- II. Items from the Superintendent
 - a. Responding to In and Out of School Student Incidents: Dr. Goffredo reminded parents that issues with weekend activities should not be reported to the school; we can support when appropriate and when it spills into schools, counselors can meet with students.
 - b. Safe2Say: Schools have to differentiate between real and fraudulent reports. Students need to understand that the consequences of fraudulent reporting are the same as a fraudulent 911 call. On the GVSD website, there are resources for Safe2Say and other safety resources.
 - c. Right At School: Right At School is the new provider for summer camps and before/after school, starting July 2026.
 - d. TEVA Building: Dr. Goffredo shared that the TEVA purchase has been finalized and is a long-term investment.
 - e. OCR Complaint: We are complying with the investigation and are waiting to hear back.
 - f. ICE: All buildings have protocols for ICE, including for pickup/drop-off.
 - g. Breakout Idea: Parents noted that they would like more intentionality to time limits and the agenda.

 - a. Transitions Between Grades
 - i. For the 5/6 Center, we are assessing the house structure to make sure students know some people when entering 5th grade. There has been positive feedback from 7th graders who experienced houses.

- a. Nichole Taylor, Supervisor of Food Services, attended the PKC meeting to inform parents about the Food Services Department. The department is overseen by the USDA, and the food guidelines are overseen by the federal government. The department is working on itemizing food items this summer.
