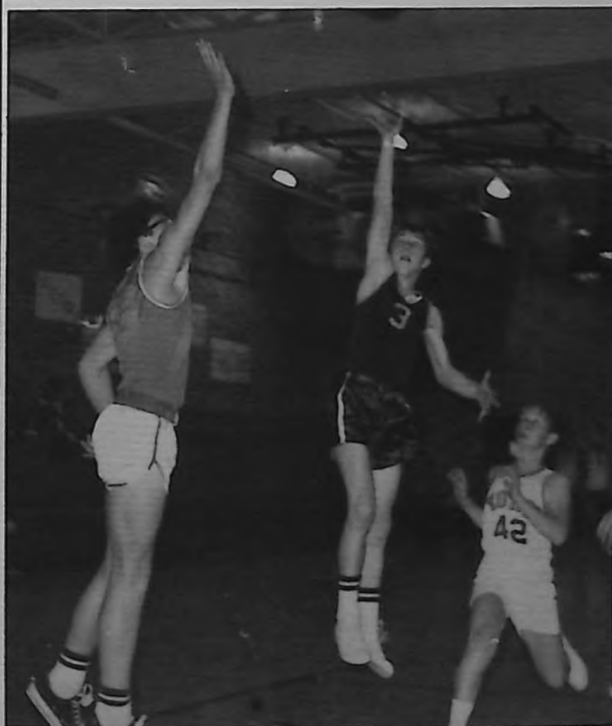
