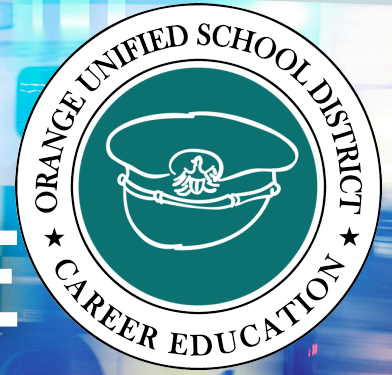

## WHAT IS IT?

Emergency Response prepares students for careers in emergency services, including roles such as firefighter, paramedic, and emergency medical technician (EMT). Students in this pathway learn essential skills such as first aid, CPR, firefighting techniques, and crisis management. Through hands-on training and real-world scenarios, they develop the knowledge and skills to respond effectively in emergency situations and provide life-saving assistance.

## WHAT WILL I DO?

Students learn essential skills for careers in emergency services, including first aid, CPR, firefighting, and crisis management. They gain hands-on experience through simulations and real-world scenarios, developing physical and mental readiness for high-pressure situations. Students also learn about safety protocols, communication, and teamwork, preparing them for roles in EMS, firefighting, law enforcement, and disaster response.

## HOW TO BECOME A PATHWAY COMPLETER:

To be considered a Career Technical Education (CTE) Pathway completer, students must complete an 02 and 03 CTE course within the same pathway. Students must obtain a D- or higher in the 02 course and a minimum of a C- or higher in the 03 course.

**Students will receive a tassel to wear at graduation for each pathway completed.**

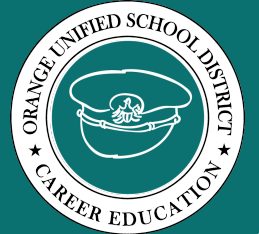
