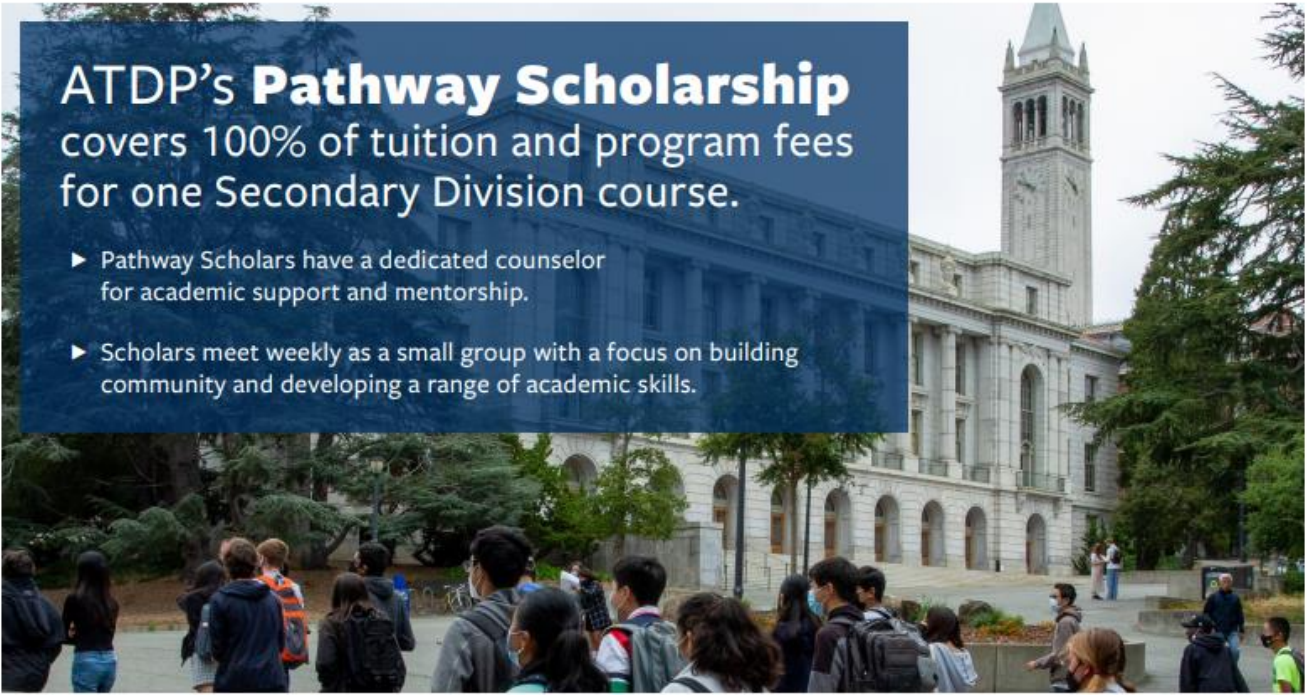

- **Step 2:** Submit a complete application at atdp.berkeley.edu. Be sure to apply for financial aid, which will need supporting documents. A staff person will reply to your email (step 1) and can help you through the process.
 - The financial aid deadline is March 23, 2026, but we will continue to accept Pathway Scholarship applicants by exception beyond that date.
 - **Act as soon as possible!** Popular courses will continue to fill throughout the spring.

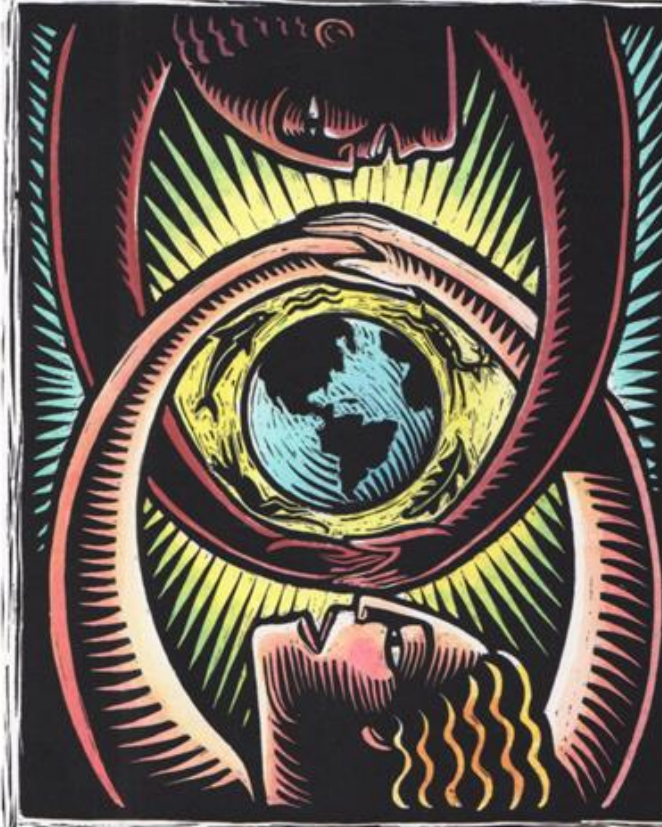

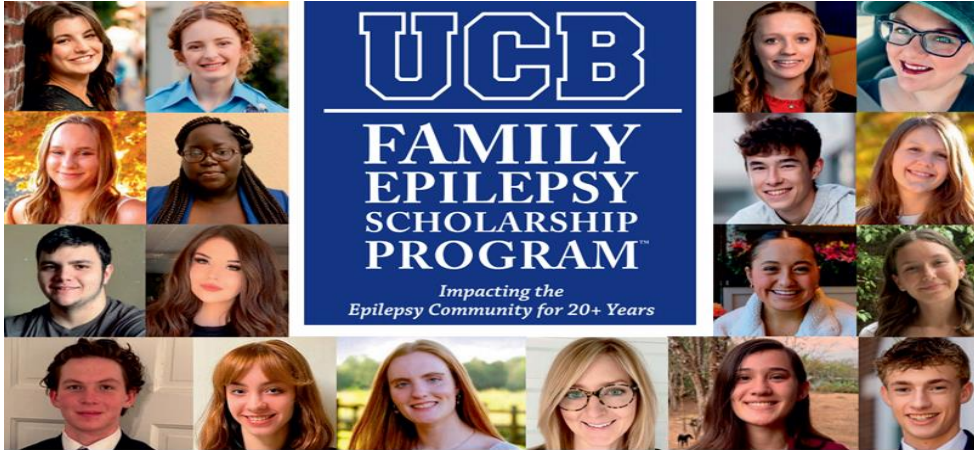
